

CHAPLIN'S CORNER

A Proclamation of Peace (#KeepYourHeadToTheSky) - Rev. Raushanah N. Butler, MBA, MDiv

The word proclamation is a noun defined as a public or official announcement, especially one dealing with a matter of significant importance. The word peace is also a noun defined as freedom from disturbance; quiet or tranquility. In other words, a "Proclamation of Peace" is an official announcement of significant importance for freedom from disturbance. Just think about that for a moment. We live in a world where chaos is all around us, deceit is breaking news, and extreme violence is a weekly occurrence. Where is the peace? Social media has been inundated with people posting fight videos, hurt relatives airing family business, and folks venting about betrayals in friendships, dissipated partnerships, and fractured relationships. Where is the peace?

What I love about Isaiah 26:3 is that we are reminded that God will keep us in perfect peace when we trust in Him and keep our minds fixed on Him. Peacemaking is not an optional commitment, but it is a requirement of our Christian faith. We are called to be peacemakers, not by some movement of the moment but by our Lord Jesus; to be the peacemakers in this crazy world we must be free, forgiving, and faithful...yes, all three.

The end goal is peace. Perfect peace. Life-giving, lifesaving, and life-sustaining peace. A peace that keeps us calm amid life's storms and reminds us that God is in control. So, my brothers and sisters, just as The Elements sang, remember to "Keep Your Head to the Sky":

Master told me one day/I'd find peace in every way/but in search for the clue/wrong things I was bound to do.

Keep my head to the sky/for the clouds to tell me why/As I grew with strength/Master kept me as I repent. Keep your head to the sky!


