It was a very busy and successful day for both NHS and UNISON on the recruitment front. There were over 20 people interviewed on the day. The East and Midlothian team managed to recruit some new members and give additional information on the trade union movement and all the benefits of being in a union and most importantly the benefits of being in the largest trade union in Scotland - UNISON.

UNISON Shop Stewards Carolyn Casey and Sharon Jamieson spent some time at DRUM Riding for the Disabled this afternoon. They were there to present the centre with over £1800 as the Branch's chosen charity this year. The money was raised at the branch AGM in February, so a huge thanks to all those who donated.

removal of this service.


#### Band 2 to Band 3 CSW Campaign

The Branch launched a campaign just over two years ago now to have our hard-working Support Workers financially recognised for their clinical skills. Unison successfully negotiated a move from band 2 to band 3 for Support Workers who undertook clinical tasks. This saw 85% of all band 2 Support Workers in NHS Lothian move to band 3. This was back-dated to October 2021 and by October 2023 all were on the top of the pay scale. The Branch then negotiated the same agreement for Support Workers on the Staff Bank. We are nearly at the end of the up-bandings for Bank staff and again has seen 85% of them move to band 3. It has been a long and stressful process for our members but has seen a long overdue and well deserved £2000 uplift in their pay. We are now pursuing a similar deal for our other members undertaking clinical roles so watch this space!
