



WeatherTech Mercedes Wins GTD PRO at WeatherTech Raceway

Jules Gounon took advantage of others' missteps to claim victory in GTD PRO.

Gounon moved into first place with 37 minutes left when Ross Gunn in the No. 23 Heart of Racing Team Aston Martin Vantage GT3 and Antonio Garcia in the No. 3 Corvette Racing Corvette C8.R GTD were issued penalties of stop plus two minutes and 50 seconds (a duration equal to two race laps) for taking improper wave-bys (or "Pass Arounds") during the race's final full-course caution period.

From Corvette blogger:

ANTONIO GARCIA, NO. 3 MOBIL 1/SiriusXM CHEVROLET CORVETTE C8.R – FINISHED FOURTH IN GTD PRO:

"It's a situation where when it's green, you're fighting all the GTDs. But when it comes to the safety car, we aren't the same category. So, we need to figure that out. The safety car split the GTD field. The GTD leader was the real GT leader, so that's why everyone behind us moved to the right to get a passaround, and the 23 moved to the right, as well. But because we were the GTD PRO leaders, we should have stayed where we were. But that's the way the rules are. I just made a mistake and went to follow the 23 when they were wrong. I had a big queue of GTDs behind me, and all I could see behind me were GT cars moving to the right. So that's what confused me. If I could have seen the Mercedes or Lexus GTD PRO cars behind me staying to the left, I would have figured it out. But there were a ton of cars between us. It's a mistake that shouldn't happen. On race pace, we had a car to win. We did everything right on strategy to be in the lead. As we showed at the end, I think we had a little more on tire degradation. We'll review what happened, do a full analysis of the situation, and I know this won't happen again."

Garcia passed the 23 during the last half-hour of the race and would have won the race if he and the 23 hadn't went around the pace car. Once again, sorry, Ken.

Event Requirements









You will be asked to sign facility waivers as you enter the Thunderhill gate. You must have a valid driver's license to compete. A helmet meeting SNELL SA 2010 (or newer) certification is required for all drivers and passengers. Motorcycle helmets are **not** allowed. We have a limited supply of loaner helmets available. Most any car in good condition can autocross. We do not allow vehicles with a high center of gravity (like trucks on lift kits). No prior experience is needed. We gladly offer coaching for first-time drivers or for those wishing assistance.

We require you to work in one Run Group for each one you drive. Work can involve the cone stations on course, timing table duty, grid or starter positions. On both days, Run Groups 1 and 2 in the AM operate as a set -- if you drive in 1, you work in 2, and vice versa. Same with 3 and 4 in the afternoon. You must stay the whole morning or the whole afternoon.



Braised Lemon Chicken with Olives

Serves 4



INGREDIENTS

- 4 Chicken Thighs bone in, skin on
- 3 Garlic Cloves halved
- 3 Shallots quartered
- 1/2 Lemon sliced
- 1 cup Kalamata Olives or preferred olives
- 4 Thyme Sprigs
- 10 oz. Chicken Stock
- 1/2 cup Dry White Wine like Sauvignon Blanc or Chardonnay
- Extra Virgin Olive Oil
- Salt and Black Pepper to taste
- Parsley chopped, for garnish



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400°F (200°C).
- 2. Season the chicken thighs on both sides with salt and black pepper.
- 3. In a small pot, warm up the chicken stock over medium-low heat.
- 4. Add a drizzle of olive oil in a large, oven-safe skillet and heat over medium-high heat. Add the chicken thighs, skin-side down, and cook until golden browned, about 3 minutes. Flip the chicken and brown the other side for another 3 minutes. Transfer the chicken to a plate and set aside.
- In the same skillet, add another drizzle of olive oil. Add the shallots and garlic, and cook until softened and fragrant, about 3
 minutes.
- 6. Add the olives to the skillet and cook for 1-2 minutes.
- Add the white wine to the skillet and stir well to combine.
- Return the chicken thighs to the skillet, skin-side up, and spoon some of the sauce over them. Add the sliced lemon and thyme sprigs to the skillet.
- Pour the chicken broth over the chicken thighs and bring to a simmer.
- 10. Transfer the skillet to the preheated oven. Bake for 30-35 minutes, or until the chicken is cooked through and tender.
- 11. Remove the skillet from the oven and sprinkle with chopped parsley.
- 12. Serve the braised lemon chicken with olives hot, garnished with additional lemon slices and parsley, if desired.






