

The Invasion of Pemberton

You have heard of the Battle of the Bulge and the Invasion of Iwo Jima, but have you ever heard of the Invasion of Pemberton? I'll tell you about it.

It was the summer of 1954. I had just graduated from Montclair State Teacher's College and because I had received a deferment until graduation, I expected to be inducted into the Army. The call came in early August. At Camp Kilmer they were assigning us to different parts of the service. The Army was looking for a group of graduates to train for the Counter Intelligence Corps. Since we had to get a security clearance we were assigned to a full 16 weeks of infantry basic training at Fort Dix. It was during this training that we going to have a field exercise. Here we were a whole company of trainees loaded with a pack and our rifles. I think we even carried our gas masks with us. Luckily we weren't taking the big gunsthe bazooka and 57 mm recoilless rifles which were a lot heavier. We were supposed to go out of camp to the field exercise grounds then hike back to camp.

Our officers had assigned a new Second Lieutenant to conduct this hike. Needless to say, we got lost as we left the field exercise area. We realized we were lost when taking a small lane into the woods and just came upon a famer's house. Next we arrived in the small farming village of Pemberton. Here we were an armed company of 200 men marching through the town. I found out that our leader had to stop in a gas station to get directions for returning to camp. We finally straggled back to our barracks at 8:30 that night, tired and hungry. That was a hike that was hard to forget. Will Smith

SENIOR/ VETERANS BENEFITS IN GAS TAX HIKE

VETERANS: Honorably Discharged Veterans can exempt \$3000 in wages from the state income tax.

RETIREES: Allows exclusion of pension and retirement income from state income tax. Beginning on July 1, 2017, and rising annually for the next four years, exemptions grow from \$15,000 to \$75,00 for individuals, \$20,00 to \$100,000 for joint filers and \$10,000 to \$50,000 for married couples filing individually.

SALES TAX: Reduced to 6.875% on Jan 1, 2017 and 6.625% on Jan 1. 2018

ESTATE TAX: On Jan 1, 2017, relatives of people who die can exempt assets up to \$ 2 million from the tax (previously \$675,000). Spouses are still exempt from the tax. On Jan 1, 2018, the estate tax will be eliminated.



Gas Tax Hike. Continued The inheritance tax (11 to 16%) which applies to relatives who are not children. grandchildren and their descendants, will remain intact

LEGION MEMBERSHIP STATUS **2017 MEMBERSHIP DUES**

If you did not pay your 2017 dues by December, as of Jan 1 2017, you will be officially suspended by National and Department of NJ, not be eligible for any American Legion Benefits Discounts, Legion insurance and be dropped from the membership rolls as well as Pascackle mailing list after this issue. It would be a shame to lose membership continuity and the benefits that come with membership. USAA insurance policies through the National Legion may also be dropped

If you are unable to pay your fees for any reason, please advise the Commander in writing to the Post and we will do everything possible to have your fees paid. Only written requests will be considered.

BOY SCOUTS ACTIVITIES Fall Activities - Boy Scout Troop 334:

More than 900 hours of labor was put in by Evan and his volunteers to complete the court. The end result was a 60'x10' court with two accompanying benches as well as landscaping. The project was finished in time for Evan to become an Eagle Scout just before his 18th birthday.


During the second week of September, Troop 334 scouts went spelunking at Clarksville Caves, located in Clarksville, NY. The cave is 4800 feet long and the boys learned the skills needed for safe spelunking. At the end of September, the scouts attended an orienteering overnight workshop hosted by The United States Military Academy Orienteering Team in West Point. Scouts participated in various exercises and practical applications, culminating in a troop-level orienteering competition.

Boy Scout Activities, Continued In October, the Troop hosted their annual camp out at Camp Bullowa where they taught the Montvale Cub Scouts, Pack 336 skills ranging from First Aid to Fire Building. The Cubs had a blast building and launching bottle rockets and roasting marshmallows.

In November, the scouts explored Freedom Trail, a 2.5- mile-long path through downtown Boston, Massachusetts, that leads to 16 historically significant sites. They explored museums and meetinghouses, churches, and burial grounds. During the trip, the Scouts learnt about the brave people who shaped our nation and understood the rich history of the American Revolution, as it began in Boston, where every step tells a story.

During the first week of January the scouts camped at Camp WahWahTaysee mainly to hone outdoor skills in preparation for the upcoming Klondike Derby competition.

At the Troop 334 Fall/Winter Court of Honor in January the boys were recognized for nearly 150 merit badges and 7 rank advancements including a 5th Eagle Palm by Michael Sawitz. They will also receive patches from summer camp at Camp NoBeBoSco and other trips over the past 6 months.

COUNTDOWN TO 100!

All veterans who served in World War II have been designated as "the greatest generation" and in May, 2015, Post 153 created a special award known as "The Greatest Generation Citation" that was presented to all members who served at that time.

Post 153 has also partnered with the Borough of Park Ridge, among other activities, to hold a "9/11" observance each year on the anniversary of the attack on America in 2001 by Islamic terrorists and this has become one of the largest events in Bergen County.

Now, this latest endeavor has the potential to be one of the biggest ever carried out by Post 153. Collery said, "We are off to the races and determined to be among the foremost posts supporting the centennial birthday of the American Legion." In the past five years post members have held a "countdown to one hundred" with a birthday celebration highlighting the date that the national unit was charted on September 29, 1919, by World War I veterans.

The official schedule for the nation-wide observance of the mother organization lists events that will begin in September, 2017, and continue for fifteen months culminating on the one hundred anniversary of the first armistice, November 11, 1918, which was the date that the four year blood bath of the "Great War" ended. -Dick Bozzone, PC and Post Historian

VETERAN'S DAY POST ATTENDEE

Ninety one year old Japanese - American War Hero Montvale resident Kazuo Yamaguchi, a second generation (neisi) US Army infantryman who served with the famous one hundredth infantry battalion, part of the 442nd regiment during World War Il attended the Veterans' Day observance at post 153. Welcoming him to the event honoring US war dead from the attack on Pearl Harbor was Dick Bozzone, a past commander and historian. Bozzone is one of the very few non - Pearl Harbor survivors who are honorary members of that organization. Yamaguchi's regiment was one of the most decorated outfits in the history of the US Army. They fought in France and other European battles in 1944 - 45.

POST 153 HONORS THREE LOCAL LADIES AS "CENTENNIAL WOMEN"

The Cpl. Jedh C. Barker Memorial Post 153, Park Ridge American Legion, honored three local women as "centennial women" as part of the upcoming one hundredth anniversary of the founding of the American Legion which is the largest veterans' organization in the world. The Park Ridge post will observe its one hundredth anniversary on September 29, 2019. The national unit was organized in March of 1919.

This "centennial women" project was developed by Dick Bozzone, past commander and current historian along with Commander Joseph Collery; post 153 is the first to organize such an event in the United States.

These women, Martha Grodman, who is 104, Ruthea Kraker who is 102 and Alma Muaczewski who is 100, have seen and been part of history as long, and actually several years prior to the formation of the national organization. These ladies have seen 15 Presidents elected, one was born two months after the ill fated ocean liner, the Titanic, was sunk, witnessed President Woodrow Wilson begin his first term and the oldest lady was born the year (1912) that the state of Arizona joined the union together with many other hundred years of history making events.

These residents of the Atrium Senior Living facility in Park Ridge were honored on January 6th. They were presented with framed citations and bouquets of flowers and a reception followed. A large cake decorated with "100th Anniversary American Legion" was served to the many relatives and friends who attended as well as other well wishers.

The members of American Legion Post 153, Park Ridge, have chosen these deserving ladies for having contributed to what is now the world's greatest nation. It is with a certain envy and admiration that these women will receive the accolades of their fellow citizens. They are no longer "an asterisk" on the pages of history; they are, in effect, history itself!

. According to Cathy Ferrero, activities director, Martha Grodman who was born in Poland on June 15, 1912, two months after the sinking of the Titanic will be honored along with Alma Muraczewski who was born on October 3, 1917, who will be 100 on her next birthday. The third woman is Ruthea Kraker, formerly of River Vale, who was born on September 11, 1916, celebrated 100 years on the anniversary of 9/11, 2001. Between now and the end of the centennial celebration whoever reaches 100 years of age will also be honored. The family members will be present along with Bozzone who is coordinating the events and Joseph Collery, commander. Citations and bouquets of flowers will be presented to these ladies after a short review of the centennial observance. *Please note: within a few weeks we will be honoring additional women residing locally.
