Welcome to The Sample Slab! Inside this book, I have a unique numbering system that will allow me to add more slabs as needed, without changing the numbers. The numbering system is as follows: Grading Service-Label Type-Denomination-Date-Serial number (as found on slab)-Type of Sample (pedigree or release location). For example, a 2016 cent in a PCGS Secure™ holder pedigreed to the National Money Show would have a number of: PCGS-Secure™-1C-2016-(Serial)-National Money Show. An actual sample slab, a 2015 D cent in a PCGS Secure™ holder (serial 30355307) released @ 2015 Tampa and 2015 FUN would be: PCGS-Secure™-1C-2015D-30355307-Tampa/FUN 2015. I will also include a commentary and a price guide. The grading services included in this book are ANACS, ICG, NGC, SEGS, and PCGS. Also in this book is featured one sample from NCS. The slabs are organized by grading service, denomination, and the date of when the slab was issued. Sample slabs are a growing section of the coin market, and I hope that it will continue to grow to where most collectors and dealers at least know about sample slabs. I own a good sized sample slab collection, and hope that it will continue to grow as more slabs are released. Another good book to read if you are interested in sample slabs is by David Schwager, Sample Slabs: Including Sample, Promotional, Club, Show, Luncheon, Novelty, and Young Numismatist Coin and Currency Holders, second edition. Thanks to all of the dealers that graciously allowed me to photograph their sample slabs. There are so many different dealers that if I listed all of them, that would be a book in itself. Therefore, I would like to thank all of those dealers at once. Most of the samples in this book are mine, I just don't have the funds to acquire all of them, and a few of them are unique. PCGS

(Professional Coin Grading Service)

Professional Coin Grading Service was began in 1986 by a team of dealers that wanted to have a standard grading scale for all United States coins. They began PCGS to combat the number of counterfeit coins on the market, and to provide a service that would sonically seal coins in a hard plastic “slab” to preserve the condition of the coin. PCGS has had five different slab types that can be broken down into more than 15 sub-types due to the different label types. Currently, PCGS uses two different standard labels: the standard blue label, and the Gold Shield™ blue label. The Gold Shield™ service was formerly called Secure Plus™, then just as Secure™. PCGS also uses a variety of limited edition labels to commemorate different modern coins, such as the special label for the 2016 American Liberty Silver Medals. The year 2016 was the 30th anniversary for PCGS, and so they issued a special label to commemorate the anniversary. The 2016 PCGS Luncheon slab features this type of label.

Note: as of January 2, 2018, Secure service tiers are now called PCGS Gold Shield, and include free TrueView imaging.



PCGS-Green-1c-1919-N/A-Coin Collecting Starter Kit (Random House)

This is a sample slab, but the label does not display it. The samples labeled AUTHENTIC / (Date) LINCOLN CENT / WHEAT REVERSE. There are multiple dates in this series, and at least several collectors are trying to put together a set of all of the dates included in this slab. So far, I have noticed that the 1920 cent is the key date for this set.

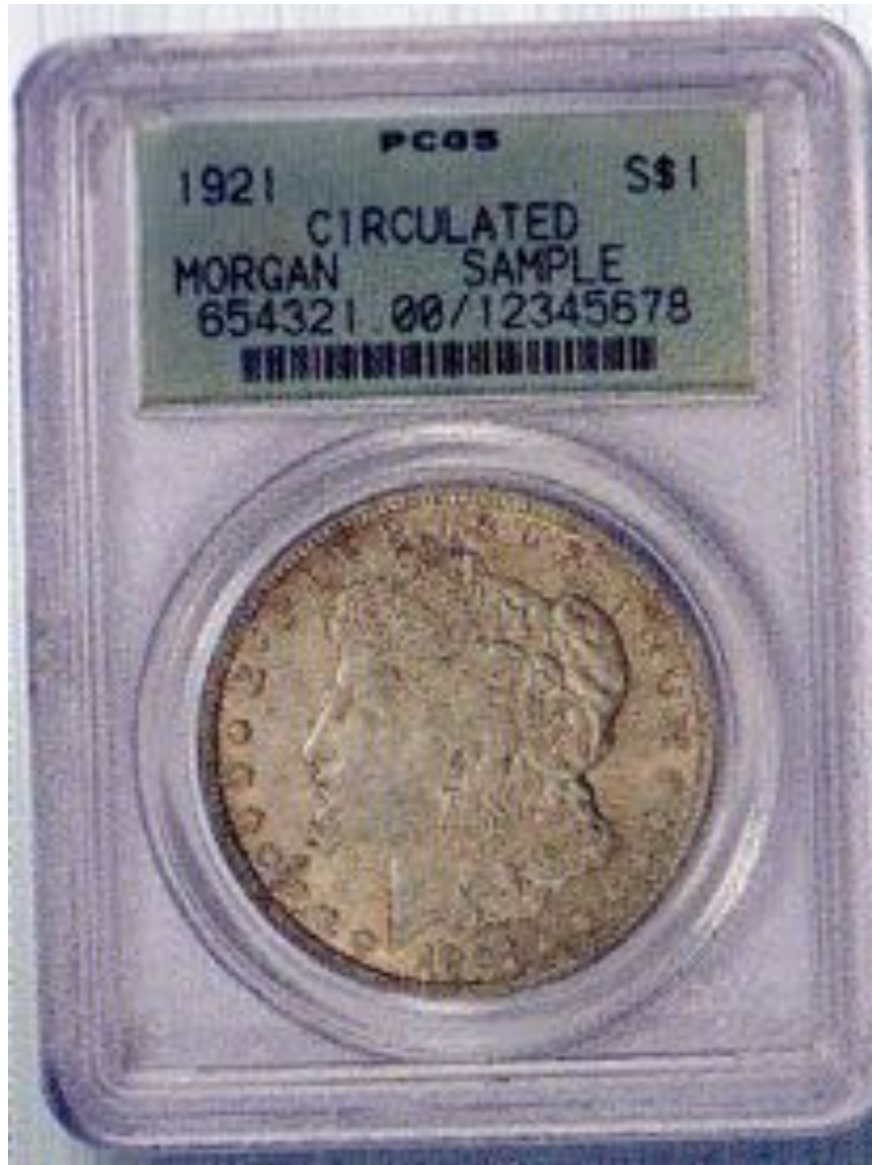


PCGS-Regency-S\$1-1879S-N/A-N/A

ANACS

(American Numismatic Association Certification Service)

The American Numismatic Association Certification Service was began in 1972 as a company run by the ANA to certify coin as authentic. In the early 1980s, ANACS was expanded to grade coins as well as certify them. The graded coins were then encapsulated in a square hard plastic case, and accompanied by a certificate and a photo. The American Numismatic Association Certification Service was sold multiple times in the 1980s, including to Amos Press (who currently publishes the Monthly and Weekly publication "Coin World." ANACS has had three different styles of coin holders (excluding the photocertificates). Their first holder style was the "soapbox" holder which was white. Dimensions of the holder were slightly smaller than the current NGC holder. This holder was used from 1988 to 2003. In 2004, ANACS switched from the "soapbox" holder to a slightly larger holder, as displayed by the 2007 Friendship Luncheon slab in the Quarter section of ANACS. This holder was used from 2004 until 2009. In 2009, the current holder with the yellow label was introduced. Collectors usually only buy/sell ANACS coin in the "soapbox" holder, as some believe that ANACS has loosened their standards. Today, ANACS is a friend to sample collectors, issuing samples at a very low price. They will do a standard holder with any coin that you submit (excluding anything larger than a silver dollar) for only \$6, plus return shipping. I recommend ANACS as a place to have your coins certified. They have very nice customer service.

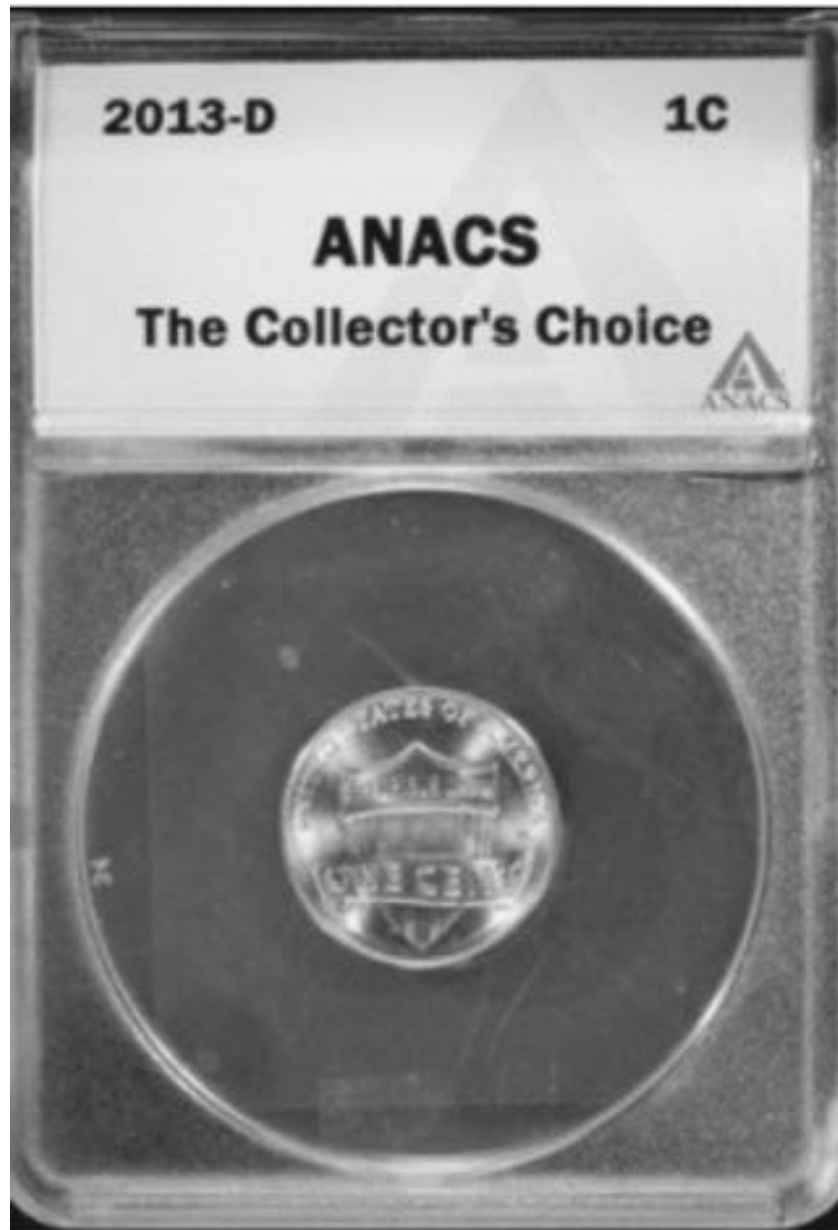
