Court Finds Red Grouper Reallocation Was Flawed, Remands to NMFS

The Gulf of Mexico Reef Fish Shareholders' Alliance today issued the following statement on the decision by the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals to remand Amendment 53 (Red Grouper Reallocation) back to the National Marine Fisheries Service:

Two years ago a coalition of commercial fishermen in the Gulf of Mexico sued the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) for reallocating red grouper fishing quota from the commercial sector to the recreational sector.

The Gulf of Mexico Reef Fish Shareholders' Alliance, A.P. Bell Fish Company, and Southern Offshore Fishing Association argued that the reallocation was flawed and did not comply with legal requirements.

On March 1, 2024 the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals agreed.

The Court found that NMFS contradicted its own economic analysis, and failed to explain how the reallocation promoted conservation or minimized bycatch.

The court remanded the action to NMFS for further explanation.
