

Annual Percent Job Change Benchmark Number Five ECONOMY

- Between the years 2000 2020, Norman added 11,288 jobs, an increase of 22.6%, or 1.13% annually. This rate was 15% slower than that of the Oklahoma City MSA (1.30%) and 7.1% slower than the state of Oklahoma (1.21%).
- Since 2000, for every 100 new residents that have moved to Norman, 36 new jobs have been created locally.








Free and Reduced Lunch Benchmark Number Sixteen EDUCATION







