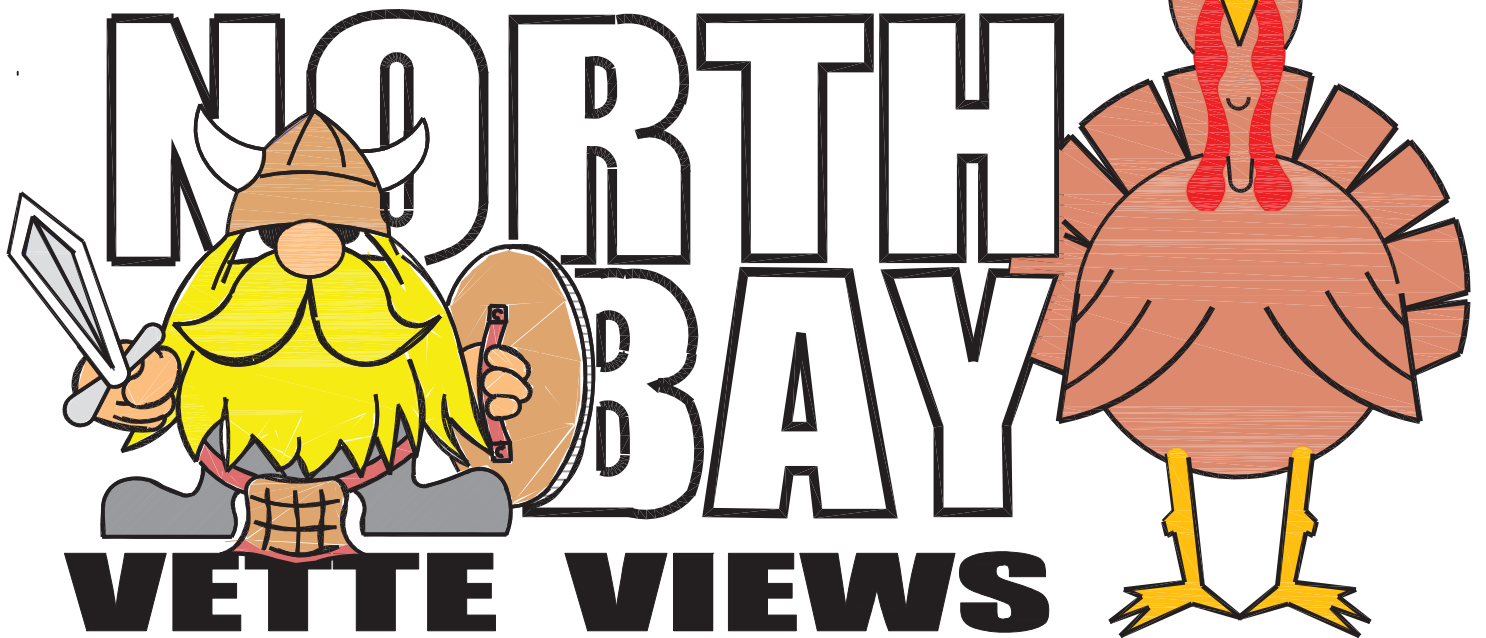

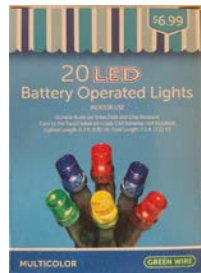

With fall starting, Barbara and I really like a warm, hearty dinner. So, we have Pork Marsala with Polenta to warm us through and through. Talk about comfort food. Yum!



Pork Marsala with Polenta

Serves 4

From: Food Network Magazine 2/27/2019

Ingredients:

1 14 oz. tube polenta, cut into 12 rounds
¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil
Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
1 pork tenderloin (about 1 ¼ pounds),
trimmed and cut on an angle into ½ inch
slices
1-pound cremini mushrooms (brown
caps), sliced

4 cloves garlic sliced and 2 cloves minced
1 shallot, sliced
2 tbsp all-purpose flour
1 cup low-sodium chicken broth
2/3 cup Marsala wine
3 tbsp finely chopped fresh parsley

Preparation:

1. Preheat the broiler. Lay the polenta slices on a baking sheet and brush the tops with 1 tbsp olive oil; season generously with salt and pepper. Broil until browned around the edges and crisp, 12 to 14 minutes.
2. Meanwhile, season the pork with salt and pepper. Heat a large non-stick skillet over medium-high heat and add 1 tbsp olive oil. Add the pork and cook until browned, about 2 minutes per side; remove to a plate. Add the remaining 2 tbsp olive oil, the mushrooms, sliced garlic, shallot and ½ tsp salt. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the mushrooms brown in spots, 6 to 8 minutes. Sprinkle with the flour and cook stirring, about 30 seconds. Add the chicken broth and wine; bring to a simmer and cook until the sauce thickens, about 5 minutes.
3. Return the pork and any juices to the skillet. Cook over low heat until the pork is cooked through, 1 to 2 minutes. Season with salt and pepper.
4. Combine the parsley and minced garlic in a small bowl. Divide the polenta among plates. Top with the pork, mushroom sauce and parsley mixture.

Notes:

For chicken Marsala, substitute the pork with boneless, skinless chicken thighs. You can also make up a batch of cheesy polenta as a base and serve it in bowls.

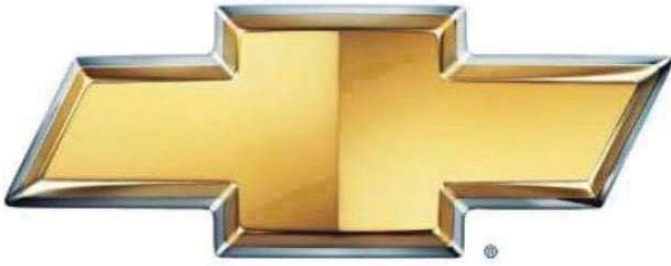

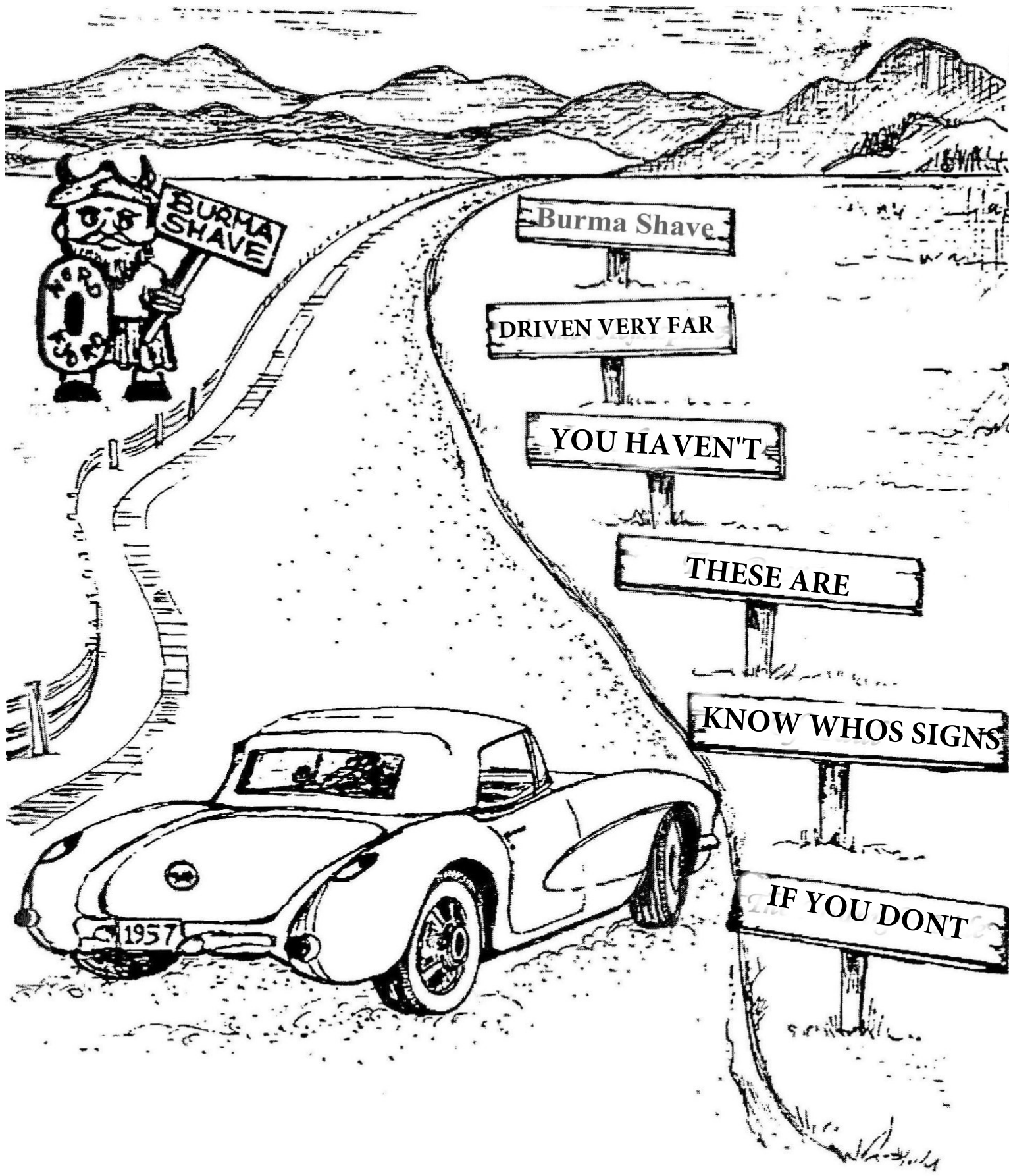
