



Meeting Called to Order: 6:30

Officer Reports

Membership Director Barbara Boyer Barbara mentioned that Mark and Claudia have applied for membership. She is has not yet heard anything further from our guests last month: Ted and Jeanette Meyer.

Secretary Dan Divita Dan reported that the minutes of the previous meeting had been completed and were published in the latest Newsletter. At President Boyer's request, a motion for approval of the minutes was made by Jane and seconded by Annette. Motion approved.

Treasurer Mike McLucas advised the club of our financial status, including our current account balance, as well as deposits and disbursements that occurred during the preceding month. He has established a Club account on Shutterfly so that we may accumulate and manipulate our photos in an attempt to recreate our history. Maryanne mentioned that we need to accumulate old hard copy pictures of club events on Shutterfly. Eric Larson has already started an effort to obtain pictures from members and should be contacted. Sebastien will assist with uploading those photos once we have received them.

Sebastien has also posted on the website, an on-line website with club logo images so members may order their own logo items. He showed images of sample items.

Website Master Sebastien Jame The only thing new is that there is a new blog on the site where we can list our Drive-And-Dine events.

Public Relations Director William Donnelly Bill has again requested that members provide him with their Corvette license plate number because he is planning on creating an awesome game using them. Please send them to him prior to the end of the month.

Bill wants to lead the September 6 Drive-and-Dine. He has an awesome place to eat, and will have a coastal drive before we stop to eat.

Bill also mentioned that one of our advertisers has not yet paid their fees. A discussion ensued on whether dues should be payable for an annual year, or for twelve months from sign-up. The treasurer would like to migrate to a calendar year basis, rather than having multiple start dates for every sponsor or advertiser. More discussion needs to be undertaken on this topic at a board meeting.

Bill has been in contact with Durkin Graphics, our trailer sign manufacturer regarding our new and replacement signs for the trailer. They are available for pick up, and he will do so next week. Bill was correct on the spelling of their name.

Bill needs more Club brochures and cards to distribute. Following discussion, the group agreed to an expense of up to \$400 to acquire 500 brochures and 100 cards. Paul moved to approve the expense, and Ken seconded. Motion Approved. Bill will not be at the next Board Meeting.

Sunshine Report We have not been advised of anyone that is suffering an illness or otherwise needs encouragement.

Social Director Jeff Farber Jeff displayed our Social Calendar on-screen, and described several of the upcoming events.

Vice President Jeff Farber, Jeff and Steve Boyer have both been in contact with representatives of the National Council of Corvette Clubs, a national umbrella organization similar to the Western States Corvette Council, of which we are currently a member. Fifteen of the current WSCC clubs have elected to join NCCA In view of the difficulties that WSCC.is facing. The Board is considering recommending that we join NCCC next year to regain some of the insurance lost to WSCC, and have a greater affiliation with other clubs. The Board will make a formal proposal to the membership for approval before any action is taken. Dues for new members of NCCC are \$35 the first year, and \$25 per year after that. To ensure that spouses and close friends are insured, they must be registered as a member as well, at a cost of \$10 per year. Therefore, the cost of membership for a couple after the first year will be \$35, the same as our current dues for WSCC.

Jeff mentioned our upcoming Autocross on October 7 and 8 at Thunderhill raceway. He has seen the new extended paved area of the lot we currently use, and, while it will not be available to us for use as an expanded course area, the entire area has been improved.

President Steve again mentioned the insurance issue facing us and our intent to push through the issue and determine the best course of action for the Club.

Wednesday, August 2, was our scheduled monthly Drive N Dine. The Boyers hosted the Drive and the attendees met at San Marin High School next to the Farber Horses. Buddy and Lily watched from afar while 15 Corvettes and one Tin Lizzy congregated for the pre-drive social time. Lynn and Eric brought Lynn's fabulous black C3 out of storage for the event while two guest Corvettes also participated.



The route headed west and unbelievably, all cars started in a single line. But upon reaching the left turn at Petaluma/Red Hill road, the group split up. A large horse trailer held up the last seven cars driving slower than the speed limit until the group collected in Nicasio. The turn onto Lucas Valley Road led to some uneasiness as a road sign warned of Loose Gravel. However, that gravel was no longer there and instead we experienced a fabulous newly paved road. But a van limited the speed of the caravan for most of that road. The final section of the drive through residential Terra Linda was uneventful. Dinner was held at The Monk's Kettle..



August 26 was the date for our August Social. This drive was led by Mike and Maryanne McLucas and featured a southern Marin coastal drive followed by a visit to the Disney Family Museum in the Presidio. The group of 12 people in 8 Corvettes met at the parking lot next to Piatti Restaurant in Mill Valley and drove through downtown Sausalito, then proceeded to Fort Baker for a

photo stop with the bridge as a backdrop. Heading south, we crossed the Golden Gate Bridge and drove following the ocean coastline. We drove through the Sea Cliff community, past the Legion of Honor and through Lincoln Golf Course, then stopped at the Lands End Rest Stop for a restroom break. We continued past the now closed Cliff House restaurant near Seal Rock, and along the Upper Great Highway drive. We took a U-turn and went back until we re-entered the Presidio and continued to the large Parking lot for the Disney Museum and the Officer's Club.

The museum is housed in an old army building, but nicely remodeled for its current use. The museum displays the history of the Disney Family starting with Walt's early life on a farm in the Midwest to suburban life during high school years. His high school newspaper drawings are shown where he explored a variety of characters. He was fascinated with cartoons and evolved his work from simply cartoon advertisements to comic strips.



The museum shows the evolution of his comics, his study of movement and motion, interest in music, and the development of his characters and techniques from short movies to full length cartoon features. It explains his family life, fascination with trains, and successful developments of his studios and theme parks.

A second temporary exhibit named Disney Cats & Dogs was housed in a separate building.



Our next Drive N Dine is scheduled for Wednesday, September 6. We'll meet at Northgate at 5:30pm (specific location to be announced) and take pictures. After the photo shoot, we will head South on 101 through Sausalito, through the Fort Cronkhite tunnel and around the Marin Headlands. 

CORVETTE ENGINEERING

THE FOLLOWING IS A Q & A BETWEEN JEFF FARBER VP OF NBCA AND JOSH HOLDER, CHIEF CORVETTE PRODUCT ENGINEER......



This part of the discussion revolved around patents.

Jeff: My family has a lot of product patents, including some in my wife's Nora's name. Can you get patents as engineers at GM, and do you have any to brag about?

Josh: You can earn patents at GM. I have 4 on the C8 Corvette. 3 of them are related to chassis structure, 1 related to engine intake air induction. There are some at GM that have many (dozens) of patents.

This part of the discussion was nostalgic to our youth.

Jeff: I remember my Grandpa's Rambler had a tissue holder that hinged under the dash and my grandma's Nova heated the cabin in 30 seconds when it was really cold out. What car features from your childhood provide great memories for you.

Josh: My mom drove a 77 Monte Carlo with swivel bucket seats. It was an attention getting car anyway...Black with white interior and a moon roof, but the swivel buckets were the coolest feature. My dad had a full-size Chevrolet pick-up with dual fuel tanks with a switch on the dash that allowed you to go from one to the other.

This part of the discussion pointed to the lunacy of teenage driving decisions.

Jeff: Do you have any teenage or young adult dumb driving decisions to share? I have a few driving experiences from my youth I'm not very proud of.

- •I rolled a 1972 Mercury Capri on the freeway after midnight when falling asleep at the wheel. The smart thing I did was have a taller friend (passenger) who held the roof up with his head. Neither of us were hurt.
- •I drove across the Richmond/San Rafael bridge with five people in my 1977 Chevrolet Blazer reaching at least 120 miles per hour (the maximum shown on the speedometer). The truck bounced up and down the whole time at that speed.
- •At 17, I got kicked off Sears Point Raceway when, after a motorcycle race I attended as a First Aid worker, I got up on two wheels in the same Blazer on the hairpin turn following fellow turn workers in their Tricked-out Datsun 510s. I miraculously didn't roll and didn't hit the wall. I still challenge myself driving but am much safer...I tried to use Launch Control on an Autocross course in my C7-Z06, but the first turn came up too quickly for me to stay inside the cones.

Josh: My first car was a 1969 Camaro with a 350 and a manual transmission. I bought the car when I was 14 for \$2000. It needed a lot of work, but as far as I was concerned it was the fastest thing on the road. I got my driver's license on my 15th birthday which was in the middle of a Montana winter. That car on slippery roads taught me some valuable limit handling skills early, but like any teenager with a "fast" car I did some dumb things and got lots of speeding tickets. I was known by the local highway patrol. Luckily, I was never in an accident with it. There was a lot of drag racing with a muscle car like an old Camaro. I recall one such time where near the end of the ¼ mile I could see some strange objects in the roadthat turned out to be legs...connected to the large bodies of elk! There was some emergency braking and evasive lane changes (that should never be done to avoid an animal) but I didn't want to damage the car I was trying to fix up.

Burn-outs were also juvenile fun in a car like that. The only thing that prevented me from doing more of them was that I had to buy my own tires. I recall going about as fast as the car would go in reverse, then shifting into 3rd gear, revving the engine to about 6000 rpm, then side stepping the clutch. The speedometer would indicate something like 90 mph when the car was still moving backwards. Needless to say, there was a lot of smoke involved with a tire spinning that fast on dry pavement. I can't believe I didn't break anything.
