

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

LGGK WHAT'S NEW IN HARTFORD

- The Hartford Development Foundation, in collaboration with the city of Hartford, purchased the Gage House, a former hotel, to help keep downtown vibrant. The move ensures both the Senior Citizens Center and the Hartford branch of Siouxland Libraries will be preserved in their downtown locations. The library was able to expand, adding additional computers and space for more children's activities.
- While a shortage of housing is a pressing concern for many area towns, Hartford is thriving with new townhomes and apartments in the Maple Pass development, plus new homes are available in the Turtle Creek development and from builders/ developers Costello Properties, Jarding, Cressman and Sieverding.
- Ground is expected to be broken soon on the new Get 'n Go store.
- Two new commercial buildings are going in near Ace Hardware, one being a mixed-use building and the other for retail.
- Ground is expected to be broken this year on Hartford's new wastewater treatment plant, which is expected to be finished by 2025. Water availability and wastewater treatment capacity are essential components to strong economic development.
- To better serve local residents and businesses, Hartford city offices changed hours to be open earlier and close later four days a week. City hall service hours are 7:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday; and Friday 8 a.m.-noon.

NEW DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT ON THE WAY IN HARTFORD

Don and Stacy Sieverding are part of a group of builders, developers and friends who recently finalized the purchase of nine vacant lots on South Main Avenue in Hartford. Don and Stacy responded to questions by laying out the goals for the downtown initiative.

WHAT PROJECT ARE YOU PURSUING IN DOWNTOWN HARTFORD?

Homestead Hills was created by individuals who have an interest in real estate and entrepreneurship. Homestead Hills hopes to help Downtown Hartford by bringing businesses back downtown.

WHAT PROPERTIES ARE INVOLVED?

The group purchased nine vacant lots on South Main Avenue.

WHO IS INVOLVED?

Homestead Hills is a partnership between friends and neighbors.

WHAT'S YOUR CONSTRUCTION TIMELINE?

Phase 1 is scheduled to start in late 2023.

WHAT DO YOU EXPECT THE IMPACT TO BE?

The plan is to revitalize Downtown Hartford and we're starting with a mixed-use building for possibly a café, retail/office space, restaurant, bank, event space, etc. We're going to let the need/want dictate the use. Lofts on the upper levels of the downtown buildings are also planned.

WHAT WAS THE MOTIVATION BEHIND THE PROJECT?

The people in our group all West Central graduates and care about our community. We have a vision for Hartford and as the quote goes "If You Build It, They Will Come."

WHAT QUALITY OF LIFE BENEFITS WILL THIS PROJECT DELIVER TO THE COMMUNITY?

We'd like to see Hartford be more than just a bedroom community so we're building places for people to live, work and play in Downtown Hartford.

WHAT ELSE DO LOCAL RESIDENTS NEED TO KNOW?

We are in the planning stages so if you'd like to bring your business to Hartford, let's talk. We want to hear all your thoughts and ideas. People wanting more information on the development should contact Don Sieverding at 605-351-3672.



RESTORING A SIOUX QUARTZITE GEM

David and Victoria Obenauer acquired the Mundt Building on the corner of 1st and Main in downtown Hartford in 2010. Built in 1902, the Mundt Building is on the National Registry of Historic Places and housed the Savings Bank of Hartford along with other functions before coming under the ownership of the Obenauers.

Over the past 13 years, David and the family have painstakingly restored the approximate 12,000 square feet of livable space along with a courtyard north of the building. The Mundt Building has never looked so good!

David has a diverse skill set, including experience in construction. His craftsmanship skills are demonstrated in everything from the woodworking to tuck-pointing and Victoria's eye for design shows through in every detail within the property.

There can be two individual living quarters in the building with the upstairs apartment and basement being the most impressive. There are 6+ bedrooms and 5 bathrooms in the building. The main floor is zoned commercial and suitable for retail.

The Obenauers are putting the Mundt Building for sale and they are sure there is a buyer looking for a unique living experience in the town of Hartford. There is plenty of flexibility for what a potential buyer might want to do with the property to meet their personal goals.




Midco is dedicated to being a force for good in the communities it serves. The company has proudly sponsored West Central High School and the Hartford American Legion Golf Tournament.

Dold said, "Midco is investing in bringing a futureproof network to Hartford – one that meets the evolving needs of customers and strengthens economic development, education and quality of life."



TIME AND FAMILY ARE THEIR MOST VALUABLE ASSETS

As one month turns to another and one year turns to the next, Brian Alderson has realized the value of time as an asset.

"When you're young, you've got so much more energy and ambition; and the one thing you had to sell was your time. So you spent every waking minute working because you didn't have money," he said. "As you gain equity, all of a sudden, you're not selling your time cheap anymore. Time becomes your most valuable possession."

Brian farms with his wife, Erin, and their two sons, Evan and Lincoln, south of Hartford. He grows corn and soybeans, but stays zeroed in on his custom cattle feeding operation. "I know I can feed cattle as efficient or more efficient than just about anybody. So good. Let's do that. Let's focus on that."

TIME WITH EVAN AND LINCOLN

By having his crop work custom done, he's able to spend more time with Erin and their two boys. Even without the field work, time with the boys often only happened when it was cold, snowy and windy. Brian enjoys coaching baseball, so he installed batting cages in the shed to help provide bonding time with the boys.

In addition, they recently installed SportCourt for a basketball half-court. "The goal is to make the shed the place where their friends all hang out together. Some of the other dads have asked how they can help. I just tell them, 'Keep bringing your kids in."

Their oldest son Evan is 8, is in third grade and loves all sports. His grandmother, Joyce Alderson, added, "Evan is a good student, loves to read and play board games. He's competitive, whether it's sports or board games. He picks things up quick."

Lincoln likes the cattle: "When he's doing chores, he's really living his best life," said Brian. Lincoln recovered old gates tucked in the trees to create his own cattle pen. "He herds his basketballs and footballs into the pen."

'IT DOESN'T FEEL LIKE WORK MOST OF THE TIME'

After graduating in 2006 from college and a stellar fiveyear football playing career at the University of South Dakota, Brian wasn't sure what was next. He didn't plan to return to the farm. His best friend was working in the booming Wyoming oil fields, so he went that direction. When his dad, Larry Alderson, had a heart attack, Brian returned home to help for a while, but then returned to the "bachelored-up life" in Wyoming.

When his dad had a second heart attack, Brian told him: "I keep leaving, but you keep keeling over. I better stay here." Joyce said, "Larry was pretty happy when Brian decided to come back to farm." He represents the family's fourth generation on the farm which was homesteaded in 1876.

Erin grew up in Watertown and attended Minnesota State - Moorhead for business administration. After college, she worked in sales and customer service in Sioux Falls, including a seven-year stint as sales assistant at Hi Roller Conveyors. But now she works on the farm and is able to be home when the boys get off the bus. "We'd been working for quite a while towards the goal of me staying home," she said. "I've always enjoyed helping on the farm, managing the books, and helping to make everything run more efficiently."

He and Erin moved to the farm in 2012, while Larry and Joyce moved into Hartford. But Joyce missed the country.

He was a three-year starter, a two-time All-American and a two-time finalist for the Gene Upshaw Award granted to the nation's top lineman. The 2005 squad led the nation in both points scored and yards gained.

"I was a nurse and was involved with people all day long. I need my space and my home was my refuge." She was in nursing for 45 years, most of it at Sioux Valley and the VA.

After Larry passed away in July 2020, Brian and Erin discovered so many random things they didn't realize Dad had taken care of. Brian joked, "After Dad passed, the tractors started to all run out of fuel. I thought, 'What the heck is happening? They never ran out of fuel before."

Erin has helped fill in some of those gaps since she gave up city work to be home. "Both Brian and I don't relax very well, so we're always busy doing something and starting new projects. We work together really well, so it doesn't feel like work most of the time."



Robbie Veurink, Eric Veurink and Paul Groeneweg grew up together in Corsica, SD. Their small town values were a great match with Hartford when they decided to build a new wood truss and wall panel factory for their company, Blacktie Components.

In their younger days, Robbie, Eric and Paul all worked on construction crews around Corsica. Now, 20+ years later, after attaining degrees in engineering and additional real-life experience in the construction industry, the three friends started Black Tie components. They identified a need in the marketplace and are bringing their skills and experience to bear. With Robbie's background as a structural engineer, Eric's knowledge as a civil engineer, and Paul's skills as a contractor, they form a group that provides them the knowledge to achieve their goal.

Blacktie Components is a wood truss and wall panel plant under construction now in the industrial park on the north side of Hartford. Their core business will be the manufacturing of trusses, wall panels and full building packages. They're confident their facility will be the most advanced plant in the region with a streamlined production line and an advanced use of automation.

A great strength is the factory will be led by engineers and be the only plant with a structural engineer on staff. Typical truss plants use unlicensed designers who use software to design their trusses. At Blacktie, the engineerled approach will enable the company to streamline design, make changes on the go, and make sure that complex projects are properly completed. Blacktie has patented certain structural framing ideas that will provide some of the easiest-to-erect buildings available on the market.

Blacktie will also have a research and design component. This will enable full scale testing of new designs and give the company a competitive advantage in the marketplace. When the company opens for operations this summer, it will employ 20 people and will expand to 30 within a year as production increases.

This is an exciting time for the company founders and the Hartford community. "Hartford stepped up to the plate years ago to put the property together where we are located," said co-owner Robbie Veurink. "This just didn't happen overnight. The Hartford Area Development Foundation spent years of planning to make a desirable property like this available and it goes to show you that good things take time. Because we grew up in a small community, Hartford felt like a good fit to us. Amy Farr, executive director at the Hartford Area Development Foundation, has been a big help to us along the way."

Blacktie Components' short-term goal is to provide a superior product with great customer service. Future expansion plans for the building will allow the company to become the largest production facility in the area. For now, Blacktie leaders are focused on their customers. "We are excited to start production in the beginning of July and are looking forward to serving our customers," said Robbie.



There he gained valuable experience overall and he helped create their private label line in automotive.

Vanilla beans imported from Madagascar are processed and packaged in Hartford and then shipped across the country to breweries, restaurants and bakers (ranging from novice to professional).

business," Taylor said. "I saw that there was a big demand for quality vanilla, at fair prices, especially in the online space."

He started the business by importing small shipments of vanilla beans for both personal use and resale. Taylor quickly recognized there was a large demand for quality vanilla beans to be used in a multitude of products. The bean is so versatile as an ingredient it can be used in its whole form, used in conjunction with alcohol to create vanilla extract, ground up into a powder, added to sugar to create vanilla sugar, or blended to create vanilla bean paste.

Versatile uses create a diverse market. The company's primary customers are home bakers, who are located all over the country. Vanilla Bean Kings has effectively connected with that base including a Facebook group of 87,000, showing the depth of interest in the product. The online group includes novice bakers all the way to craft breweries or gourmet bakers at high end restaurants where tips and recipes are shared for all things vanilla-related.

"We have developed a brand that people love," said Taylor.
"It is a great feeling when you see your products being used halfway across the country in some small bakery or brewery. With the help of our amazing community, we have been able to raise tens of thousands of dollars to help those in the SAVA region of Madagascar, where our vanilla beans are sourced from. We have provided thousands of children with school supply kits as well as helped to rebuild schools." The "SAVA" name of the region is composed of the initial letters of its four principal towns: Sambava, Antalaha, Iharana (Vohimaro), and Andapa. Each of these towns claims itself the World Capital of Vanilla, a spice of which the region is the largest producer of in the world

Hartford has been a great location for the Vanilla Bean Kings over the years. "Growing up in a small town, I can appreciate the community working together to grow on a personal level. I see tremendous potential for Hartford," he said. "Much like Tea and Harrisburg have experienced explosive growth being so close to Sioux Falls, I believe Hartford will have the same experience in the near future. The community and its leaders are doing an excellent job of laying the foundation needed to handle that sort of growth and development."



The City of Hartford has more than 80 acres of park space for the public to enjoy. All city parks are open from 6:00 am to 11:00 pm year-round. If you have any questions, please contact City Hall by calling 605-528-6187.

Weekdays during the month of July, the City has a Summer Rec Program for children K-6th grade. With the recent hiring of a recreation director, the City hopes to expand its recreation offerings in the near future to provide opportunities for children and adults alike to do activities they love in their own community.

LYONS PARK (CITY PARK)

202 N. Vandemark Ave., Hartford, SD

Lyons Park is the City's flagship park and the location for Jamboree Days festivities as well as the Kids Summer Recreation program. Established in the early 1900s—thanks to the Lyons family— the park has continued to serve Hartford to present day. Hartford

residents commonly reserve the park's five shelters and amphitheater to host events such as family reunions, graduation parties, and other special events. Park shelters and amphitheaters can be reserved by calling City Hall. Reservations require a \$10 nonrefundable fee. Other park amenities include playground equipment, three ball diamonds, horseshoe pits, tennis courts, a basketball court, and a sand volleyball court. Horseshoes can be rented at City Hall for free (\$35 refundable cash/ check deposit). Public restrooms are available and the sidewalk circles the park for recreational walking.

HARTFORD SWIMMING POOL

Lyons Park is also home to the City Pool. The City Pool typically opens the last day of school and closes mid to late August. Season passes are available at City Hall or the pool and pass fees are \$43.00 per individual. Admission is \$4 per person. The pool also offers swimming lessons in June and July. TURTLE CREEK PARK

Turtle Creek Park is the City's newest and largest park spanning 34 acres. Turtle Creek Park offers plenty of open space for activities. The park is connected to the bike recreation trails by the apple orchard along Hartford's southern border. The park features playground equipment, a 9-hole disc golf course, and a junior ball field. Discs can be rented at City Hall for free (\$25 refundable cash/check deposit). Another park shelter is available here to be reserved, and public restrooms are conveniently available on-site.

CENTURY PARK

Century Park is Harford's smallest park at half an acre, located downtown, it provides a quaint space of tranquility. Century Park is home to the Veterans Memorial and Hartford Time Capsule. A plaque describing Hartford's history is also located at the park as well as the flag disposal box managed by the Hartford American Legion. Benches and gazebos line the park which serves as the host to the annual Christmas tree lighting during Hartford's Hometown Christmas celebration. BIKE & RECREATION TRAILS

Hartford has more than three combined miles of paved path systems for the recreation needs of residents.

The path starts in Turtle Creek Park and splits off down Highway 38 and Colton Road. Hartford continues to extend the path system and add improvements yearly. In 2019, the Bike & Recreation Committee added three trail maps at heads of the trail.
