ROUTE TO CROOKED GOAT BREWING, PETALUMA



We will exit the car wash after pictures turning right and drive around the shopping center past Costco and exit the shopping center grounds. We will turn onto CA-101 North and exit at Atherton. Turning left at the signal on Atherton, we'll drive San Marin Blvd until we get to the intersection of San Marin and Novato Blvd. We will turn Right and may stop for re-staging right after San Marin High School. We'll drive to the end of the road and turn RIGHT at the stop sign on Pt Reyes/Petaluma Rd. As we navigate the turn, we will be split up because of commute traffic. Stay on the road for 8 miles until you get to 6th Street. Turn LEFT at 6th St and stay on it until it turns into Howard St. You can drive around the small parking lot next to the brewery, but typically you have to park on the nearby streets within a block or two of the brewery.

NORTH BAY CORVETTE ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT'S REPORT APRIL 21, 2023

Greetings all.

Corvette Blogger relates info on Corvette SUVs from the May edition of "Car and Driver" magazine:

"No one outside of General Motors really knows what the company's plans are for the much-rumored expansion of the Corvette lineup past its current two-seater range. But in its May 2023 issue, <u>Car and Driver</u> magazine offers its thoughts on all the talk about such a Corvette SUV.

Indeed, the magazine expects such a vehicle to actually be offered in two sizes, a la the Porsche Macan and Cayenne.

They believe the Macan competitor will feature a 300-plus turbo V4 base engine, with an optional twin-turbo V6 available that would create around 400 horsepower.

The larger Cayenne challenger will start out with that same twin-turbo V6, but a more powerful version of the Cadillac Escalade's supercharged 682-horsepower 6.2-liter V8 – along with carbon-ceramic brakes and super-wide tires – could up the ante considerably, the magazine says.

Car and Driver speculates that the first Corvette SUVs will remain gasoline-powered – not electric – and will be built on the Alpha platform of the current Chevrolet Camaro and Cadillac CT4-V and CT5-V Blackwing.

The magazine expects Chevy to unveil the Corvette SUV sometime this year, with the first units arriving at dealerships in the latter half of 2024, boasting a starting price of around \$60,000." We shall see where all this goes, but there are some members of this club that think a Corvette SUV is sacrilegious. It seems like it may be a reality anyway. Sorry, Ken.

As summer creeps closer, I'm starting to think of BBQ plans and beverages that go with it:

Frozen Whiskey Sours

Makes about 6 quarts From the cookbook: Southern Living Annual Recipes, 1993

Ingredients:

- 1 (12 oz) can frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed and undiluted
- 1 (12 oz) can frozen lemonade same as above
- 1 (12 oz) can frozen limeade same as above

8 cups water

- 4 cups bourbon whiskey
- 2 (1 liter) bottles club soda, chilled

Preparation:

- 1.Combine first 5 ingredients in a large freezer container; cover and freeze.
- 2.Remove from freezer 30 minutes before serving.
- 3.Brake into chunks; add club soda as desired and stir until slushy.

Notes:

I use inexpensive bourbon whiskey instead of the good stuff.

I like to make it up a couple days before. Then I set it out for an hour just before I plan to have guests over so it just gets slushy. I serve it with a large ladle and let the guests add as much club soda as they want, instead of me stirring it together ahead of time.






MEMBERSHIP REPORT:






Event Requirements



Registration ends in 2 months at June 2, 2023 4:00 PM PDT

You will be asked to sign facility waivers as you enter the Thunderhill gate. You must have a valid driver's license to compete. A helmet meeting SNELL SA 2010 (or newer) certification is required for all drivers and passengers. Motorcycle helmets are **not** allowed. We have a limited supply of loaner helmets available. Most any car in good condition can autocross. We do not allow vehicles with a high center of gravity (like trucks on lift kits). No prior experience is needed. We gladly offer coaching for first-time drivers or for those wishing assistance.

We require you to work in one Run Group for each one you drive. Work can involve the cone stations on course, timing table duty, grid or starter positions. On both days, Run Groups 1 and 2 in the AM operate as a set -- if you drive in 1, you work in 2, and vice versa. Same with 3 and 4 in the afternoon. You must stay the whole morning or the whole afternoon.



Panko-Crusted Salmon

Serves 4



Ingredients

- 2/3 cup panko (Japanese dried bread flakes)
- 2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tablespoons good olive oil
- Four 6- to 8-ounce salmon fillets, skin on
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- Lemon wedges, for serving

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 425 degrees.
- 2. In a small bowl, mix together the panko, parsley, lemon zest, ¹/₂ teaspoon salt, and 1/2 teaspoon pepper. Drizzle with the olive oil and stir until the crumbs are evenly coated. Set aside.
- 3. Place the salmon fillets, skin side down, on a board. Generously brush the top of the fillets with mustard and then sprinkle generously with salt and pepper. Press the panko mixture thickly on top of the mustard on each salmon fillet. The mustard will help the panko adhere.
- 4. Heat the vegetable oil over medium high heat in a 12-inch cast-iron skillet or large heavy, ovenproof pan. When the oil is very hot, add the salmon fillets, skin side down, and sear for 3 to 4 minutes, without turning, to brown the skin.
- 5. Transfer the pan to the hot oven for 5 to 7 minutes until the salmon is almost cooked and the panko is browned. Remove from the oven, cover with aluminum foil, and allow to rest for 5 to 10 minutes. Serve the salmon hot or at room temperature with lemon wedges.


