Meeting Called to Order: 6:32

Officer Reports

Membership Director Barbara Boyer Barbara introduce our returning guests Bob Griswold, (Bob has subsequently applied for membership), Phil Cassou, and Peter and Christine Andersen. CORVETTE ENGINEERING

THE FOLLOWING IS A Q & A BETWEEN JEFF FARBER VP AND JOSH HOLDER, CHIEF CORVETTE PRODUCT ENGINEER......



Q: The technology for the C8 front-end lift is pretty awesome. Is that technology found in any other GM cars besides Corvette?

A: Not the way we use it. We use hydraulic oil (brake fluid) to move the lift actuator piston. Most lift lower systems in trucks and SUVs use compressed air and air bags/springs to change the ride height. We also use GPS to allow customers to program the car to lift automatically by location.

Q: Engineers playing around Question: Has any engineer modified the software for the front-lift so a C8 can bounce up and down like a lowrider?

A: I have not seen that. It would take a lot more than software. Our pump would not have nearly enough capacity to lift quick enough to get a car to bounce. Low riders usually need large compressors and large storage tanks for compressed air so that when opening an actuation valve it can flow a large volume of air quickly.

Q: Estimate how many people and how much development time went into the C8 Convertible top?

A: Hundreds of people and thousands of hours from design, to engineering, to manufacturing to software. We had to design the coupe and the convertible together because one change affected the other. They share a header, doors, quarter panels and rear fascia so any change to get the top to fold neatly over the engine spilled into the coupe roof design which also needed to fit in the trunk. It was a constant back and forth.



The convertible top is then subjected to thousands of durability cycles to confirm it will last the long life of a Corvette. Sealing systems are also complex. They of course have to seal, but that also need to last and be quiet – very often those requirements conflict with each other. A change that helps one attribute is not necessarily good for the other.

There are 6 electric motors that make it all work at speeds up to 35 miles per hour. These motors use inputs from various sensors to ensure the convertible top works in a way that prevents accidental damage to the car and does so safely.

Q: What is the fastest you've driven a car and what car was it?

A: I'm not exactly sure. I haven't done speed runs like standing miles or closed road rallies, so my high-speed work has largely been limited to a test track at MPG (Milford Proving Grounds) or the end of straight at a road course. I'd say 170ish. I'm typically not concentrating on the speedometer at those speeds – and it could have been in a C6 ZR1, a C7 or a C8. I have not reached the limit in any Corvette that I've driven.

Josh has a fun side Question: What was your costume the last time you dressed up for Halloween? A: I probably shouldn't disclose all of my Halloween costumes – some have been used with questionable judgment. Unfortunately, I haven't dressed for Halloween in years. I did win a party contest dressed as the grim reaper once, which doesn't sound that novel, but I wore drywall stilts and when you are 2 feet taller, it will make any costume more impactful.

Q: What lecturing will you be doing at the NCM Caravan anniversary celebration?

A: Hopefully no lectures – those are saved for professors and disappointed parents. I may be participating in a presentation if necessary, but we usually don't plan that far ahead. Most of us on the team could talk for hours about Corvettes so we can stand in for each other if necessary.

Jeff's Challenge Question: Will you be racing with Jeff in Ely in May of 2024? Jeff says you are chicken

Not likely and Jeff might be right – perhaps I am chicken.

Q: When you look out your office window, which image most closely resembles what you see? A: My office doesn't have any windows so....Image C, but with slightly newer parts.
