Boy Scouts seek adventures in many ways, from learning new skills to serving their communities. In July, several scouts from Troop 334 Montvale embarked on another adventure, completing a fifty mile canoe-packing trek in the Adirondacks. These scouts, ages ranging from 14 to 17, attended Floodwood (Northern New Jersey Council's high adventure base) where such an adventure is provided. CATHY FERRERO HONORED BY POST 153

AGING PLAQUE TO BE REHABBED

Two veterans from the Cpl. Jedh C. Barker Memorial Post 153 American Legion are hoping to rehab an aging monument at the Park Ridge High School field. According to Dick Bozzone, a past commander and historian and Thomas Scheulen, a Vietnam War combat veteran who served with the US Army's Americal Division, they believe it "is the right thing to do since the years have oxidized the monument and the facing has made the names of young borough veterans difficult to read." They both have passed the monument, as have thousands of local residents, who use the track and field, and probably very few even look at the monument on the front of a large boulder that was dedicated sometime around 1970. "These young men deserve better."

Dick and Tom are researching who was responsible for erecting the monument and are planning a small rededication ceremony at the conclusion of the project. The names on the plate are as follows: Cpl. Jedh C. Barker, a recipient of the Medal of Honor who was killed in action at the age of 22 in Vietnam in 1967. The others are: Cpl. Charles Bigham, USMC, killed September 9, 1967; Cpl. Thomas Mallon, killed in action on March 3, 1967, PFC Thomas Kyle, Jr., USMC killed in action on August 20, 1966, a soldier, Sgt. Kenneth Rakentine, US Army, formerly from New York and PA, killed on September 13, 1967. He apparently was listed as being from Park Ridge. These veterans believe that these seven young men were the cream of our nation's youth and their sacrifices deserve more than having their names tarnished on a monument that thousands of people have passed by over the years. The names of all these men are also listed on the Vietnam Memorial in Veterans' Park in Park Ridge.

FINANCE OFFICER'S CORNER:

Tax Tips

Appreciated securities or other property you have held 12 months or longer can incur combined Federal and State capital gains taxes greater than 30%. Gifting those securities or property to the American Legion Post 153 in 2017 avoids the capital gains tax and still allows you to claim the full value of the gift as a charitable deduction. The value of the security on the date of transfer will determine the charitable deduction.

If you are 70.5 years or older, make a gift directly from your IRA. The IRA Charitable Rollover permits direct transfers from your IRA to Legion Post 153 without reporting the distribution as adjusted gross income (AGI) on your tax return. Excluding the IRA withdrawal from your AGI helps you avoid higher taxes on Social Security benefits, higher Medicare premiums, higher tax brackets and surtaxes on investment income. The rollover counts toward your IRA's Required Minimum Distribution for the 2017 tax year.

Your IRA Custodian will have a special form permitting you to make this transfer.

A 529, Roth IRA, insurance: What's best way to pay for college? One type of 529 plan is the college savings plan, in which parents, grandparents or whomever—even the student, as long as she's at least 18 years old, can open one—invest money that grows tax-free on behalf of the beneficiary. As long as it's used to pay for qualified higher-education expenses, the money, including any earnings, comes out tax-free. Pros: it is transferable to another child, anyone can contribute to it, and there are no income limits to setting it up. Cons: limited investment choices, potential higher fees.

Roth IRAs: If you have held the account for more than 5 years, you may use the money tax free for education expenses and have a wider range of investment choices. If your grandchildren earn money you may add that amount to the Roth IRA each year. If not used for college, the funds may be used for retirement.

Cash-value life insurance: There are a variety of flavors of whole, universal or variable life insurance policies, but the gist of it is you can build up a balance that you can withdraw money from or borrow against, thus providing a source of college funds. Pros: flexibility; you can use money for anything you want Cons: upfront and ongoing fees.

Estate Planning: Do you have current and complete copies of HIPPA authorization, health care Proxy, will, living will, power of attorney, executor designation? Could you loved ones have easy access to these plus bank, auto home and life insurance, deeds to property ,mortgages, loans, personal information(social security, credit cards, tax returns, passwords). All of these should be in a side place where trusted loved ones can recover them. Your bank or financial custodian may have a vehicle like Fidelity's online Fidspace where all your document is stored in one safe place. An attorney or tax advisor can be well worth the cost—significant savings can result from thorough, informed planning to maximize what you leave behind for your beneficiaries.

Medical Expenses: Runaway medical expenses are hardly a secret; 57% of people facing home foreclosure identify medical debt as a primary cause. While there is no magic formula to escaping these costs, there are tools to challenge denial of a claim. Is it a processing error due to incorrect information? Insurance companies make processing errors in 15% of all claims. The error rate is even higher on hospital bills Look for the denial code in your explanation of benefits (EOB).Review your coverage and get all medical records necessary to file an appeal. You have 180 days to do so. Check www.healthlawadvocates.org and www.patientadvocate.org for information on concise and specific appeals. Send it to your insurer's appeal address certified mail. If your appeal is not successful, you have a 60 day time right to a review from a state or federal independent review board. (www.cms.gov; www.njconsumeraffairs.gov)

TD BANK AFFINITY FUND RAISER (AH198)

If you bank with TD bank you may participate in a no cost to you or the post affinity fundraiser offered to 501c3 nonprofits. You must designate your accounts (business checking, personal checking, savings, money market, CDs, and retirement accounts) for inclusion in the American Legion Post 153 program. **The program code is AH198. TD Bank will provide an annual cash contribution to the Post as outlined below.**

You may designate your accounts for inclusion in the program by visiting the branch at 33 S. Kinderkamack Rd, Montvale bank or them at 201 391 0505 and talking to Bill DeBenedetto or Josh.

The Post receives \$50 for every new checking account and \$10 for existing accounts. Savings and CD deposits receive 1/10 of 1% of average annual balances.

Information on enrolled accounts is kept strictly confidential and will not be shared with our Post.

MEMORIAL CEREMONY HONORING MARINE CPL JEDH C. BARKER

A memorial ceremony for USMC Medal of Honor recipient, Jedh Colby Barker, celebrating the 50th anniversary of his supreme sacrifice, will be held at the Cpl. Jedh C. Barker Memorial American Legion Post, 118 Ridge Ave., Park Ridge, NJ at 7:30PM on Thursday, September 21, 2017.

While engaged in a massive firefight as part of Operation Kingfisher, Barker was killed on Sept. 21, 1967 southeast of Con Thien near Phu Oc and the DMZ in South Vietnam throwing his wounded body on a grenade and protecting his fellow Marines.

Cpl. Barker was born in Franklin, New Hampshire in 1945. His father, Colby, served in the Marine Corps during World War II and the first name, "Jedh" is a combination of the first initials of his father's Marine buddies: John, Ezekial, Donald and Herbert.

When he was 6, his family moved to Park Ridge. During his years at Park Ridge High School, he distinguished himself in team sports including football and baseball, serving as co-captain of the former his senior year. In retrospect, his ability to lead and at the same time, be cognizant of the team dynamic so essential to success demonstrated the qualities he would later apply to his Marine service.

After two years of college, he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve in June of 1966. In October, he was discharged from the Reserves to enlist in the regular Marine Corps. He did his recruit training at Parris Island, S.C., and underwent individual combat training and weapons special training at Camp Lejeune, N.C. In December, he was promoted to private first class.

From March to June, 1967, he was a member of Marine Air Base Squadron 21, in San Francisco. He was subsequently re-assigned as a machine gunner with Company F and sent to Vietnam. He was promoted to lance corporal on Sept. 1.

That Cpl. Barker chose to be a Marine while protests against the war were being staged across the country and many young men fled the country rather than face the draft, speaks to his personal character and the sense of duty demonstrated by his father, a Marine, who served with distinction during World War II and his brother, Warren, who served in the USMC during Korea and Vietnam.

The bravery and ultimate sacrifice of Lance Corporal Jedh C. Barker has been memorialized in many ways.

In the months after his death, the then-Pascack Valley American Legion Post 153 in Park Ridge resolved to rename the post in his honor and memory and it has been the Jedh C. Barker Memorial American Legion Post 153 ever since. His name is engraved on the Vietnam War Memorial in Washington, D.C., on Panel 26E, Line 99 and on the date of his death, Sept. 21, 1967 on the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Holmdel, NJ.

In 1976, the Marine Corps named a new building in his honor. Barker Hall is located at Marine Corps Base Quantico, Virginia. In a letter to the family, the commanding general said naming the building in their son's honor, "will assist in perpetuating the memory of your son, Jedh, in the proud history of our Corps, and is a special recognition of an individual Marine who helped write that history."

A plaque honoring his sacrifice is displayed in Franklin's borough hall. In addition to the text of the Medal of Honor Citation, it bears this inscription: "Presented Nov. 11, 1990 by the townspeople of Franklin, NH, Franklin VFW Post 1698 and auxiliary and the Massachusetts chapter of the Third Marine Division Association in grateful appreciation to a Franklin, NH resident who was awarded the Medal of Honor for exemplary heroism."

A bronze plaque dedicated to his service and supreme sacrifice is located in Veterans Park in the borough of Park Ridge, NJ.

He will be forever remembered by those who knew him as a beloved son and brother, a team player, a loyal friend; and to all who know of his sacrifice, a hero in the truest sense of the word.

He is buried in George Washington Memorial Park in Paramus. His grave marker reads simply:

JEDH COLBY BARKER

MEDAL OF HONOR

L CPL US MARINE CORPS

VIETNAM

1945 – 1967

On the 40th anniversary of his death, American Legion Post 153 hosted a celebration of Cpl. Barker's life, honored his memory at a special event and accepted the Medal of Honor from his family for permanent display with pictures of the family receiving the Medal from Vice President Spiro Agnew at the White House on October 31, 1969. Barker's other medals and decorations include the Purple Heart, the Presidential Unit Citation, National Defense Service Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal with one Bronze star and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.

Jedh died a hero. After being wounded in combat, he saved the lives of his remaining brothers in arms by throwing himself on a live hand grenade "with conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty". The final sentence of his Medal of Honor citation reads: "He gallantly gave his life for his country". Like many who went before him, he lives on in the hearts of those who knew him.
