HAPPY JUNETEENTH!

Juneteenth is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States. Dating back to 1865, it was on June



19th that the Union soldiers, led by Major General Gordon Granger, landed at Galveston, Texas with news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free. Note that this was two and a half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation - which had become official January 1, 1863. The Emancipation Proclamation had little impact on the Texans due to the minimal number of Union troops to enforce the new Executive Order. However, with the surrender of General Lee in April of 1865, and the arrival of General Granger's regiment, the forces were finally strong enough to influence and overcome the resistance.

Later attempts to explain this two and a half year delay in the receipt of this important news have yielded several versions that have been handed down through the years. Often told is the story of a messenger who was murdered on his way to Texas with the news of freedom. Another is that the news was deliberately withheld by the enslavers to maintain the labor force on the plantations. And still another is that federal troops actually waited for the slave owners to reap the benefits of one last cotton harvest before going to Texas to enforce the Emancipation Proclamation. All of which, or none of these versions could be true. Certainly, for some, President Lincoln's authority over the rebellious states was in question. Whatever the reasons, conditions in Texas remained status quo well beyond what was statutory.

On June 19, 1866, the first official Juneteenth celebrations took place in Texas. The original observances included prayer meetings and the singing of spirituals, and celebrants wore new clothes as a way of representing their newfound freedom. Within a few years, African Americans in other states were celebrating the day as well, making it an annual tradition. Celebrations have continued across the United States into the 21st century and typically include prayer and religious services, speeches, educational events, family gatherings and picnics, and festivals with music, food, and dancing.

In this occupation, I have been able to bury some of Atlanta's most rich and famous and some of the most common people in Atlanta. This industry has remained inflation proof regardless of what the economy was doing.





After selling Kennedy Memorial Gardens and Melwood Cemetery on the same day to the Lowen Group out of Canada in 1998, then fast forward some years later, I was asked to come and take the helm of Melwood Cemetery located in Stone Mountain GA. As the Executive Director, I was able to bring on board Alumna Denise Cunningham Major, who had shown such compassion to the families we are privileged to serve. At Melwood, Denise, has been able to enhance relationships with funeral homes and churches throughout the surrounding areas.

Often times, the deaths that we view in the news on television are the same families that would show up at our doors within days. We do all we can to create memorable outcomes for families in a most personalized way. This is quite a lucrative business; however, the true measure of satisfaction comes when the family returns to the cemetery and state how pleased they were with the service rendered to them at their time of need.

Having spent some 40 years in the business, I was named the first black president of the Georgia Cemetery Association in its history. Also, later I became the first black president for all the 16 Southern states, better referred to as the Southern Cemetery Cremation Funeral Association which is a cemetery association that's been in existence for 79 years. For all that I've been able to achieve, I am compelled to give back and leave a legacy that brings on a new generation at Melwood.
