Built in 1887, the estate was formerly the private residence of the family of Louis A. Graves. It was designed by architect William C. Bull, who created many stately Victorian structures in the Shires of Vermont. Ten-foot ceilings, a mahogany-paneled library with an ornately carved fireplace, leaded glass pocket doors, and bookcases, and the raised plaster crown moldings of the Dining Room make the South Shire a showpiece of Southern Vermont during the Victorian Era. Nine spacious and individually period-decorated guest rooms have working fireplaces, private baths, air conditioning, and high-speed wireless internet.
