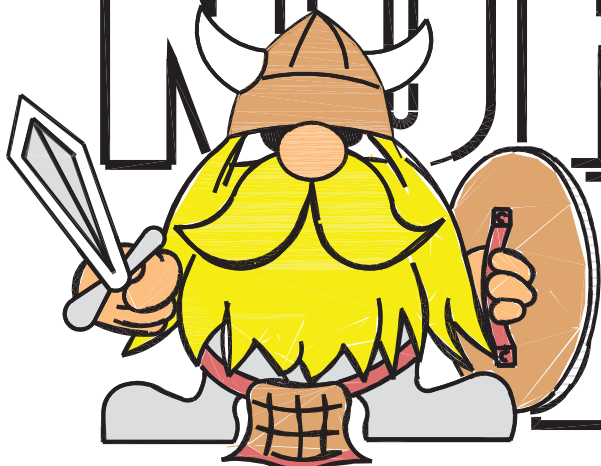

Jane Rittler moved to adjourn the meeting. Don D. seconded the motion which passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 7:35 pm.

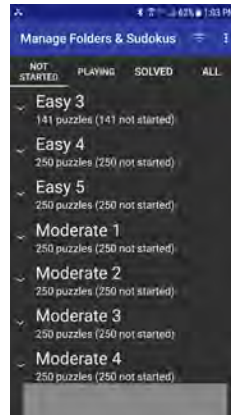

AUSTIN'S EGG DROP SOUP RECIPE, CANTONESE STYLE JUST IN TIME FOR THOSE WINTER EVENINGS

INGREDIENTS

- ◆ Quart of water
- ◆ 1 can of water chestnuts diced
- ◆ 1 clove of garlic chopped very finely
- ◆ ½ chicken breast with pieces shaved off with cleaver when frozen or cut into many different shapes of small pieces from non frozen
- ◆ 3 small or one large link of mild Italian sausage
- ◆ 2 or 3 scallions cut into ¼ inch pieces (white parts only)
- ◆ 3 eggs in a glass, stirred well so that whites and yolks are well mixed
- ◆ Cornstarch



PROCEDURE:

- 1) In frying pan flatten the Italian sausage and fry until brown on both sides. Break it up into small pieces with a wood utensil. Just before they are nice and brown throw in the scallions and minced garlic.
- 2) Put quart of water into a 2 quart pot with one cup of water saved. Heat on high.
- 3) Put chicken bits and chopped up water chestnuts into boiling water and boil for 5 minutes. Use small cuisinart to very briefly mince the sausage and onions together to make smaller pieces (put these into the soup mixture before the chicken is done).
- 4) Mix a few tablespoons of cornstarch into the cold saved water .

Turn off stove and immediately pour the eggs into the soup stirring slowly for only a few stirs until the egg is shredded and mixed into all parts of the soup (takes 10 or 15 seconds.)

Now, add the mixed cornstarch water mixture into the soup stirring slowly until the soup thickens to your taste.

Serve immediately in bowls and top with a few chive pieces and soy sauce drops swirled in to taste—I do approx. 1/8th of a teaspoon per bowl. If you don't have chives cut the green tips off the scallions for the topping.

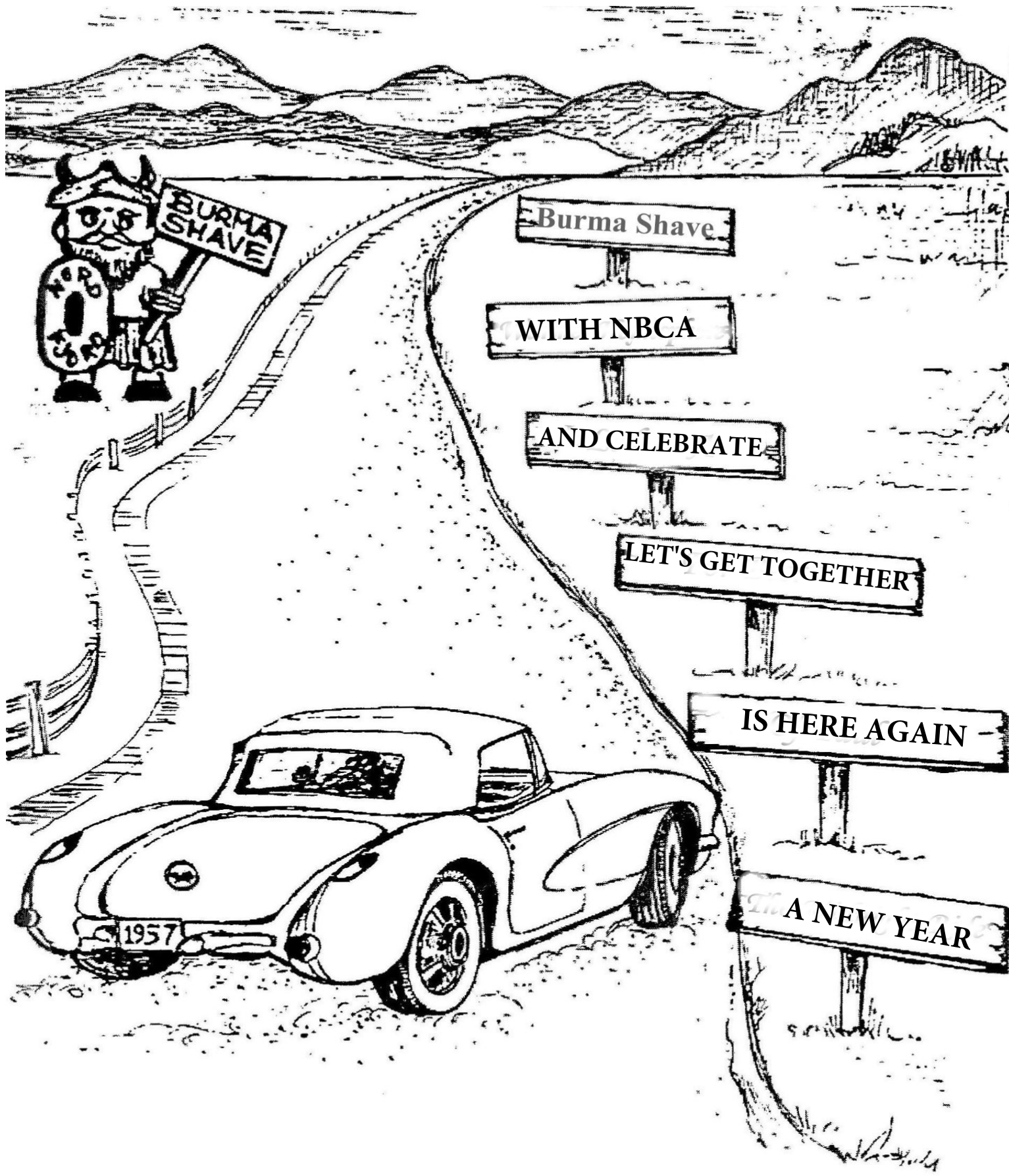
