

Day 61

- Good Morning! I truly hope the word I shared yesterday blessed you, inspired you, and brought you up to a new level to strengthen your walk toward fulfilling your destiny, or gave you the courage to turn your eyes toward Jesus and listen only to Him. And I certainly hope you kicked out the nachash!
- As I got up this morning, I didn't have anything to share with all of you, and I thought maybe I was going to have to tell you, "see you next week," but then I sat down and spent time in the Bible, and Holy Spirit led me to Luke 12, and as I read the words of Jesus, my heart was stirred. There are so many beautiful words of wisdom and strength in Luke 12. Then I was compelled to write some of the scriptures down, and as I did, it led me to a familiar place. And being in that place, I saw more revelation, and I want to share that journey with you, in hopes that you will hear it, see it, catch it, consecrate to it, and your faith will grow up to it. "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Romans 10:17.
- "Seek the kingdom of God, and all these things shall be added to you." Luke 12:31. "All these things" are the needs for our life here on earth, food, clothes, shelter, finances, jobs, etc. The things we need to survive here on earth.
- "It is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." Luke 12:32. It is His GOOD PLEASURE — wow! That means, to bless us and teach us the mysteries of the kingdom, brings God pleasure.
- "To you it has been given to know the mysteries (secret or hidden truths) of the kingdom of God." Mark 4:11.
- Remember when I told you that the Bible is the greatest treasure hunt ever? Well, it is!!
- You may ask, why doesn't God just spell it out simply? That is a good question, a multi-faceted question.
 - First, let me ask you some questions. When in a battle or a war, does each side give the other side their plans of war? What about in football? Does each teams' coaches give each other their game plan, the play book? Well, why not? That's right. The point is to keep the opponent as much in the dark as possible, so you can win.
 - We are in a battle, a war, with the devil, the enemy of our souls, satan. This is not a boxing match or a football game. He is out for our blood; he is out to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. God has woven mysteries into the Bible for us to know and decipher through revelation knowledge, for us to have strategy and wisdom in defeating our adversary the devil.
 - Second, if you have children, do you prefer that they only come to you when they need food, money, clothes, phones, cars, car insurance, etc? Or do you enjoy it when they come to you and just want to talk, want to ask your wisdom on a situation they are facing, want to just spend the day with you, talking, laughing, possibly playing games? When they want a REAL relationship with you — isn't that the greatest desire of every good parents' heart? I know it is my desire. Father God is the perfect parent, and if we desire that kind of relationship with our children, how much more so does He want that kind of relationship with us.
 - If He puts mysteries in the Bible that we have to seek after, it is bringing us into deeper relationship with Him, and it is like playing a game with Him as well.
- Father God wants us to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God. So, if we seek first the Kingdom, then all our needs will be given to us...What are the mysteries of the kingdom of God?

- “And He said, “The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter (sow) seed on the ground, and should sleep by night and rise by day, and the seed should sprout and grow, he himself does not know how.” Mark 4:26-27.
 - Let’s pause here for a few moments. So, we know the “man” mentioned here is us because “he himself does not know how” it all works. God knows exactly how it all works.
 - Immediately, we learn that we are always scattering seed on the ground — we sleep at night and rise in the day and are surprised to see plants growing because we don’t know how it works. It is a mystery to us.
 - We have learned that all words, actions, and intents of the heart are seeds on that ground, and whether we know it or want them to, they are going to produce a harvest.
- “For the earth yields crops by itself: first the blade, then the head, after that the full grain in the head. But when the grain ripens, immediately he puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come.” Mark 4:28-29.
 - The earth yields crops by itself — we know this is not just in the natural. How do we know? Because Jesus is teaching with a parable that is revealing the kingdom of God. So, everything that happens in the earth has to be three fold. Why? Because God is triune, Father, Son, Holy Spirit, and we are triune, spirit, soul, and body. Everything in the earth, in our world experience, has to be triune, effecting the spirit, soul, and body. If we want the things that are needed to take care of our body, then we seek first the kingdom of God, and all those things shall be added unto us.
 - The kingdom of God is seed, plant, harvest. If I want to reap a good harvest, I have to plant good seed. In planting a good seed, I also shut doors, windows, and portals to the devourer, the enemy. He cannot harm me. How do I know? “The reapers are the angels.” Matthew 13:39.
 - Satan is a reaper. Even if he is fallen, he is still an angel. We know this by reading Job. Satan came before the LORD of the harvest, God in His system of government, to gather the harvest that was ripe in Job’s life.
 - Jacob had a vision of the ladder going up to heaven, and the angels of God were going up and down it before the LORD. Jacob had a vision that revealed to him how the kingdom of God worked. He saw seed, plant, harvest. And in that moment, he had to have remembered how deceitful he had been to his brother Esau, and that is when the fear of the LORD came upon him. “And he was afraid and said, “How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven!” Genesis 28:17.
 - Now, if you read verses 13-15, you will see that the LORD spoke only good and blessing over Jacob, but when he awakened, he was afraid — why? Because he saw the kingdom of God, how it worked, and he was greatly alarmed at what kind of harvest he was about to have because of all the bad and deceitful seed he had sown in his life. (Also, side note: Jacob reaped a harvest from his deceit later, through the hands of his father-in-law. He cheated Jacob many times over, but because of this moment of revelation, with Jacob’s ladder, Jacob isn’t shaken by the deceit of his father-in-law because he now knows how the kingdom of God works, and before the harvest of his previous deeds is reaped through his father-in-law, Jacob had consecrated himself to God, and promised to the LORD God his tithe. And we know from Malachi 3:10-12, that when we give our tithe to God, He will, “rebuke the devourer for [our] sakes.” (Malachi 3:11).)
 - You may be asking, “Heidi, how do you know Jacob had a revelation of the kingdom of God?” Great question.
 - “Then Jacob made a vow, saying, “If God will be with me, and keep me in this way that I am going, and give me bread to eat and clothing to put on, so that I come back to my father’s house in peace, then the LORD shall be my God. And this

stone which I have set as a pillar shall be God's house, and of all that You give me I shall surely give a tenth to You." Genesis 28:20-22.

- Jacob is saying, I have seen the way that I should go, and if You, God, keep me (guard me, put a hedge of thorns around me — as a shepherd does to protect the sheep from predators), give me food and clothing ("all these things" from Luke 12:31), and bring me back to my father's house in peace (that I will be able to return to the land You gave my father and all of his descendants — without my brother killing me), then the LORD (all capitals, God in His system of government, seed, plant, harvest) shall be my God.
- Then Jacob goes on to say something incredibly prophetic — "And this stone which I have set as a pillar shall be God's house." What? How can a stone be God's house? "The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This was the LORD's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day the LORD has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it. Save now, I pray, O LORD; O LORD, I pray, send now prosperity. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD. We have blessed you from the house of the LORD." Psalm 118:22-26.
- And Jesus quoted Psalm 118:22-23 to the "builders," the chief priests and Pharisees of the time, and they wanted to kill him for saying it.
- Jesus is the stone Jacob was talking about, which means that Jacob must have seen His coming through His line, otherwise, he wouldn't have said, "This stone which I have set as a pillar shall be God's house." Later, Jesus tells Peter, "on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades (hell) shall not prevail against it." Matthew 16:18.
- All through scripture, we read of our Rock. I challenge you to do a study on how the Rock is woven all through scripture. Even if you look at how David killed Goliath. What did he use to bring him down? A stone. Who did David say would deliver the uncircumcised (which means without a covenant) Philistine into his hands? "This day the LORD will deliver you and take your head from you." 1 Samuel 17:46.
- Again, how intricate are the amazing mysteries of our God!! There is nothing in His plan that He doesn't put in the scripture, over and over again for us to see. We just have to take the TIME to seek it out; "seek FIRST the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you." Matthew 6:33.
- When we seek to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, which are discovered through Holy Spirit speaking to our spirit as we read the word of God, then our soul can, "be transformed by the renewing of [our] mind, that [we] may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." Romans 12:2. What is our soul? Our mind, will, and emotions. As we gain fresh revelation through seeking the mysteries of the kingdom of God through scripture, our soul will be renewed, and all the things our body needs on earth will be provided for. How? Because now, we know how seed, plant, harvest works; we understand the workings of the kingdom of God, the principles, the laws. And when we tithe, as Jacob did, we will KNOW the promises that come with that, and in the face of our enemy, satan, we can stand on the truth of Malachi 3:10-12. And when we also give, as it is mentioned in Luke 6:38, we can then stand on the truth of that scripture. And as we continue to "seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness," all the earthly things we need will be given to us. Why? Because that is the truth of the mystery of the Kingdom of God. "For there is nothing hidden which will not be

revealed, nor has anything been kept secret but that it should come to light. If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear.” Mark 4:22-23.

- These are the truths of the mystery of the kingdom of God. If you haven't heard or seen the revelation yet, keep listening and studying the scriptures, asking Holy Spirit to show you, to open your eyes and ears. Because, “faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God.” Romans 10:17. “If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear.”
- The LORD bless you and keep you (protect you from all that wants to harm you, put a hedge of thorns around you, like the Good Shepherd He is), the LORD make His face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you, and give you peace.” Numbers 6:24-26.
