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Korean War Army Veteran Wayne, 89, Receives Aid & Attendance to Help Pay for Assisted Living

With the help of his daughter as primary caregiver, Wayne keeps his care in the family and receives a benefit he earned through his service.

NICEVILLE, FL — At 89 years old, Wayne, a proud United States Army veteran who served during the Korean War (1950–1953), is now receiving \$2,874 per month through the Aid & Attendance benefit to help pay for his assisted living community.

Wayne initially tried to apply for the benefit in the past, but was denied because he had “too much income.” At the time, he did not have the proper medical deductions in place. With guidance and support, he learned that by paying his daughter, who is his primary caregiver, all of his income, he qualified for the benefit. This allowed him to keep the money in the family while generating the Aid & Attendance benefit — a benefit he earned through his service.

“We started this process with my daughter being my primary caregiver, and I didn’t know that by paying my daughter, that’s all I needed to do in order to qualify,” Wayne said. “I had tried this benefit in the past, but was declined for having too much income because I didn’t have the proper medical deduction. But by paying my daughter all of my income, I kept that money in the family and was able to generate the Aid and Attendance benefit — a benefit that I earned.”

Today, Wayne lives in a safe, supportive assisted living community, with the peace of mind that his service continues to make a difference in his life.

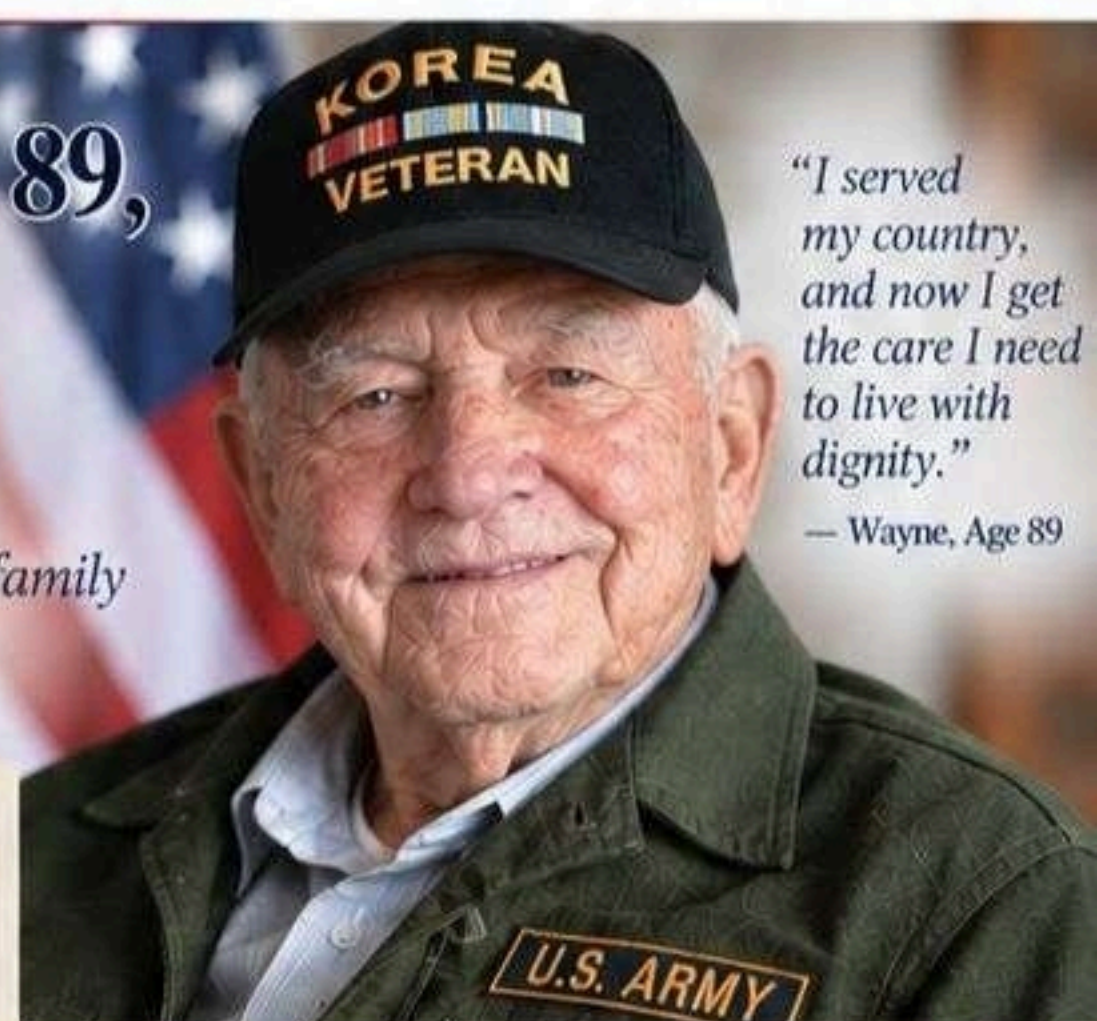
