






Remembering

A few of Minnie's other accomplishmens are: 8th overall at AKC Agility National, 8th overall in the Finals of AKC's Agility Invitational, making the semi-finals in the USDAA Nationals. Minnie understood the game of agility and while not the fastest, she was the smartest, most efficient teammate one could hope for qualifying over 95% of the time.

At home and in the office, Minnie was Sylvia's constant companion greeting clients, providing company and security day and late at night. She brought joy and shared it with everyone. She went with dignity and class just like she behaved every day of her life. We held her and stroked her with her BC friends Charlie, JD and Soo nearby.

Additional nominations may be made by the CDCA membership. All additional nominations shall be submitted to the Corresponding Secretary and must be received by June 1, 2017, as outlined in Article IV, Section 4 (b) of the Constitution (below). Potential CDCA Officers and Board of Director nominees should review the Constitution (Article III) to understand the requirements and expectations for an Officer or Board member.

Article IV, Section 4:

- (b) Additional nominations of persons who meet the residence requirements of ARTICLE III, SECTION 2, may be made by written petition addressed to the Corresponding Secretary at his regular address and postmarked on or before June 1, signed by five Full members in good standing and accompanied by the written acceptance of each such additional nominee signifying his willingness to be a candidate. No person shall be a candidate for more than one office.
- (c) If no valid additional nominations are postmarked on or before June 1, the Nominating Committee's slate shall be declared elected and no balloting will be required.

If additional valid nominations are received, a ballot will be submitted to each eligible member in good standing on or before June 15, 2017 as outlined in Article IV, Section 4 (d) of the Constitution (below).

(d) If one or more additional nominations are postmarked on or before June 1 of an election year, the Corresponding Secretary shall, on or before June 15 mail to each eligible member in good standing a ballot listing candidates for each of the 5 offices in alphabetical order. Candidates for Director shall be listed by sections of the country and in alphabetical order within each section....

Register Of Merit and Versatility

HAVE A DOG OR BITCH ELIGIBLE FOR REGISTER OF MERIT OR VERSATILITY AWARD?

Canaans that have sired or produced litters with breed champions and/or versatility titled offspring may be eligible for the various Register of Merit (ROM) awards. Those Canaans who have titled in breed and/or performance events may be eligible for the Versatility awards. Dogs both living and deceased are eligible for ROM and Versatility awards.

Eligibility requirements and forms are on the CDCA website (www.cdca.org) in the Programs menu. If any of your dogs are eligible for any of these awards, please fill out the form(s) and either send them via email or postal service with copies of required certifications to Denise Gordon; for CDCA herding titles, send date of certification only.



Forms must reach Denise's home no later than August 1, 2017. Award plaques will be presented at the 2017 National Specialty awards banquet in Atlanta, Georgia. Those plaques not picked up at the awards banquet will be mailed to the recipient after the National Specialty.



Viewpoints From Fellow Members Show Report—Crufts 2017

Crufts 2017 was certainly a memorable one for me. We had the largest foreign entry in Canaan Dogs todate - 8 of the 16 entries. Six came from France and 2 came from Israel. Additionally 4 of the foreign dogs were Israeli champions. As usual for the Canaans it was a very long day with 67 Schnauzers and 94

Keeshonds scheduled in the ring before us with a late start of 10:00 am to boot (almost every other ring had a 9:00 am start). After what seemed an interminable wait, around 4:00 pm it was suddenly announced that Canaan Dogs would be shown in ring 3 in 5 minutes instead of ring 1, as Keeshonds were still being judged. We still had dogs and owners manning the Discover Dogs booth (like your Meet the Breeds) as we had been told it would be another hour before we would be judged, so they and their dogs had to literally run to get to the ring on time. Anyone who has been to Crufts can affirm that it is quite a distance through loads of trade stands and crowds of people from Hall 3, where Discover Dogs is held, to Hall 1 where we were being shown. As Canaan Dogs are classified as a Rare Breed in the UK - similar to the Miscellaneous status given to Canaans prior to full AKC recognition – it seems we are treated as second-class citizens which does raise my ire.



Our judge, Dr. Sarah Hemstock, grew up with dogs as her parents had the well-known Staffie Kennel, 'Jolihem'. She is also no stranger to Canaan Dogs as her mother, Jo, was the second Treasurer of the Canaan Dog Club of the United Kingdom and remained so until she became too ill with cancer to continue. Sarah also became a club member and remained a member, and also a committee member, for a number of years until her work took her to the South Pacific. She has been living in Fiji for some time now. Dr. Hemstock was delighted with her entry and enjoyed her judging assignment very much. She awarded **Best Dog & Best of Opposite Sex** to my 17-month old Caiser Samorodok at Anacan (Imp Pol). **Reserve Best Dog** went to Martin Moulding's Anacan Abu Ghosh ('Moshe'). **Best Bitch & Best of Breed** was my Anacan Talia My Treasure ('Astor') and **Reserve Best Bitch** went to Laurence Aries' Nizzana Romoth Asya. **Best Puppy** was the 10-mo. old bitch, 'Rubi' (Torefjell's Rubin, Imp Nor), owned by Martin Moulding. Dr. Hemstock presented the BOB, BOS & BP with gorgeous inlaid wooden bowls she had brought with her from Fiji, and they will be cherished mementos of a great day.

We had not long been finished being judged when a Kennel Club representative came looking for the Best of Breed to take them to the hall where the group would be judged. Despite being rushed from the breed ring to the collecting ring by the KC official, Richard and 'Astor' looked very calm and collected the big ring and we had a number of people tell us 'Astor' showed beautifully and represented the breed well. Canaan Dogs are show in the Utility Group here (not dissimilar in make-up to your Non-Sporting Group) and you can view Richard and Astor in the group ring on youtube https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cYzeOni1eM at 11 minutes in.

Crufts Critiques. 10th March 2017

Judge: Dr Sarah Louise Hemstock (Jolihem)

It was a great honour for me to judge this breed at Crufts and I would like to thank all exhibiters for their support and sportsmanship – it's great to see that the interest in this wonderful breed is passionate and dedicated with just over a third of the entry coming from overseas. I would also like to take this opportunity to make some general comments about the overall entry. On the whole: temperaments were as they should be; tail set and carriage was acceptable in all exhibits; the dogs were handled well and presented in good condition; and were, in fact, a credit to their owners. I found no bad mouths or undesirable colours, and coats were correct although some were a little too long and profuse in outercoat for my personal liking. However, one issue that I hope breeders will note is that I found a couple of exhibits light in bone, to the point that they generally appeared fragile as opposed to "strong and square" - with medium bone as required by the breed standard. On a more positive note, it was nice to see an entry with an agreeable divergence of type and colour and I was very pleased with the overall soundness of construction and movement of my winners. I like my Canaan Dog's to look as if they exist without the hand of human intervention and I am very happy to say that, although the breed is small in number, it has avoided exaggerations and remains healthy and fit for purpose. This is to the credit of the dedicated efforts of the breeds custodians.

2nd Aries' HATIKVA SWEET LAND OF LIBERTY [ATC AT01218USA]. Smart and upstanding black of 16 months in good fettle. Plenty of breed type, he fitted the standard well. Excellent head with typical expression. Excellent forequarters. Good depth of brisket with decent spring of rib. Correct topline –

when standing and on the move. Well defined hindquarters. Balanced angulations, moved freely and energetically. Handled well.

Post Graduate - Dog (Entries: 2, Abs: 0) **1st** Moulding's ANACAN ABU GHOSH. Attractively marked, strong, square and well-knit black and white of 4 years. Plenty of breed type, definitely masculine. Excellent head. Dark almond eye with typical expression. Very sound with nothing exaggerated. Correct forequarters, good depth of brisket with correct spring of rib. Level topline whilst standing and on the move,

Correct hindquarters, strong and well-muscled. Balanced and sound movement, but not the drive of 1st. Handled expertly.

3rd Hughes' ANACAN FUTURE LEGEND. Sound, strong and square. White and sand-brown, almost 11 years in first rate coat and stunning condition. Well-proportioned and symmetrical, very sound and standard in all departments. Correct head and skull, typical expression. Good forequarters, shoulders well-laid and muscular, forelegs parallel with correct amount of bone and sloping pasterns. Well-knit with level topline, good spring of rib. Strong hindquarters, correct bend of stifle. Balanced angulations – moved freely. Handled well.






Reminder: CDCA Policy - AKC Outstanding Sportsmanship Award

Per AKC "The AKC provides member clubs the ability to award AKC Outstanding Sportsmanship Awards on a yearly basis. This award honors those individuals who deserve special recognition that have made a difference in the sport of purebred dogs, embodied the AKC Code of Sportsmanship, and have been an active and valued member of an AKC member club. Medallions are awarded solely at the club's discretion." Club's are under no obligation to present this award.

The CDCA Board of Directors feels that the AKC Outstanding Sportsmanship Award should not be an award given out "just because we can," but instead should only be awarded after a thoughtful and deliberative process. CDCA Members are encouraged to suggest members who they feel should be so honored. The Board of Directors shall have final decision over which members are chosen to receive this award.

When a recipient has been selected, this information shall not be shared beyond the Board of Directors and the Delegate. The Delegate will inform AKC of the need for a medallion and coordinate engraving of this medallion. A presentation of this award will be made during the next Annual General Meeting of the club.



The Economic Benefits of Dog Shows

According to American Kennel Club a dog event may contribute \$1.5 million dollars in to a local economy in a larger four day show weekend. Smaller events put several hundred thousand dollars into a local economy. Annually, in Virginia, there are over 100 AKC sanctioned events of varying sizes. These events include conformation, obedience, rally, agility, herding, lure coursing, field trails, etc. How do dog events benefit the economy?



If you own property capable of hosting dog events, you get rental money. I have been to events at Oatlands Plantation, Keepstone Farm, Fredericksburg Expo Center, Prince William County Fairgrounds, Dude Ranch Pet Resort, Rockingham County Fairgrounds, Salem Civic Center, etc. Many events have food trucks and vendors. I have seen everything from dog supplies to massage therapist booths and displays for gutter systems, local hospitals, etc. If you are a vendor who could rent space to set up at a dog show, you get patrons who buy things. Stand in the middle of a dog show and look on the surface how many businesses benefit from our events. But wait! There's more! Where do out of town exhibitors and judges stay? HOTELS! Oh the printers who do the catalogs and premium (entry) forms, the awards companies who make the ribbons and other awards earned will benefit. Hey, let's not forget the places vendors get their products to sell or supplies to make items to sell!

It takes time and preparation for a dog to get ready for any type of dog event. Long before a dog event of any form happens, dog shows contribute to the economy: supplies, handling classes, equipment, clothing (everything from suits to cold weather gear), supplements, classes to learn different sports, etc. Trainers for various things from puppy socializing to nose work get clients. In a couple weekends my daughter will be attending a handling seminar weekend. The rented facility, caterers for meals, local hotels, etc., will benefit from people preparing for events by attending the seminar. I have started teaching private show handling lessons. Those places I suggest for purchasing supplies benefit.

What about all the other things we consume while heading to a dog show: Coffee, donuts, fast food, gas for our vehicles. Think of the sales tax and meals taxes, parking fees and other things we pay for that we would not do if not for dog events?

A few weeks ago there was a five day dog show cluster with three different competitions at the Fredericksburg Expo Center. In the next months there will be many upcoming events in Virginia. People from all over the region and out of state will attend. If not for the event, we would not be in the region: we would not be renting facilities, hotel rooms, buying supplies, going to classes, etc. If not for the event, we would not be spending our money in your area.

It is becoming increasingly difficult in many areas to exhibit and compete with animals. Animal rights activists are trying to shut everything down. Ask yourself: if we shut down dog (or any animal) events, how will this affect my community? Support your local dog event – support your local economy!


