Byrd, who remained conscious for much of his ordeal, was killed about halfway through the dragging when his body hit the edge of a culvert, severing his right arm and head. The murderers drove on for another 1 1/2 miles (2.4 km) before dumping Byrd's torso in front of a black cemetery in Jasper. [WIKIPEDIA]
