Annual Tune-Up

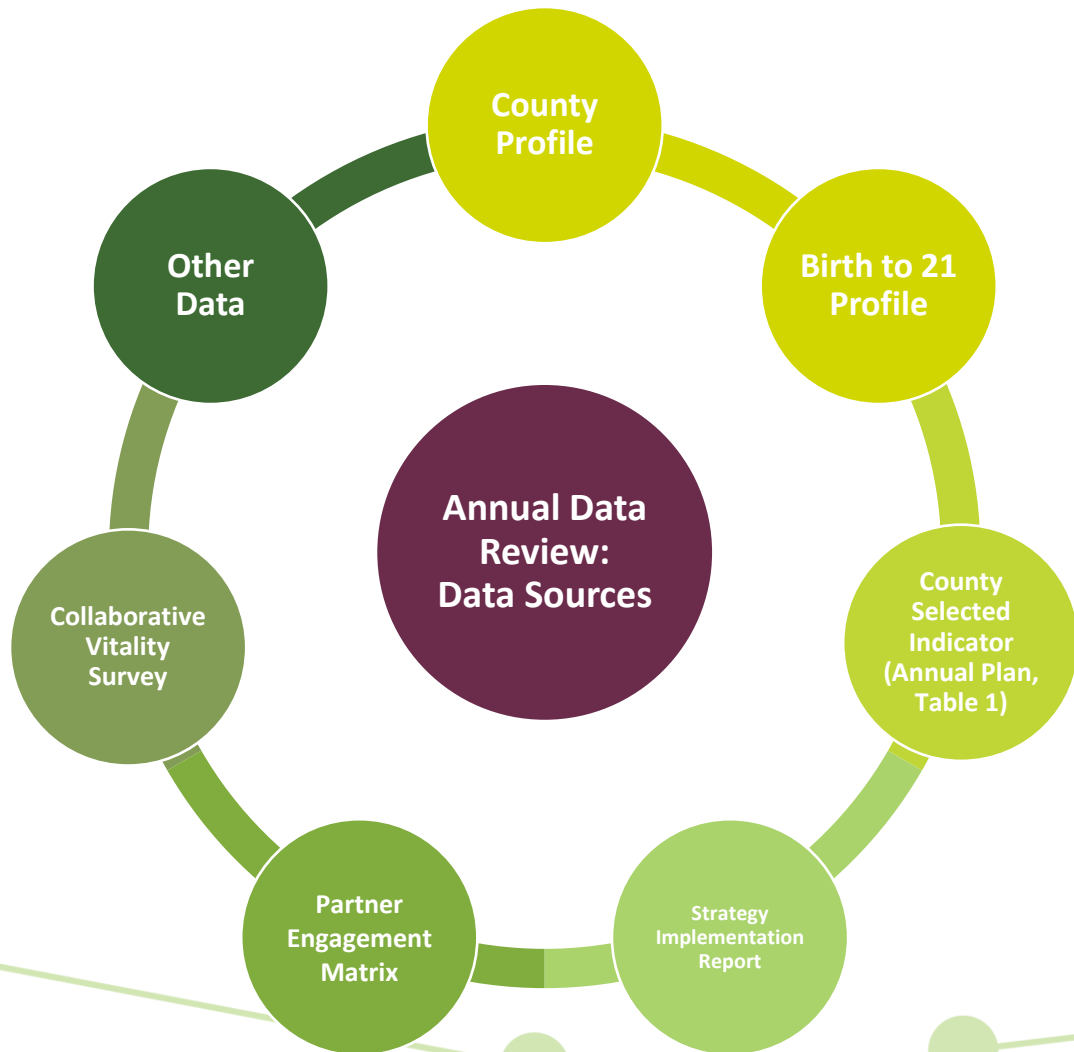
- Simple and effective way to check and see if the current plan and community data are aligned.

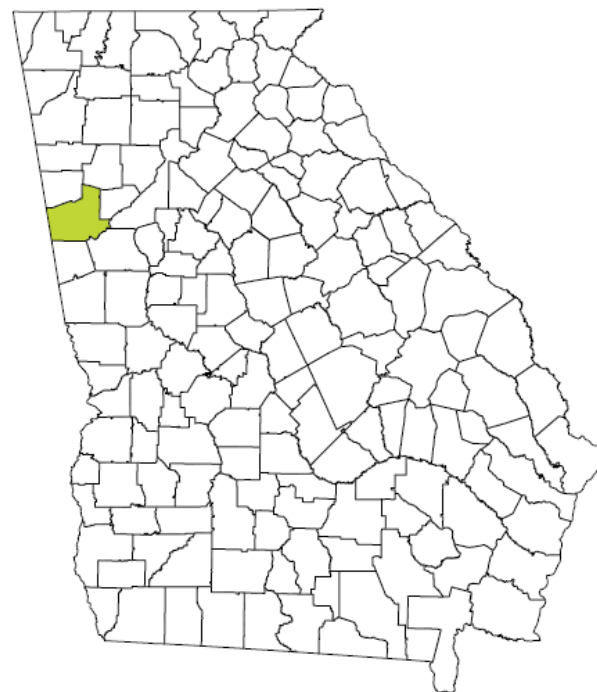

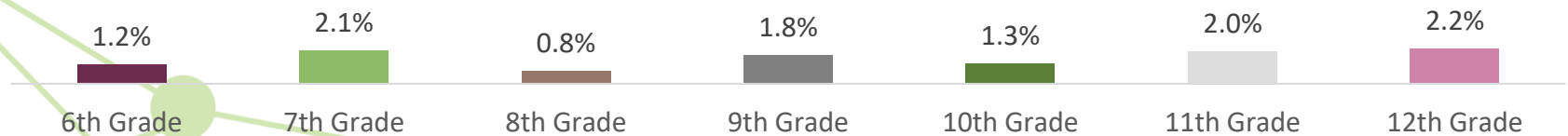

Carroll County – During the past 12 months, on how many occasions have you attempted suicide ?

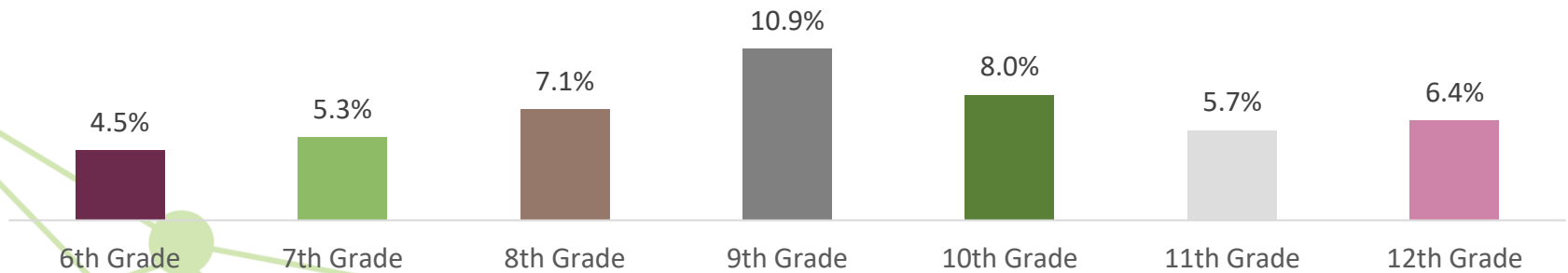

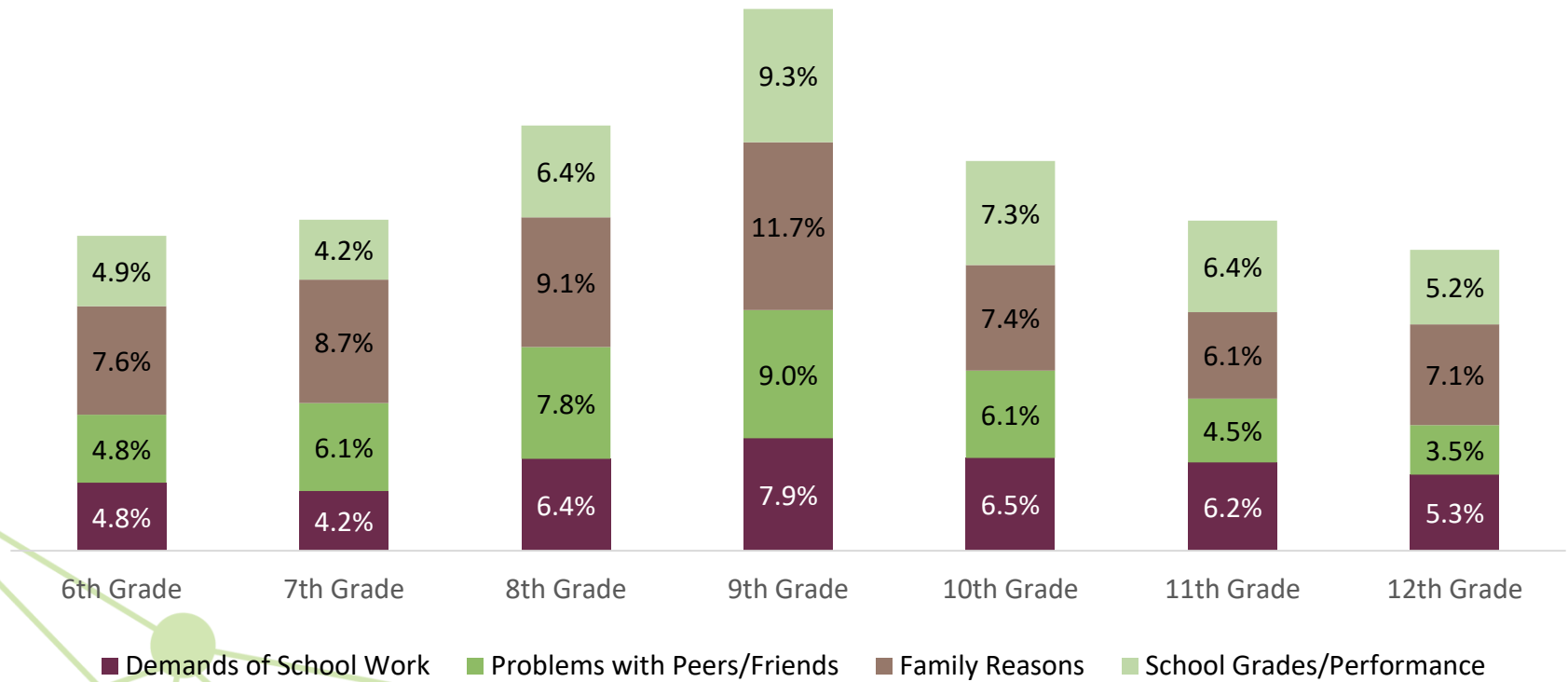
Carroll County – During the past 12 months, on how many occasions have you seriously considered harming yourself on purpose?

3-5 Occasions or more than 5 occasions

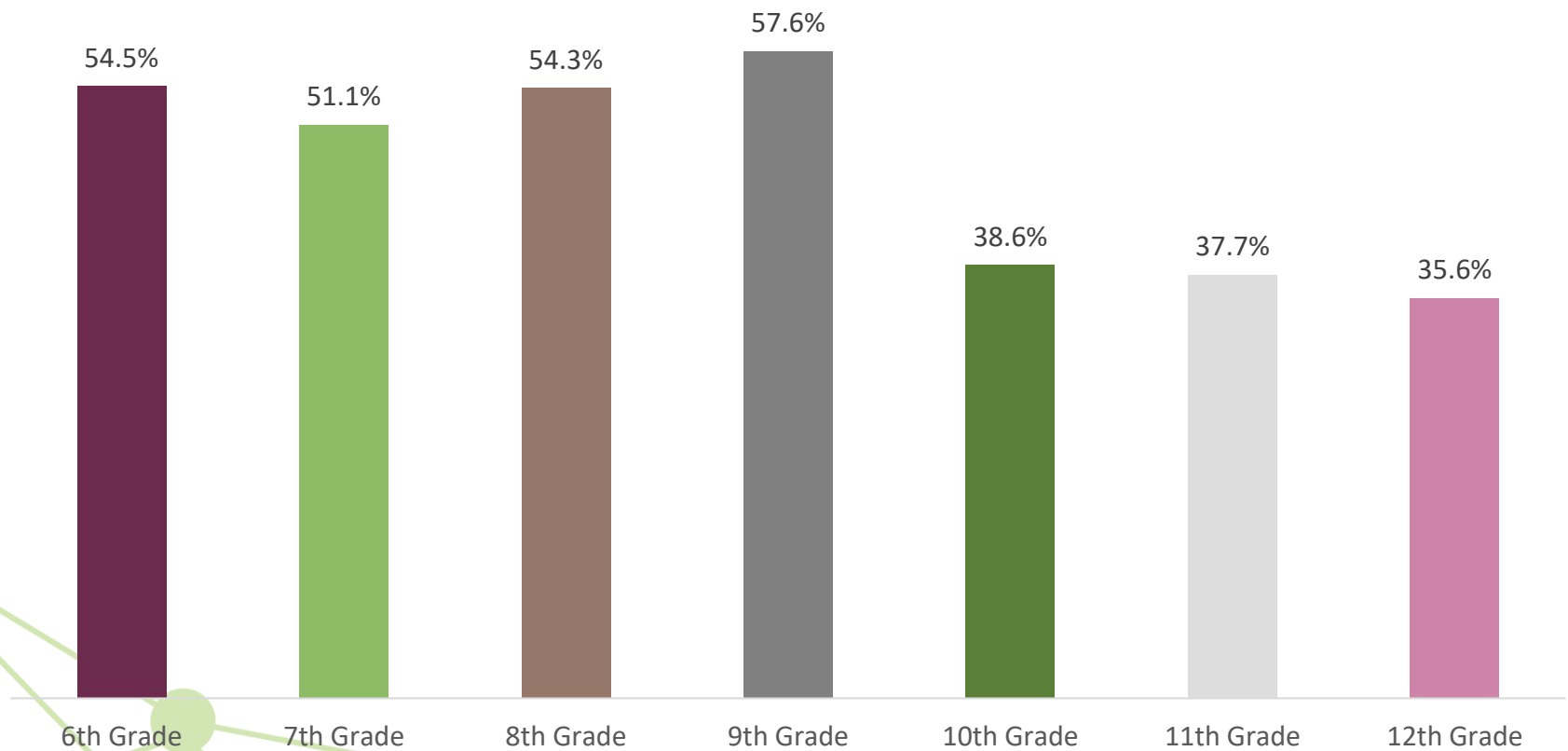

Carroll County – During the past 12 months, if you have seriously considered harming yourself on purpose, what was the most likely reason?

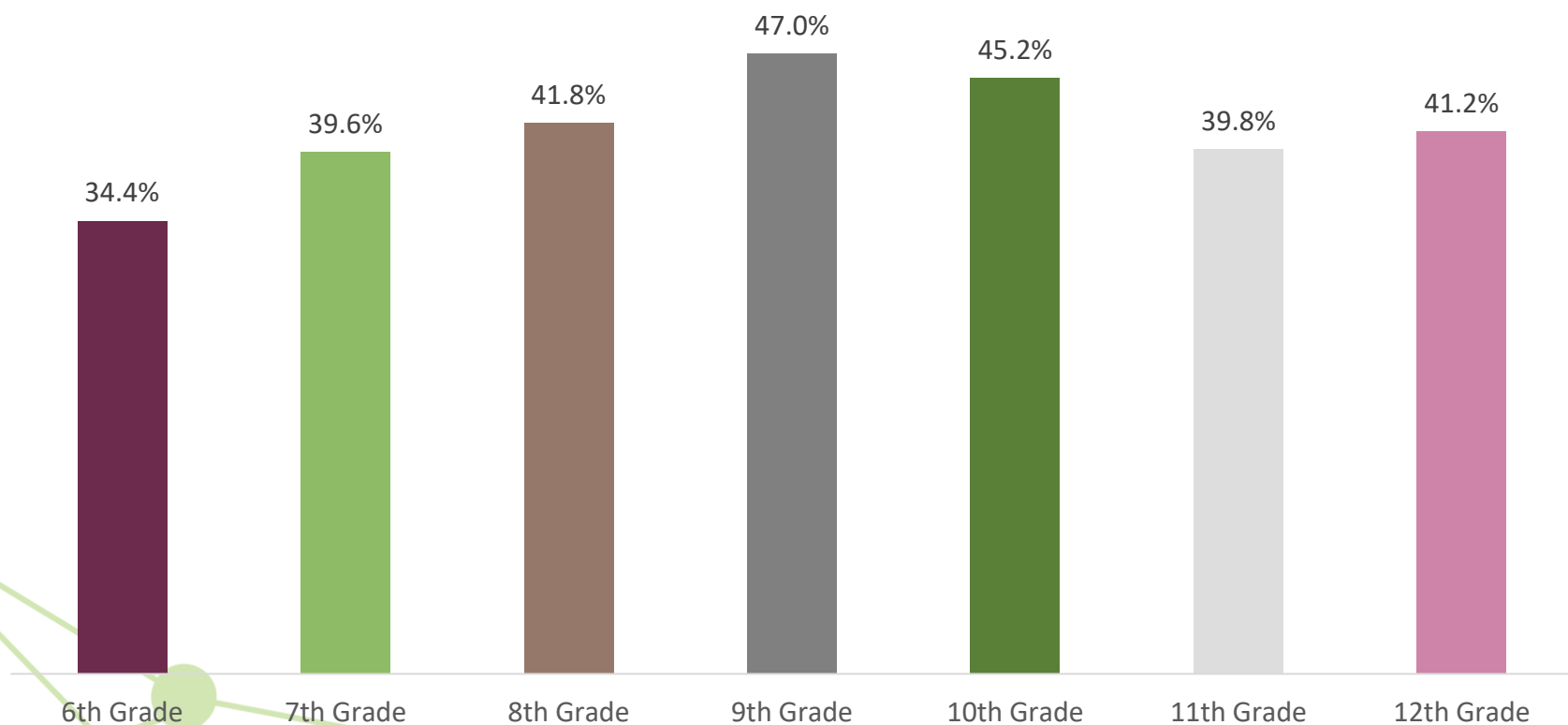


Carroll County – In the past 30 days, on how many days have you felt depressed, sad or withdrawn?



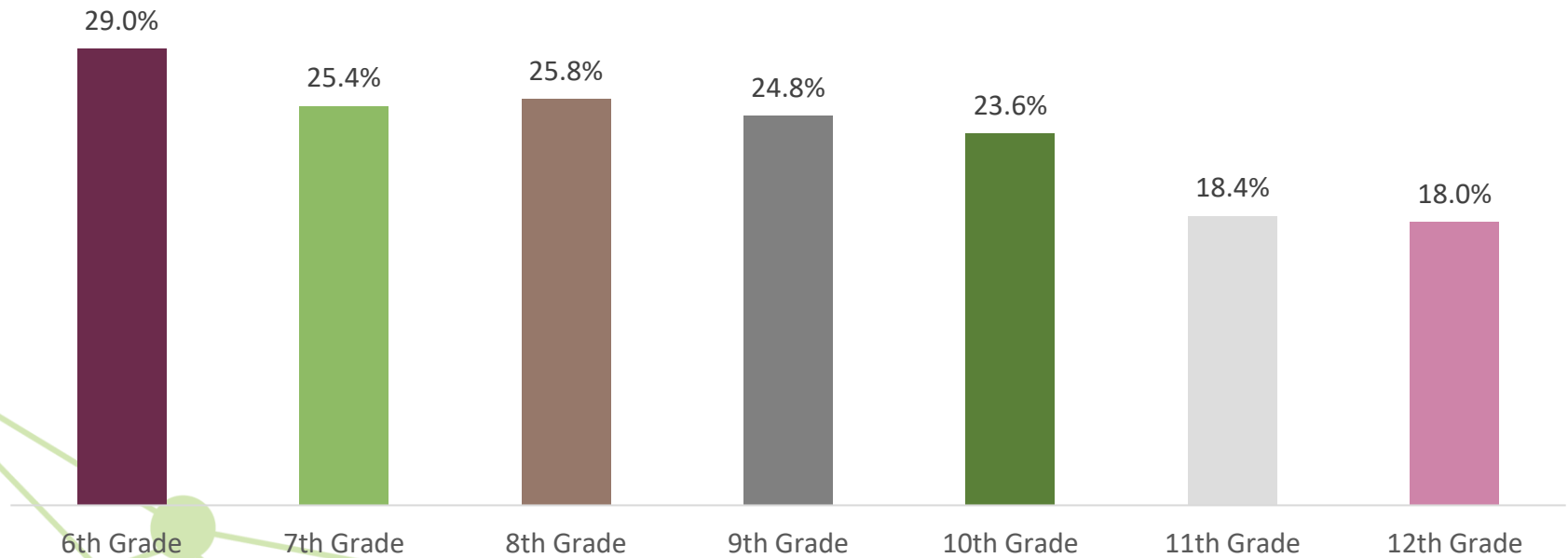

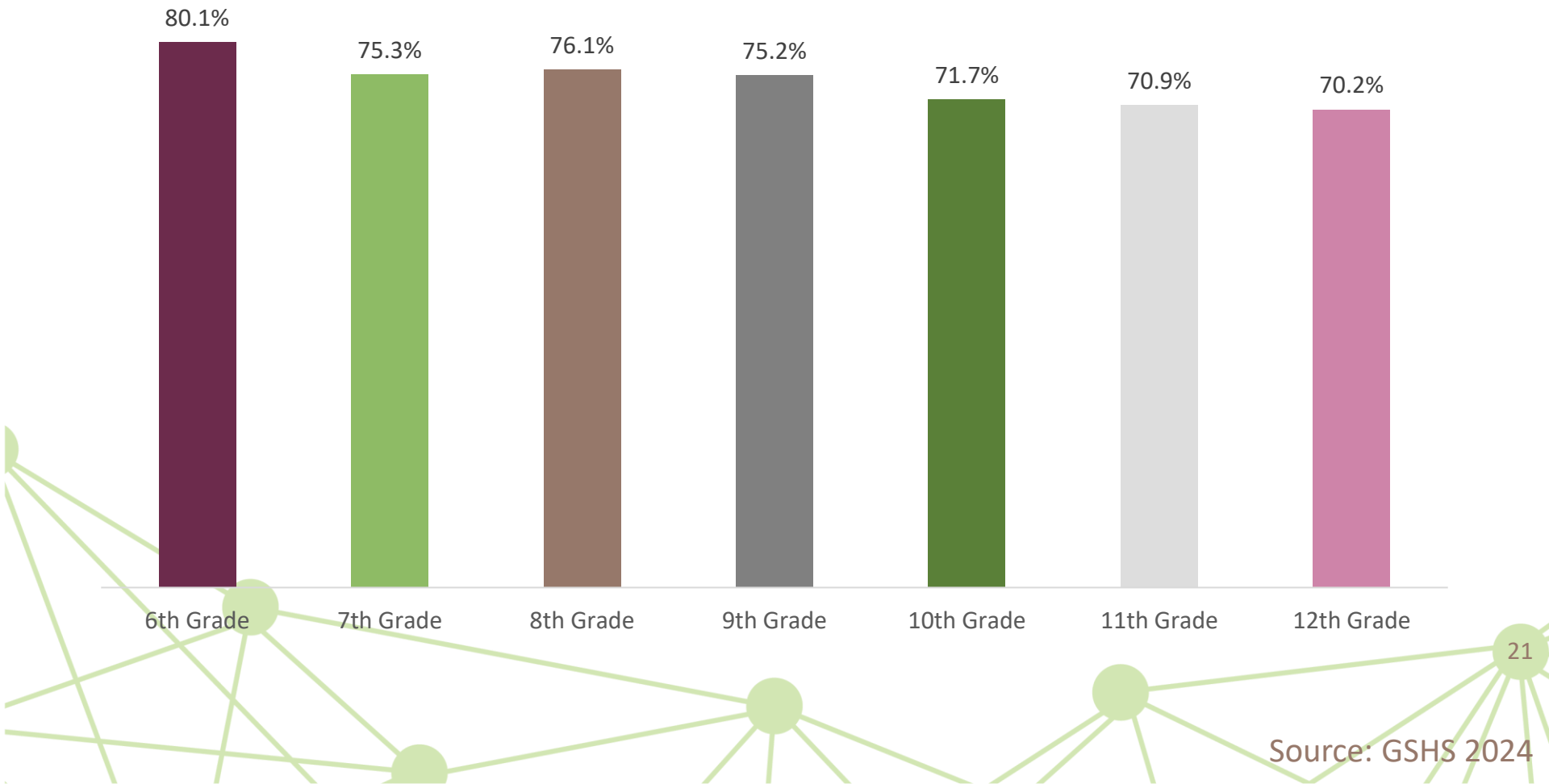

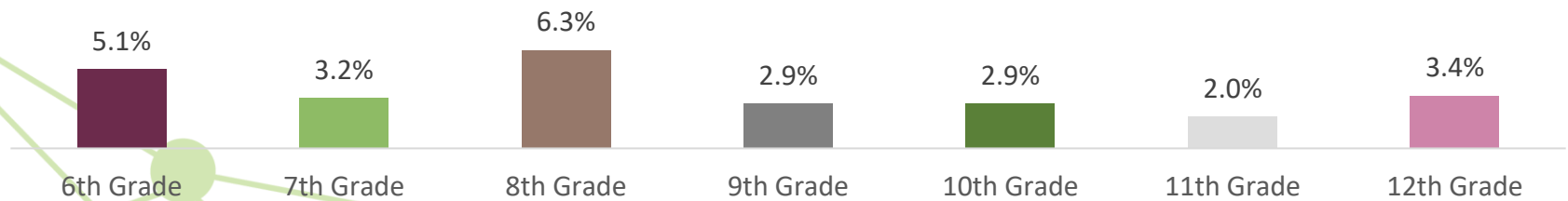
Carroll County – How often in the last 30 days have I felt safe at school?

Carroll County – How often in the last 30 days has someone bullied me by pushing, hitting, or kicking me?

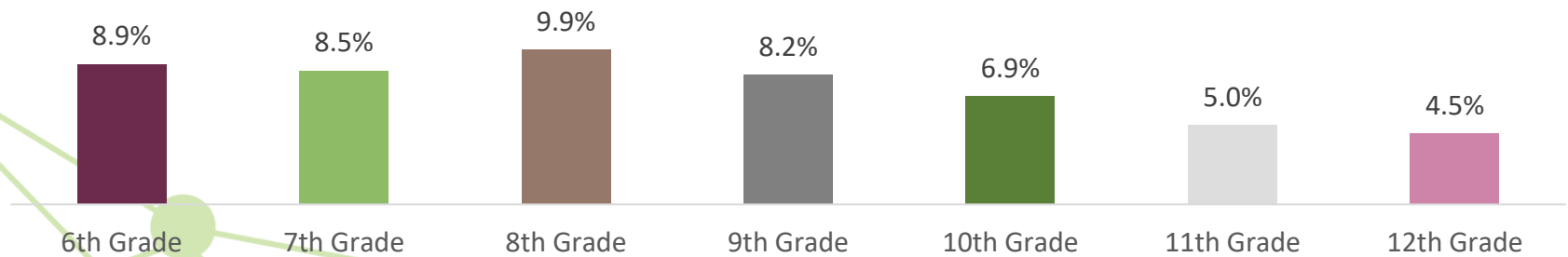

Carroll County – How often in the last 30 days has someone bullied me by making fun of me or spreading rumors about me?

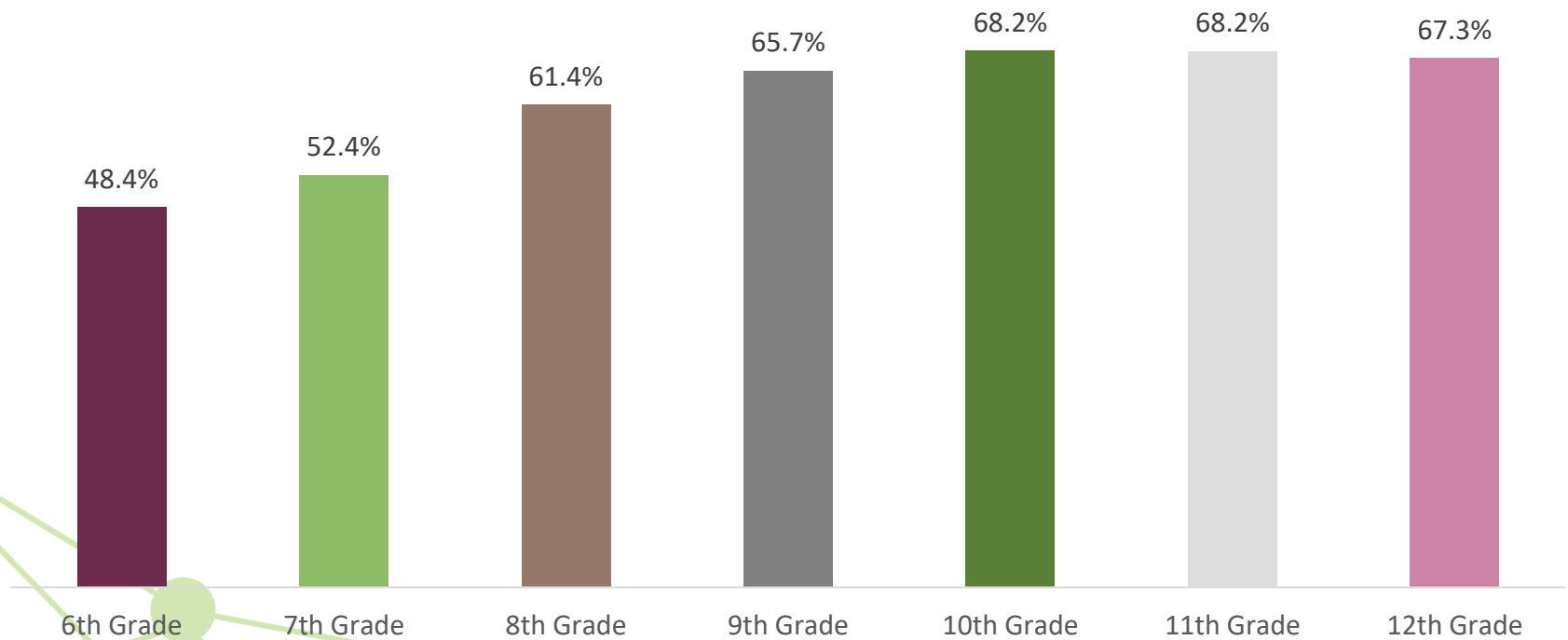

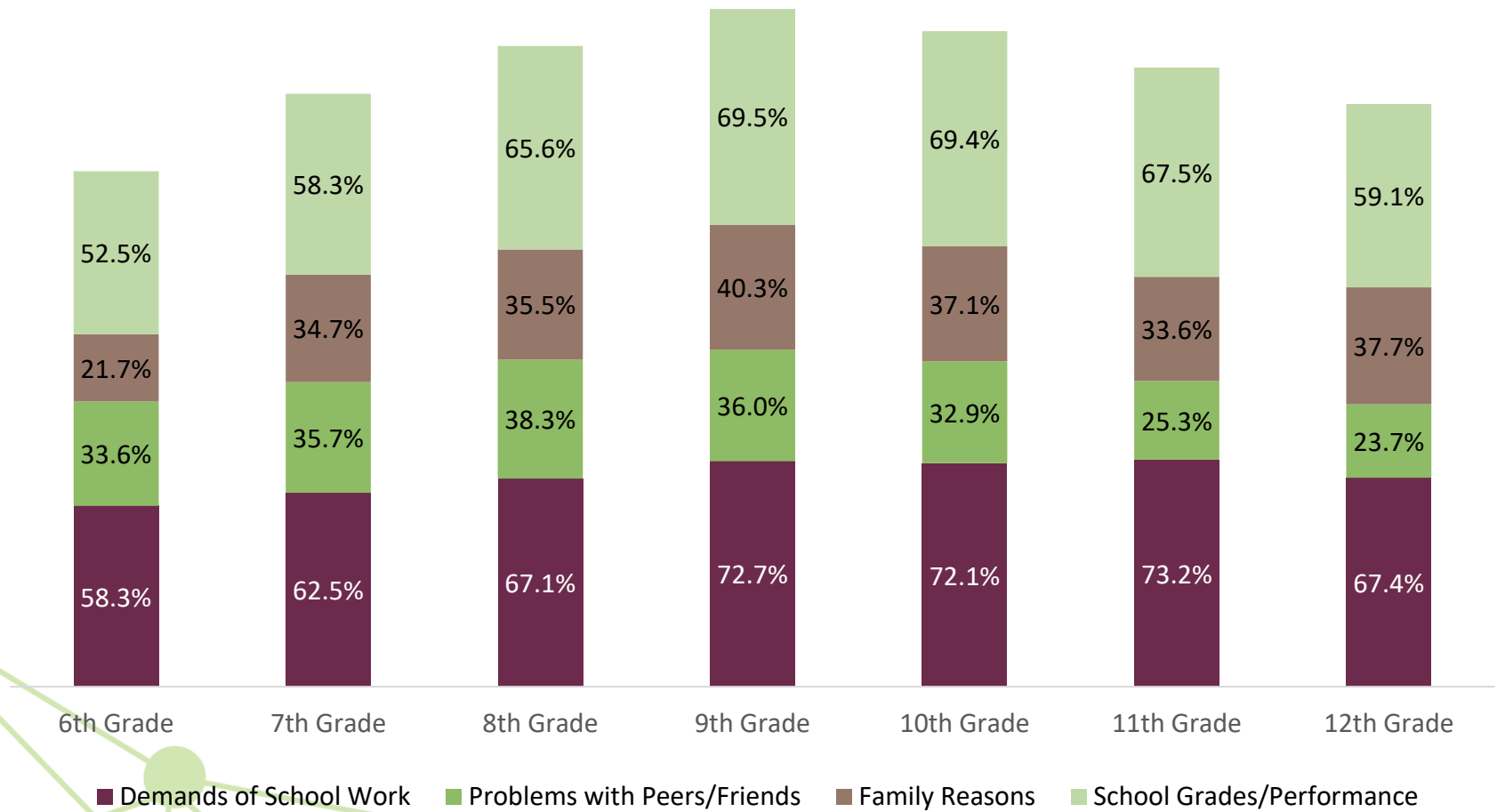
Carroll County – How often do you feel stressed?

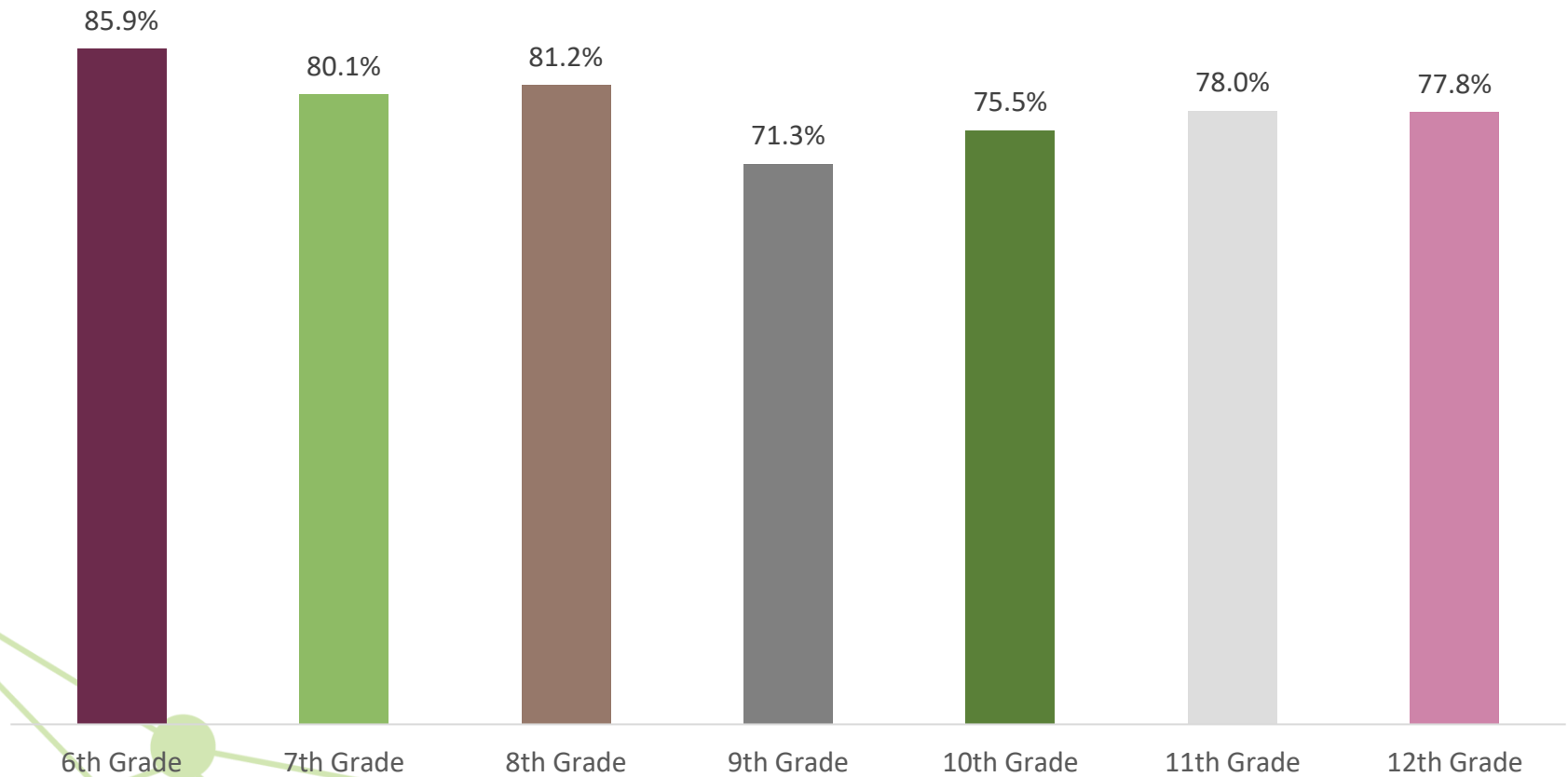
Carroll County – What causes you stress?

Youth Thrive – Protective Factors

Youth Resilience:

Managing stress and functioning well when faced with stress, challenges, or adversity.

Social Connections:

Having healthy, sustained relationships with people, places, communities, and a force greater than oneself that promote a sense of trust, belonging, and that one matters.

Knowledge of Adolescent Development:

Understanding the unique changes and assets of adolescence and implementing policies and practices that reflect a deep understanding of development.

Concrete Support:

Making sure youth receive quality, equitable, respectful services that meet their basic needs (health care, housing, education, nutrition, income), and teaching youth to ask for help and advocate for themselves.

Cognitive and Social-Emotional Competence:

Acquiring skills and attitudes that are essential for forming an independent, positive identity and having a productive and satisfying adulthood.

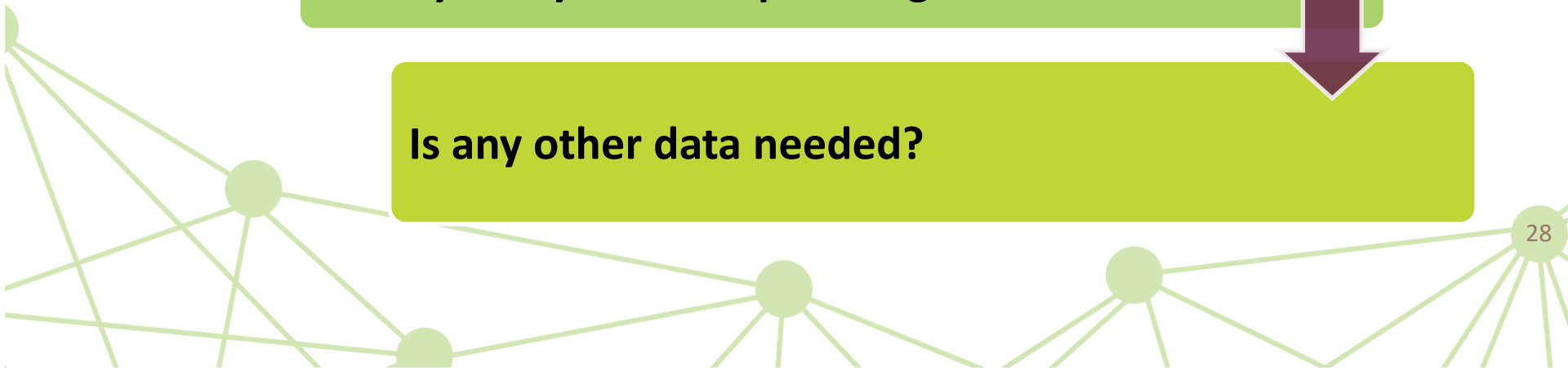

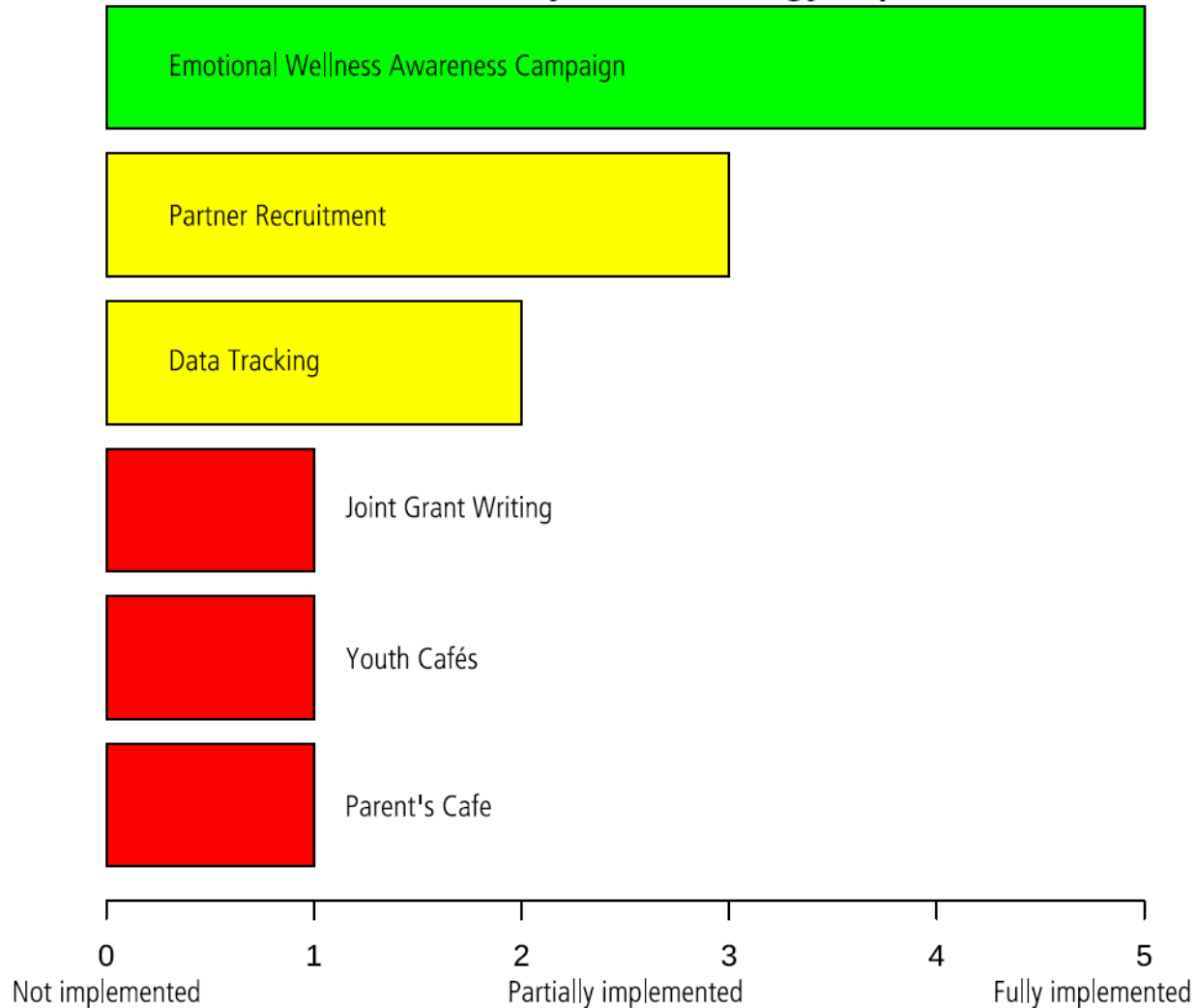

Activities for the Improve Emotional Wellbeing strategy

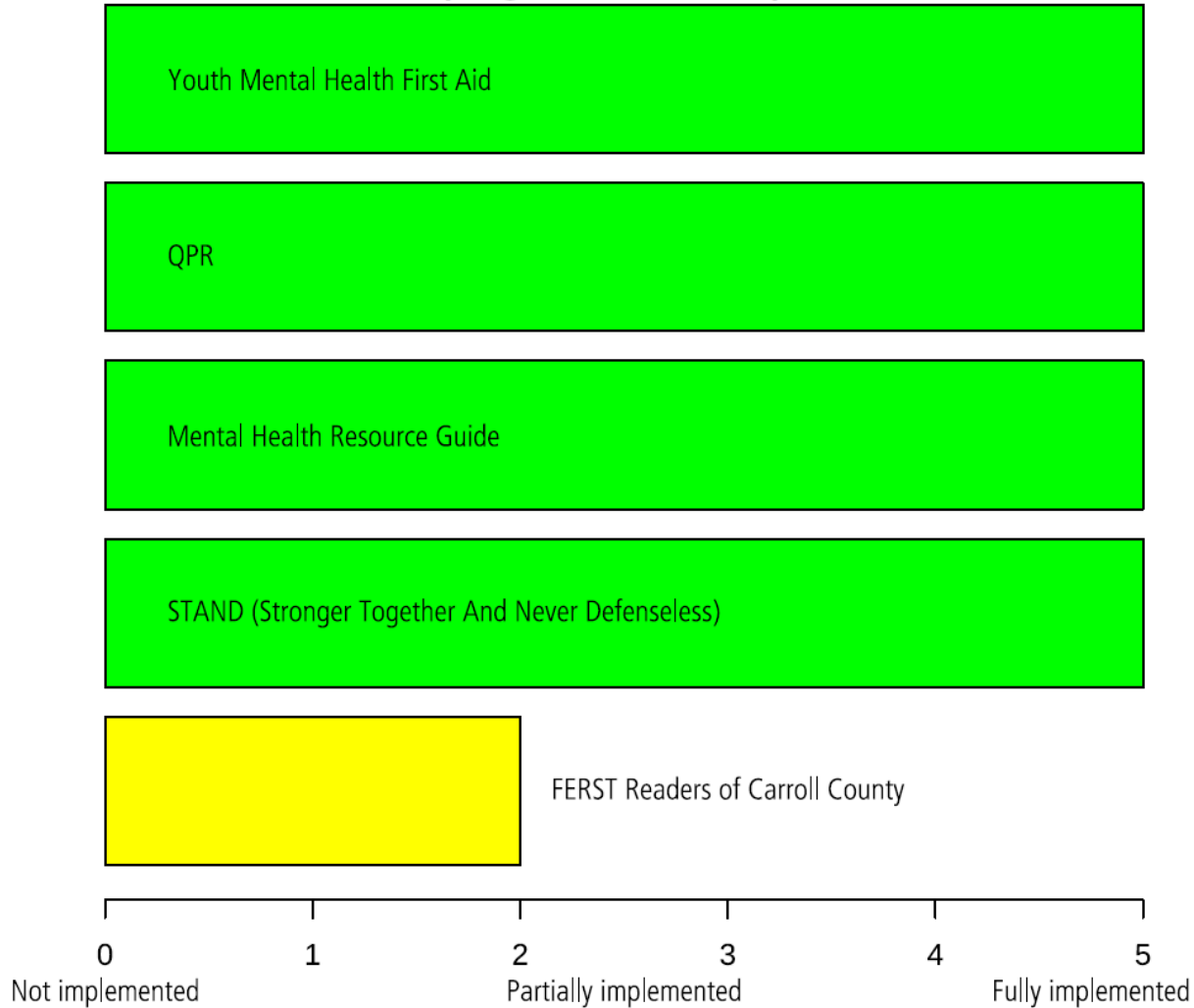
To what extent was each activity in the strategy implemented?

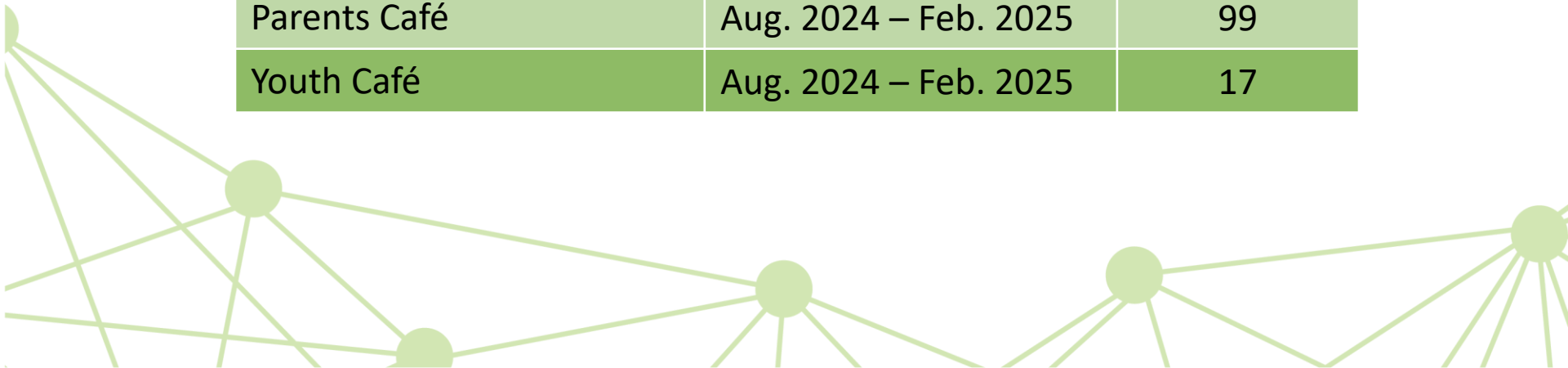
Programs/Services for the Improve Emotional Wellbeing strategy

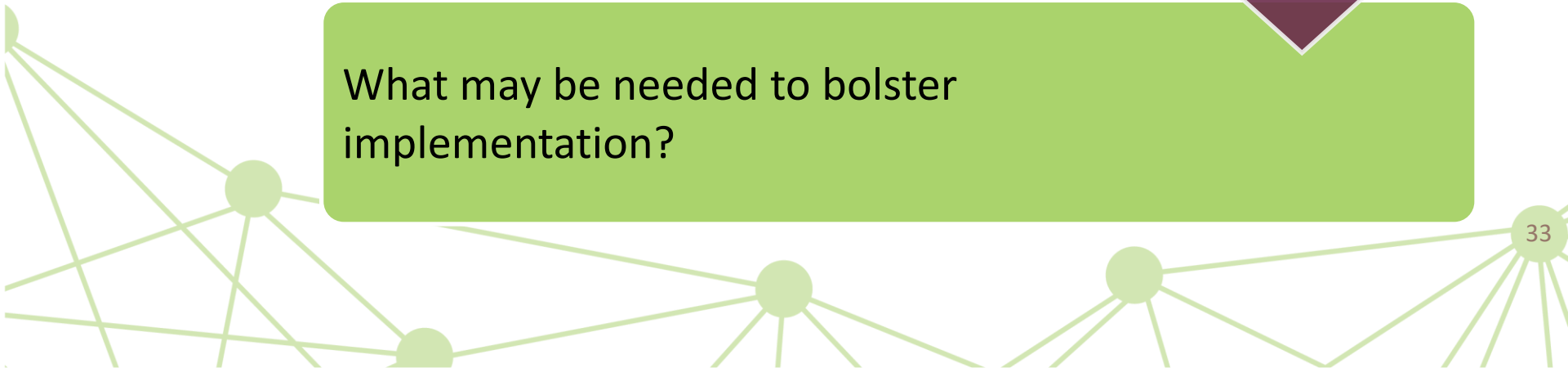

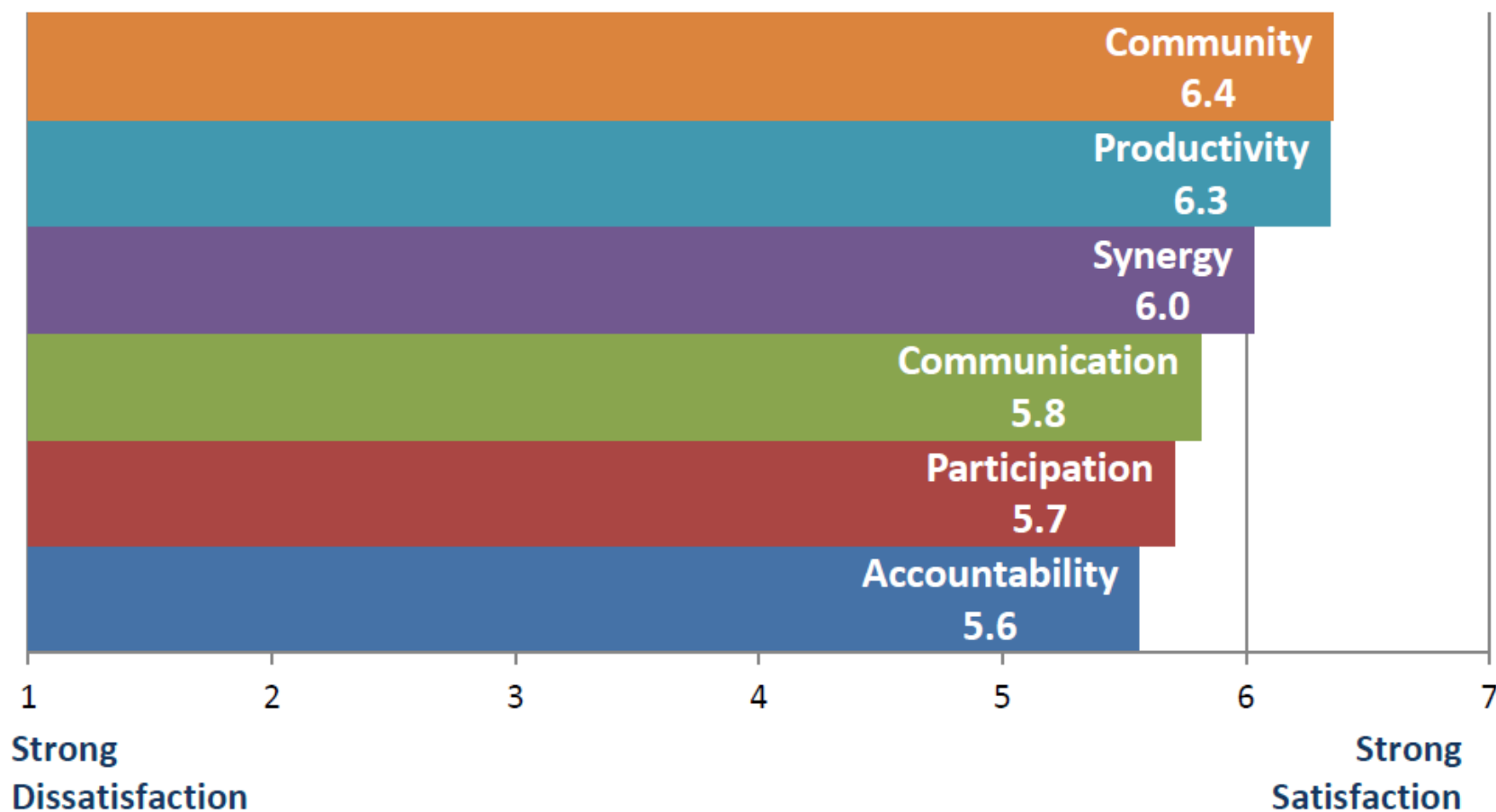

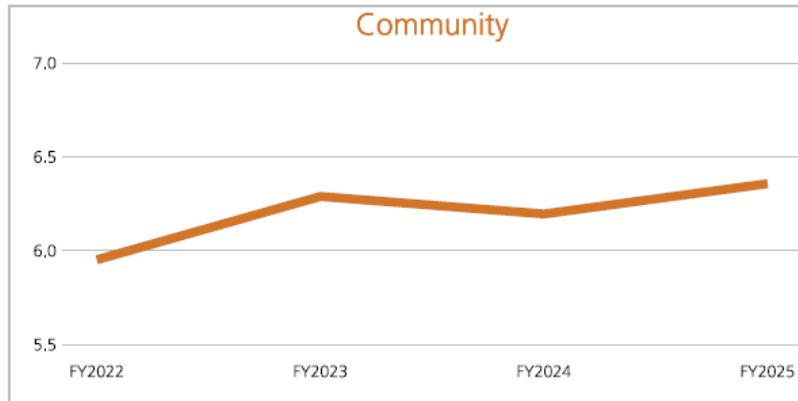
Fiscal Year 2025 Collaborative Vitality Survey Findings

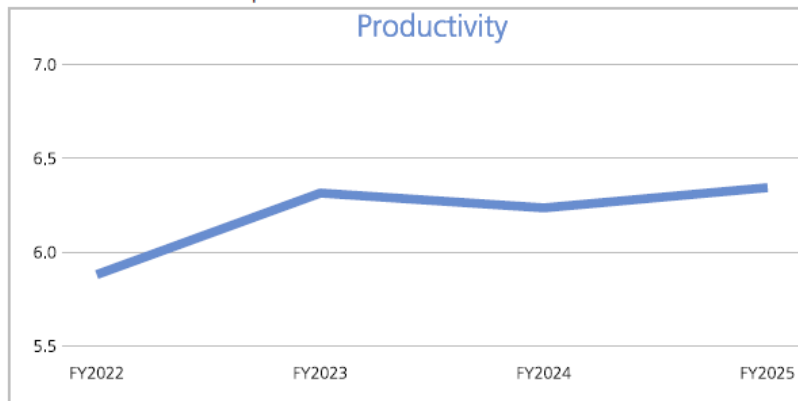




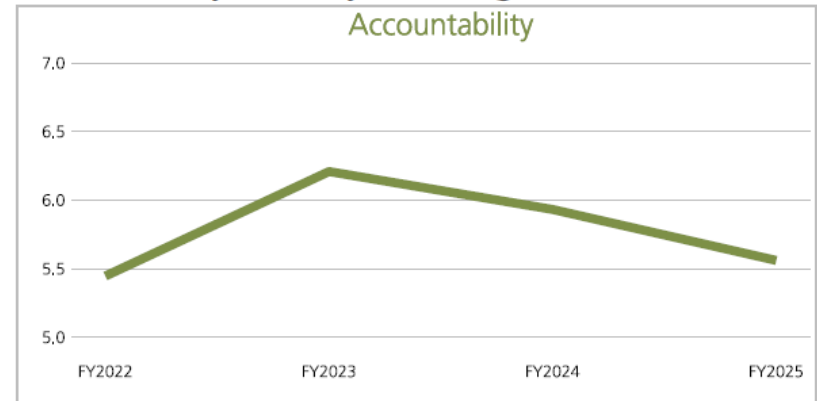
Fiscal Year 2025 Collaborative Vitality Survey Findings



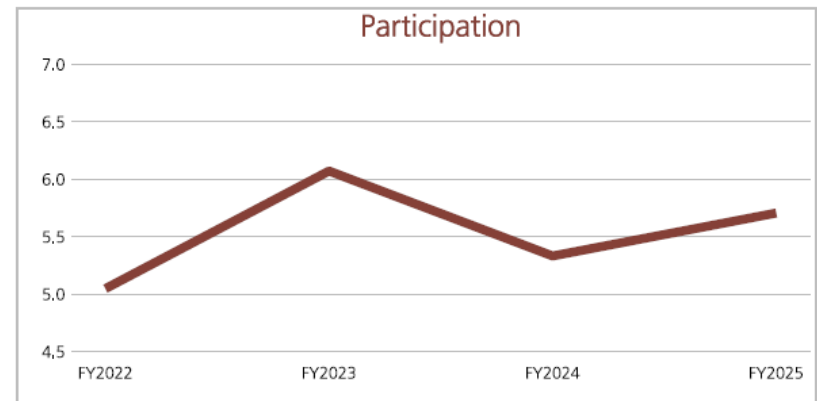
Community: Sense of community within the collaborative. For example, resources are shared, there is pride in collaborative accomplishments, members rely on one another, and there is mutual respect and commitment.



Productivity: Sense of the collaborative's productivity. For example, meetings are effective, activities are goal oriented, and there is ample activity and energy.



Accountability: Sense of the collaborative holding itself accountable. For example, evidence-based practices are used, evaluation findings are used, and the collaborative budget is understood.



Participation: Sense of who is involved in the collaborative. For example, membership is influential and broad, including family member involvement.
