


I wish you all wellness and peace during these times. Please continue to practice safe health precautions during this time. The problem IS real.

Garlic Butter Mushrooms and Pasta recipe

8 oz. Pasta ½ tsp Salt 12oz. Mushrooms (sliced) ¼ tsp Pepper

4 Tbl Butter (divided) 1/2 cup Grated/Shredded Parmesan

3 cloves Garlic (Minced) cheese Parsley Optional

Pasta: Cook in salted water following direction. Reserve ¼ cup for later.

Mushrooms:

Saute mushrooms in 2 Tbl butter until golden brown aprox. 4-5 min. under medium-high heat

Add Garlic, Salt & Pepper stirring constantly cook for 1 min.

Turning heat to low add remaining 2 Tbl butter

Add Pasta

Add ¼ cup reserved pasta water

Add 1/2 cup Parmesan Cheese

Toss with tongs to coat

Taste pasta and season additionally to taste.

During the cold winter days, we like to have a hearty soup or stew to warm ourselves on the inside. This is one of our favorite. We happen to be members of the Seghesio Family Vineyards Wine Club in Healdsburg and this is one of their recipes that we especially like.



Chicken Cacciatore (Hunter's Chicken)

Serves 6

From: Seghesio Family Vineyard, Feb 2014

Ingredients:

6 chicken legs (or boneless, skinless chicken thighs which can be roughly chopped)

1 onion, julienne d

6 cloves of garlic, slivered

4 cups shiitake mushrooms

1 tbsp. chopped rosemary

½ tsp chili flakes (crush red pepper)

1/4 cup tomato paste

1/4 cup dry red wine

2 cups chicken stock

28 oz. of San Marzano tomatoes and their juice

1 cup of roasted, peeled poblano peppers

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup + $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of olive oil

3 tbsp. chopped parsley

Salt and pepper

Preparation:

- 3. Season chicken legs with salt and pepper to your liking.
- 4. Heat the first ½ cup of olive oil over medium-high heat in a pan large enough to hold chicken in a single layer. Cook until skin is golden brown on both sides. (If you don't have a pan big enough, you can brown in batches.) (You can also cube the chicken, if desired.)
- 5. Once browned, remove from heat and reserve.
- 6. Add onion and keep cooking over medium-high heat until soft and translucent.
- 7. Add garlic and cook for 1 minute.
- 8. Add mushrooms and cook for 1 minute.
- 9. Add rosemary, chili flakes and tomato paste, and cook for 1 minute.
- 10. Add red wine and cook until the mixture becomes a paste and starts to stick slightly to the pan.
- 11. Deglaze with chicken stock.
- 12. Add your tomatoes and juice, cover and bring to a simmer.
- 13. Return chicken to pan, cover and simmer for 45 minutes.
- 14. Uncover and stir in poblano peppers, parsley and final ½ cup olive oil.
- 15. Season to taste with salt and pepper.
- 16. Spoon chicken and sauce over Parmesan polenta or penne pasta, and serve




