Where Can I Have A Fire?



Campfires are allowed in fire rings and grills at developed campgrounds and picnic areas.

If you have a CA Campfire permit (link below) you may also have a campfire in the following areas:

a) within 10 feet of Shasta Lake, Trinity Lake,& Iron Canyon Reservoir, provided that the area is at least 50 feet from any vegetation.

b) within the Yolla Bolly-Middle Eel,
Chanchelulla and Castle Crags Wilderness
Areas.

c) within the Trinity Alps Wilderness Area, except within the Canyon Creek and Stuart Fork Watershed Prohibition Area or the Alpine Lake Watershed Prohibition Area.

The sites where you can no longer have a campfire are previous years' fire safe sites and dispersed camping areas.

Consider alternatives to campfires, such as pressurized gas stoves and lanterns with shut-off valves.
