





CORVETTE ENGINEERING

THE FOLLOWING IS A Q & A BETWEEN JEFF FARBER VP AND JOSH HOLDER, CHIEF CORVETTE PRODUCT ENGINEER......



Q: Are run flats safer, especially on the track, than conventional tires?

Back story... I lost all my air pressure in my Michelin Sport Cup on the track a few years ago due to picking up a screw. When the car started to get squirrely at 120mph on a straight I started to wonder what was happening. When I went around the next turn and it was obvious something was wrong, I started looking around. My dash was counting down from 4 to 3 to 2 to 1 to 0 - I then realized I had to get off the track. I felt happy to have run flats, believing that they are the safest type tire

A: I don't think I'd say that one type of tire is safer than another for normal track use – certainly the zero pressure (ZP) tire has more sidewall structure than a non- ZP tire which would be less likely to fail catastrophically when subjected to external damage like a screw or a piece of debris. Most tire failures happen in a way that lets the driver know that something is wrong before is goes really wrong.

Q: Tell us about the purchase of your RetroMod car and what you've done with it, and what is left to do.

A: I bought a 1965 coupe at Barrett Jackson that the previous owner turned into a restomod sometime in the 90's I'm guessing. I don't know and didn't get to talk to the previous owner, but it had a tuned-port fuel injected 327, 6-speed transmission and added aftermarket air conditioning. After inspection we are certain that this car was originally a 396 and was Marlboro Red. It appears to have never been wrecked. It was a great foundation to do a more modern restomod – and because it's originality is long gone, I don't feel guilty about doing it.

I live in Michigan, but the car is in Montana where I grew up. My father has a large shop and was getting bored in retirement, so he enjoys doing the work as long as I buy the parts – that's how this partnership works. We started on the work last fall, I was there last Christmas and again last July, both times spent mostly doing structural fiberglass work – I try to do the things he doesn't enjoy which include crawling into the car.

The chassis is mostly done – we kept the original frame which was already modified to make the transmission cross member removable but otherwise straight and rust free. We changed the rear suspension to a 5-link set-up with adjustable coil-over shocks and a much stronger differential that uses a 9 inch ring gear and CV style axle shafts. The front also has adjustable coil over shocks and new control arms mounted to a cradle that stiffens the control arm mounting points and attaches a power assisted rack and pinon steering. We upgraded the disk brakes with larger 2-piece rotors and calipers and changed the master cylinder to a vacuum assisted dual circuit type for a little more safety. It has 3-piece forged wheels with the widest tire we could fit under a stock body – we are leaving the body appearance stock and without flares at least for now.

The new LS 525 engine and T56 transmission "plug and play" package from GM performance parts are in the car. We just finished setting the pinon angle and transmission height to work with a new larger diameter drive shaft. We've test fit the long tube headers and side pipes. The next step is to finish a bunch of wiring and plumbing which will be a lot of detail work that I would say makes the project about ½ way completed.

Q: Do you and your GM Engineer wife Angela do anything non-car related as a couple?

A:We don't get a lot of time that doesn't involve car related activities but we do enjoy hiking and travel. We spend time in the western US whenever we get a chance and enjoy a tropical beach in the winter. I won't claim to enjoy it, but we both spend a lot of time on home improvement projects.

Q: How would you help a prospective competition-minded Corvette buyer decide between a Z06 and an eRay?

A: If by 'competition-minded' you mean planning to take it to the track with some frequency, the Z06 is the Corvette you want. It's all about that and there's nothing like it.



The Vice President is in charge of competition events and is our club representative for our regional Umbrella organization.

The club hosted an autocross on October 7 and 8 at Thunderhill raceway in Willows. Our treasurer will announce shortly the financial results of the event, but it is estimated that we broke even or made a few dollars.

About 15% of our membership participates in our autocross events, either by competing or by volunteering. Traditionally, autocross hosted events have been the largest source of club income and has funded most of our annual charitable contributions. In recent years, primarily due to increasing costs of track rental and insurance, we have not increased our bank account as much, but we have never lost any money.

The club has very few physical assets. The two most obvious assets are our Autocross trailer and our treasurer's laptop with QuickBooks. The trailer holds our autocross equipment such as cones, timing

equipment, and tables and chairs.



Recently, our Webmaster, Sebastien, has been purchasing a few new assets, quite minimal in cost, maybe even simple office expenses, such as our new portable promotional banner. Sebastien has been a great marketer for the club, both as an expert webmaster, but also marketer of product through brochures and other printed media.

There has been discussion about upgrading our timing equipment to make our autocross management easier. But the autocross team has not decided this is a necessary expense at this point.

Braised Short Ribs with Creamy Polenta

These flavorful short ribs perfectly illustrate how braised meat cooked on the bone can turn out succulent and tender enough to cut with a fork. 6 lbs. meaty, bone-in, individual-cut short ribs

4 tsp. kosher salt

1 tsp. freshly ground pepper

1 yellow onion, chopped

2 carrots, diced

6 cloves garlic, chopped

1/3 cup all-purpose flour

2 cups hearty red wine

3 cups beef stock or broth

2 Tbs. tomato paste

1 Tbs. minced fresh rosemary

1 bay leaf

1 cup whole milk

1 1/3 cups quick-cooking polenta

1/2 cup freshly grated Parmigiano-Reggiano

Directions:

Braised Short Ribs with Creamy Polenta Preheat an oven to 325°F. In a Dutch oven, heat 2 Tbs. of the oil over medium-high heat. Season the short ribs with 2 tsp. salt and the pepper. In batches to avoid crowding, add the short ribs to the pot and cook, turning occasionally, until browned on all sides, 5 to 6 minutes per batch. Transfer to a plate.

Add the remaining 1 Tbs. oil to the pot and heat. Add the onion and carrots and cook, stirring occasionally, until the onion softens, about 5 minutes. Stir in the garlic and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute. Sprinkle in the flour and stir well. Slowly stir in the wine, then the stock. Stir in the tomato paste, rosemary and bay leaf. Return the short ribs to the pot. The short ribs should be barely covered with liquid. If not, add hot water as needed. Bring the liquid to a boil. Cover the pot, place in the oven, and cook, moving the position of the ribs every 45 minutes or so to be sure that they are covered with liquid and are cooking evenly, until very tender, about 2 1/2 hours. Transfer the ribs to a deep serving platter (don't worry if the meat separates from the bones), and tent with aluminum foil to keep warm.

Let the cooking liquid stand for 5 minutes. Skim off the fat from the surface and discard. Bring to a boil over high heat. Cook, stirring, until reduced by about one-fourth, about 10 minutes. Discard the bay leaf. Return the short ribs to the pot.

Just before serving, make the polenta: In a heavy saucepan, bring 3 cups water, the milk, and the remaining 2 tsp. salt to a boil over high heat. Slowly whisk in the polenta and reduce the heat to medium-low. Cook, whisking often, until the polenta is thick, about 2 minutes. Stir in the 1/2 cup Parmigiano-Reggiano. Divide the polenta among warmed deep serving bowls, top with the ribs and sauce and serve at once. Serves 6.

THE CORVETTE RACING'S "JAKE" SKULL LOGO STORY

If you follow Corvette Racing, or even the street performance Vettes, then you are familiar with the teams "Jake" skull logo. The logo has adorned the team's race cars since Le Mans in 2005. Since that time, it has migrated to just about anything related to the racing team and performance street versions of the Vette.

So how did "Jake" come into existence? It started in 2004, with one of Corvette Racing's truck drivers, Don Male, asking the team boss, Doug Fehan, about putting a skull sticker on one of the cars. Fehan liked the idea and gave Male the go ahead, and as luck would have it, the car won the race!

As with all superstitions, the team was sure the skull brought them good luck and needed to stay. But there was one big problem, the skull logo was copyrighted. As is the way with Corvette Racing, that was not going to stop them, and they decided to just make their own skull logo!



Now the team had a new logo, but what to name it? That's where legendary Corvette marketing manager Gary Claudio steps in. Claudio allegedly named the skull logo after Jake Blues from the 1980 film The Blues Brothers, fitting seeing as the ruthless Jake character would probably identify with Corvette Racing's 'Take No Prisoners' motto.

Not only was "Jake" helping the Corvette Racing Team win, but it also increased the sales of Corvette Racing memorabilia by over 170%!






