So, the first time I had dinner at her house, trying to impress me, she prepared escargot for me. Six years later she admitted that the dinner included: escargot for \$4.29 a can, sparkling Pinot Gregio wine for \$4.99 a bottle, and a sourdough baguette, the most expensive item on the menu, was for \$5.25. I was a cheap date and she hooked me; she knew how to cook!



## **Escargots Snails**

Serves 2

From: Roland Escargots Snails can

#### Ingredients:

1 7.75 oz. can of Roland escargots snails 6 tbsp. butter 1 clove garlic, finely chopped 1 tsp. shallots, finely chopped ¼ cup grated Parmesan cheese1 tsp. parsley, finely chopped Salt and Pepper to tasteSour dough baquette

#### Preparation:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees.
- 2. Drain snails and set aside.
- 3. Blend butter, garlic, shallots and parsley in a small pan on low heat. Add a dash of salt and pepper to taste.
- 4. Place a bit of the butter sauce in each slot of two white porcelain escargot-dishes. Then place a snail in each slot and cover with the rest of the butter sauce.
- 5. Place the porcelain escargot dishes on a baking sheet and place in oven. Bake until butter is bubbling and browned on the edges, about 20 minutes.
- 6. Remove from the oven and sprinkle with grated Parmesan cheese. Serve hot with sour dough baguette.

I prefer about 6 cloves garlic in my sauce and red onion can be substituted if you do not have shallots on hand. Dried parsley works if you do not have any fresh on hand.

As mentioned at a previous time here is another isolation recipe that did an excellent job of satisfying the desire for Chinese food. One of my all-time favorites is Mongolian Beef. It is a relatively simple recipe and is referred to as 30 Minute Mongolian Beef. This recipe can easily be cut in half for just two people. Enjoy!

#### 30 Minute Mongolian Beef

1 lb. Flank Steak ½ cup Water

1/3 cup+2Tbl Vegetable Oil 2/3 cup Brown Sugar (lightly packed)

1 Tbl Garlic (Minced ) ¼ cup Corn Starch

1/2 tsp Ginger (fresh & Minced) 3 Scallions (sliced 1 in. green parts only)

1/2 cup Soy Sauce (low sodium)

Sauce: Heat 2 Tbl in small sauce pan (med-low heat). Add Garlic & Ginger. Saute till golden brown aprox. 2min. Add Soy Sauce and water to combine. Stir in Brown Sugar increase heat to Med. Bring to boil for 3min. then remove from heat and set aside.

Meat: Slice flank steak against grain into ¼ in. pieces then toss with cornstarch. Place coated pieces in a sieve shake off excess cornstarch. Allow steak to sit for 10min. Line a plate with paper towels.

Cook: Place large skillet or wok over Med-High heat add 1/3cup Veg. oil. Once oil is hot (not smoking, add beef and saute to seared on both sides but barely cooked in the center about 2min. Cook in single layer in pan and repeat till all meat is cooked. Remove with slotted spoon onto towel lined plate and remove oil from pan.


Put back on Med heat add sauce (should come to boil immediately) add steak cook to a boil, stir to consistency of syrup 3-5min add scallions stir and serve. (online recipe)






