### Western States Corvette Council (WSCC) News

WSCC will be celebrating its 60-year anniversary in 2025 as the umbrella club was founded in 1965. WSCC held their quarterly member meeting November 16 at Casa de Fruta in Hollister. Steve and Barbara Boyer represented the club. There were 22 people in attendance representing the clubs, as well as non- club members.

Norm Rose, WSCC president reported that WSCC has liability insurance for club meetings, but they still do not have insurance for any type of "wheels moving" events. The Vice President responsible for membership stated that there are 205 primary members and 344 total members when associate members are counted. There are four clubs that maintain WSCC membership. Three board members of the four total are from South Valley Corvettes.

WSCC has been waiting for a court date for several years based on an accident. The case date is pending further recovery, and former WSCC director Helen Landis has not yet been deposed.

2025 represents the 60th anniversary of WSCC and the board is planning an anniversary party June 19-21 at the Grand Sierra Resort in Reno.

NBCA is a founding member of WSCC and has maintained membership despite WSCCs limited functions.

NCCC is nationwide and has thousands of Members. The membership is broken down by regional associations and we are part of the West Coast Region comprising California, Hawaii, and Nevada clubs. 




