The 2021 Stellar Calendar will feature 12 outstanding individuals who made indelible marks in their respective communities and career fields. For over a decade, SCSU National Alumni Association has highlighted and honored the lives of our beloved alumni.

**Ellaway D. Amiker, III, JD** is a native of Columbia, South Carolina and received a Bachelor of Art Degree in Professional History in 1980. In 1988, he received his Doctorate of Jurisprudence from John Marshall Law School in Atlanta, Georgia. He is a member of Atlanta Chapter of South Carolina State University National Alumni Association and a member of Kappa Kappa Psi Fraternity.



One of his greatest joys at SCSU was becoming the first freshman Head Drum Major in the history of "The Marching 101". During Homecoming 2000, Mr. Amiker presented a \$10,000 check to President Cooper and Band Director, Ronald Sergeant.

In 1981, Mr. Amiker accepted a management position with Kennedy Memorial Gardens Cemetery, where he discovered his passion for giving to others in their time of need. In six months, he was named Vice President of the company, which allowed him to interact with people. Because of his dedication, he was named President and part owner of Kennedy Memorial Gardens.

After many years of success, the Loewen Group acquired Kennedy Memorial Gardens in a multi-million-dollar sale. Mr. Amiker became the first Black President of the Georgia Cemetery Association. Under his administration, the state of Georgia formed The Board of Cemeterians. His presidency saved millions of dollars for an overly regulated industry. Mr. Amiker became the first Black President of the Southern Cemetery Cremation and Funeral Association and he represented sixteen southern states which resulted in a \$36 Billion impact on the US economy. The title of Certified Cemetery Executive (CCE) was bestowed upon him at a Las Vegas Convention.

Ellaway married his college sweetheart, Francina Whiteside and they are blessed with three children: Ellaway D. Amiker IV, Francesca C. Amiker, and Franjellica D. Amiker. He enjoys golfing, traveling, and fishing. Marcellus Pitts has a BS in Civil Engineering from SC State and a MS in Environmental and Water Quality Management Engineering from MIT. He is married to Linda Hall Pitts and they have 3 children, Vernisha (graduate of SC State, Electrical Engineering), DeMario, and Trevoir. They have four grandchildren, Jayla, Ania, Samaria, and DeMario Theadore II.



He is a veteran in community and economic

development with a proven track record in planning, design, and construction of above and underground infrastructure systems. He is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Pitts Fowler Enterprises, Inc. (PFE), a community development consulting company offering services to Private, Governmental, Academic, and Non-Profit institutions in the areas of Engineering and Technology, Financial Management, Health and Education Strategies. PFE created and uses "The Beyond Benediction Development Model" to facilitate the development process.

He has worked with the New Jersey Department of Transportation; Betchel Engineering Company; Williams, Russell, and Johnson Company; Fulton County Department of Public Works; Mayes, Sudderth, and Etheredge Company; and Sekisui SPR Americas International Infrastructure Firm, etc.

Recognizing the need to address the lack of exposure to the engineering industries for K-12 students, PFE developed an educational project-based beyond school hours STEM/STEAM program called "E Is For Engineering©". This program has been adopted by school systems in Cobb County, Georgia, and the Southeastern United States.

Marcellus has received the awards, Who's Who in Georgia, Who's Who America, Martin Luther King, Jr. Leadership, Outstanding Professional in Science and Engineering, American Registry of Outstanding Professional, and the ASCE 2019 Civil Engineering Entrepreneur of the Year, etc.

Last day to register to vote in the January 5, 2021 Runoff Elections is December 7, 2020 (Federal Offices).

Last day to register to vote in the **December 1, 2020 Runoff Elections was October 5, 2020 (State and Local Offices)**.

Advance/Early in person voting starts **December 14, 2020 for runoff (Federal Office)**.

**Earliest mail out of Absentee Ballots started November 18, 2020** for runoff (Federal Offices). Absentee Ballots can be requested now.

Runoff election day is January 5, 2021 (Federal Offices).
