

KEYS IN THE OFFICE!

It is important to keep a set of your house keys or your security keypad code at the office in case of an emergency where entry into your unit is necessary. The keys are kept in a secure file cabinet in the office. If entry is needed, only a Board Member and a Maintenance member would enter.

REMINDER!

Now is the time to clean our outside areas especially under the Gettysburg stairwells and back patios. No leaves, newspapers, flyers, loose bottles, cans, and recycling containers, etc., should be cluttering the stairwells, balconies and the backs of the units. Bicycles, folding lawn chairs, and wheelchairs are admissible. Failure to cooperate will result in a fine.

Back patios and enclosed rooms CANNOT be used for storage. Also, check your furnace filter – it may need to be replaced or cleaned.

REMEMBER: No fences across the back of your unit and fire pits are NOT allowed in the Village. BBQ grills must be 10 feet away from the buildings. **NO COOKING ALLOWED** on the balconies. It is a fire hazard.

RECYCLABLES & TOWNSHIP INFO **RECYCLABLES PICK-UP DATES:**

June 3, June 12 & June 26

Keep in mind if the recyclable date falls on a Monday holiday, the pickup will be on the following Saturday. Recyclables should be put out the night before, after 6:00 PM. In the Gettysburgs, please place them in the walkway between the cars near the street **and keep them outside, rain or shine.** If recyclables are not picked up, call (800) 488-6242.

Please follow these rules:

NO PLASTIC BAGS IN THE BIN. DO NOT BAG RECYCLABLES IN PLASTIC BAGS. RECYCLE ONLY:

Aluminum cans, glass bottles and jars, steel and tin cans, plastic bottles with a #1 or #2 on the bottom, newspapers, corrugated cardboard, mixed paper (magazines, paper, junk mail). **NO PIZZA BOXES! NO STYROFOAM, NO BATTERIES, NO CERAMICS/DISHWARE.**

Recyclable buckets can be purchased at the Old Bridge Town Center for \$10.00. New residents (within a year of occupancy) can get them free, if available.

Please put your address on your recycle bin to easily identify your bin if it is not returned where you put your recyclables out.

GARBAGE INFORMATION



Garbage: Must be in the green receptacle. Overflow should be on top of receptacle. **Mattresses and furniture: Call Waste Management at 1-800-869-5566 use Acct #026 75563. They will advise cost and pickup procedure. White Appliances (microwaves, refrigerators, dishwashers, or stoves): Schedule pick up for these items at Old Bridge Recycling (732) 721-5600 Ext. 6107 and they will advise of the pickup date, cost, and procedure.**

Do not put recyclables in the garbage as there are strict rules about this from the State EPA. Garbage people are not allowed to pick up recyclables so please be aware of this. **If they don't pick up your garbage, call 1-800-348-6161 ASAP.**

POOL PASSES

Two pool passes are issued to each unit. Additional passes are \$25.00. If you lose your pass, replacement cost is \$25.00 which will be refunded if the original pass is found.

UNPAID BILLS

Total arrears collected: May 2023 \$1,050. Total arrears unpaid thru May is \$49,005.58.

Maintenance fees collected: May \$125,310. Call the office and leave a message if you are having difficulty in paying your monthly maintenance fee.

MAINTENANCE FEE: The new maintenance fee is \$180. starting July 1. It is due the first of each month. No statement is sent unless it has not been paid by the 15th, at which time a \$25. late fee is charged.

If you are still writing a check for the maintenance fee, please make sure your unit address is on the check and print \$180. very carefully.

The final encounter with a Roman soldier is written in *Plutarch Lives, Antony IXXXV. 4* – “And of her two women, the one called Iras was dying at her feet, while Charmion, already tottering and heavy-headed, was trying to arrange the diadem, which encircled the queen’s brow. Then somebody said in anger: “A fine deed, this, Charmion!” “It is indeed most fine,” she said, “and befitting the descendant of so many kings.” I’m reminded of the quote, “Hell has no fury like a woman scorned”

REMINDERS



Please do not leave American Flags at the Clubhouse for disposal. The local V.F.W. has closed completely. Flags without the sticks can be taken to the American Legion in Keyport. There is a mailbox in front for the collection.

ALTERATION FORMS: It is imperative that Alteration forms be submitted to the Office for any renovations to the unit. We are required to keep updated records on all units in the Village. Alteration forms will NOT be accepted for electrical or plumbing projects without a copy of the electrician's or plumber's valid license and insurance attached. An alteration form is required for carpeting on stairwells.

PARKING PERMIT STICKERS: Every car parked in the Village **MUST** have a parking sticker. Bring your car to the Office with your license and registration. This is mandatory. If you receive a letter about getting a permit, you must reply within 10 days, or you will be fined **\$50.00.**

VISITING CHILDREN: Children are not allowed to play in the streets. No bikes or skateboards allowed. Visiting children should be respectful and not disturb neighbors living in the vicinity.

DRYER VENTS: Dryer vents need to be cleaned out every 5 years by a professional service on order of the Fire Dept. Please check your records or call the Office if you do not remember when yours was last cleaned. Don't forget to clean your lint filter after each use.

DOGS ON EXTENDED LEASHES: Please be mindful of other people when using extended leashes for your dogs or cats. Your neighbors can easily trip on them. Better yet, try not using them at all!

FIBERGLASS BALCONIES: No rugs or any form of carpeting on the new fiberglass balconies or patios. These coverings cause the deterioration of the cement as well as the new fiberglass.

CLOTHESLINES: They must be folded after use. The CVA is not responsible for clotheslines getting damaged by the landscapers.

CHANGES IN UNITS: As equipment has been changed (Ex: Furnaces, air conditioners, windows), new situations have arisen. When contractors add or change equipment, be advised that these changes created by your contractor are your responsibility and must be maintained by you and be added to your insurance policy. You must apply for an alteration permit from the CVA and from Old Bridge Township before making changes to your unit. Failure to do so will generate a fine.

DOG & CAT OWNERS: Dog droppings are still an issue. By law, you must pick up after your pet. If you are observed not picking up after your pet, you will be fined. Please do not walk your pet behind or on the side of other units since you are intruding on the privacy of other residents. **PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET—IT'S THE LAW -- DON'T DISPOSE OF THE BAG IN THE SEWER OR SOMEONE'S TRASH BIN**

COMPLAINTS & GRIEVANCES: If you have a complaint or problem with your unit, you must call the Office. If you have a grievance, please submit it in writing to the Office, attention Grievance Committee. It must include your name and address, or it will not be considered for action. MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT
SEWER BACKUP PROBLEMS

All residents are responsible for toilets, sinks, and bathtub backups.

CVA is only responsible for the main sewer line backups.

Nothing but toilet paper goes down the toilets, that is: NO GREASE, NO WIPES OF ANY KIND, NO RAGS, NO PAPER TOWELS, OR KLEENEX AND NO DIAPERS. Recently we had several backup problems due to accumulation of grease in the drain.

Do not use Drano for backups. Drano eats away at the pipes. An easy alternative is: Pour ½ to 1 cup baking soda into the drain, then 1 to 2 cups vinegar. It is normal for the solution to bubble up and fizz like crazy, leave it for 2-3 minutes or so. Then it is very important to rinse the drain, using plenty of hot water, for at least one minute.

For your laundry needs, please use liquid detergent. Powder cakes up in the pipes over time.

Any pipes in the walls that break, either water or sewer lines, are the responsibility of the homeowner.

HISTORY OF FATHER'S DAY

Father's Day was not immediately accepted when it was proposed, and it did not become a national holiday in the U.S. until 1972 during President Nixon's administration.

With America's history, you might think that a holiday recognizing men would be perfectly acceptable. After all, men dominated American society in the early 20th century. In addition, a "Father's Day" or day that recognizes the role of fathers in the family is an ancient tradition. In history books, there is a mention of a Southern European tradition dating back to 1508.

Currently in modern days, we do not give Father's Day a second thought. It's been almost 50 years since President Richard Nixon's administration declared the third Sunday in June a day to recognize and honor the role of fathers in society (that occurred in 1972).

Interestingly, Father's Day was not immediately accepted when it was proposed. Why not?

Mother's Day came first so men in the early 1900s associated such a tribute to women and found the idea too effeminate to their liking.

Men viewed the idea of Father's Day as similar to Mother's Day, which was popular with florists; for fathers, it didn't have the same sentimental appeal.

The first known Father's Day service occurred in Fairmont, West Virginia, on July 5, 1908, after hundreds of men died in the worst mining accident in U.S. history.

Grace Golden Clayton, the daughter of a dedicated minister, proposed a service to honor all fathers, especially those who had died. However, the observance did not become an annual event, and it was not promoted; very few people outside of the local area knew about it. Meanwhile, across the entire country, another woman was inspired to honor fathers.

In 1909, Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, was inspired by Anna Jarvis and convinced the Spokane Ministerial Association and the YMCA to set aside a Sunday in June to celebrate fathers.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MAY 18 CVA MEETING

Trustee James Nolan, Regulatory & Compliance:

Jim welcomed all to the meeting and was the moderator. A salute to the flag was conducted including a moment of silence for the sick, suffering, essential workers, and those serving in the Military. The next open CVA meeting is June 15, 2023. The minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted. At the end of the meeting, a question-and-answer session was held. The calendars for July and August will be available in the Office as well as published on the CVA website. He emphasized new homeowners must be aware of the regulation of submitting an alteration form before any work is started including a copy of the license and insurance of any contractor doing work.

Pres. Kevin Garcia: Kevin thanked everyone for attending the meeting. Due to rising costs of insurance and other areas, it was necessary to raise the monthly maintenance fee \$5.00 a month which increases the monthly fee to \$180. a month. The new fee goes into effect with your July 2023 payment. Do not walk or walk your dog behind the units as a courtesy of privacy to residents. Make sure to pick up after your dog or it may be necessary to go forward with banning dogs for new residents. Do not leave food at the library. Contact Old Bridge or our mail carrier for food pantry information.

V.P. Maureen Doloughty: There will not be a bulletin for July or August. In case of emergency when entry into your unit is necessary, you are urged to leave a key in the Office. A recent water event caused homeowners not to have their water turned back on after repair was completed until all residents were home. The keys are put into your file in the Office and are locked in a filing cabinet. Tickets for the May 28 pool opening are available in the Office at a cost of \$15. per person.

Treasurer Patricia Smith: The financial reports for March and April 2023 as well as the 2023-2024 financial budget were distributed to all attendees. They were accepted as read. Due to the increase in the maintenance fee as of July 1, you will need to change the amount of the funds deducted on ZRent or however you pay your fee.

Trustee Ken Rigatti: The pool opening/Memorial Day barbeque will be on Sunday, May 28. You

must provide your own drinks and sides. Since there were eighteen new lounge chairs purchased, there is no need to bring your own chairs. The pool deck is open; swimming is prohibited until the Board of Health gives final approval. Two pool badges are provided to each household; the cost for an extra badge is \$25. If you lose your badge, there is a \$25. charge. If the original badge is found after that, your charge will be refunded with the return of the new badge. A designated smoking area has been established. Do not put cigarette butts in the planters. The project of replacing several Federal Pacific boxes on the outside of units has been completed. Maintenance will check the remaining boxes to determine if there are any more needing repair.

Trustee Rich Kubian: We are still experiencing clogged pipe issues due to materials being flushed that should not be. Landscaping, including seeding and topsoil, is being done. Work on concrete sidewalks and stairs will begin. NJNG will be on premises on Monday to remedy the damage incurred during their gas line replacement. There was a major sewer line collapse on Haven Drive which resulted in a major cost to the Association. The lawn maintenance company's sub-contractor sprayed herbicide/fertilizer last week.

Trustee Dennis Winters: Do not put dog waste in the sewers or neighbor's garbage receptacles. Make sure you have a current parking pass. Do not store recyclables under the stairs.

Invited speakers were Steve Reisler from Alliant Insurance who addressed the increase of the insurance premium for the Association, and Thomas Fishkin from Devon Insurance to discuss with individual homeowners what insurance coverage they should have on their units. He left some brochures in the office for those who may be interested in exploring new insurance coverage.

Also, John Russo and Alan Brennan from CaptionCall. They explained the free federal program providing telephones with captioning for those who experience hearing loss. Contact information will be included in the bulletin.

A question-and-answer period followed the presentations including subjects on the topics of scheduling of roofing, siding, pickleball court, bocce court, and power washing.
