Joining together with members of the Friends of the One-Room School at the celebration luncheon were representatives of Christ Church, Calvert County Public Schools, Friends of the Old Wallville School, members of the Calvert Retired School Personnel Association, Maryland state and local officials and delegates, and members of the One-Room School Committee.

Elaine Dunkle received a certificate for her forward thinking and determination that brought the restoration of the One-Room Schoolhouse to completion during the 1976 Bicentennial Celebration.

Boy Scout Brian Stroh and his parents were in attendance. Brian received special recognition for the project he undertook in working toward attaining the rank of Eagle Scout. His project provided for the replacement of the Humpback Bridge on the Seven Bridges Trail that follows the boundaries of Christ Episcopal Church. Photos taken of the various stages of the project were incorporated into a DVD slide show for all to watch and enjoy.

Carma Latvala, invited guest speaker for the Luncheon, helped us to think of special memories from our own unique school days, then shared vignettes from her one-room school experiences in rural Idaho. Dr. Latvala is a retired administrator and educator, now a professor at McDaniel College in Westminster, Maryland. She regaled us with stories of riding to school in the deep and blinding snows and of an April Fool's prank where the girls bested both the teacher and the boys, convincing us of a deep mischievous streak.

All those in attendance at the Celebration Luncheon affirmed that Calvert County is richer for having this authentic resource for the community and its children. We thank all who contributed to making 2009-2010 a highly successful year.

Under the guidance of the Service Learning Coordinator, Calvert County Public School 4th graders were given the task of collecting "pennies" for Port Republic School #7. Penny jars cropped up all over the elementary schools as the campaign began. A kindergarten student asked, "Would it be okay if I put a dime in the penny jar?" "Of course," was the teacher's response, "a dime is worth 10 pennies." Monies were collected, sorted, counted up, deposited, and delivered to our school. This year, the school system collected a whopping \$2,609.78!

The funds will help us to defray the costs of repairing the railing and pickets on the schoolhouse's hand rail. The wood had started to rot and needed to be replaced. Thank you so much for your donation!

We are so pleased to offer this field trip to Calvert County 4th graders. The students get to experience what schooling was like in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. It is truly a living history lesson. And through this Service Learning Project students understand and appreciate the importance of helping to preserve our local historical sites.

"The One-Room Schoolhouse Still Teaches" Scout Leads Replacement of Humpback Bridge

The Trail of Seven Bridges affords visiting 4th grade students the chance to experience a walk through the woods that is reminiscent of the journey taken to get to school by those who lived in the area served by the Port Republic School #7.

Schools throughout Maryland were situated so that most children of the families they served would not have to walk more than three miles each way. Currently our trail is approximately 1.25 miles. It includes part of an old rolling road, used by farmers rolling hogsheads of tobacco to the docks at Port Republic; a section of the raised bed built by hand and intended for the tracks of the never-completed Drum Point to Baltimore Railroad; as well as a meandering stream, wetlands, woodlands, a field where tobacco likely was grown by families in the area and the field used by the historic Christ Church Jousting Tournament each August. Lessons of history, biology, ecology, and culture are integral parts of the trail walk.

Just this Spring a bridge replacement improved the safety of the trail. This project was one of many over more than 20 years that have been carried out by Boy Scouts in fulfilment of the requirements for the Eagle Scout rank. This project was led by Brian Stroh.

Today's students are struck by the quiet, the stillness, and the feeling of being totally in touch with nature in a very special place. Often we hear the comment "This is awesome."

On a recent spring visit, our trail guide heard a student remark "this is so peaceful." The accompanying classroom teacher overheard and asked which of their vocabulary words would express the feeling. "Serene" quickly came an answer– a teachable moment captured perfectly.
