11/20/2017—Jennifer Rinaldi membership and Travis Schrader membership were approved.

12/14/2017—Membership Chair, Amy Preston, reports that renewals are coming in at a much better rate than in previous years.

12/20/2017—Event applications for the 2018 Canaan Dog Club of America National Specialty and Designated Specialty were submitted to the American Kennel Club for Approval.

Report - Desert Bred Canaan Dog Registry Committee

A quick update: the committee is still discussing the best form for such a registry to take. Recent information seen online in the international Canaan Dogs Facebook group, in rescue retail imports to the US and the UK, and elsewhere on the Internet, indicate that Middle Eastern retailers increasingly view the 'Canaan Dog' designation as a marketing gimmick for native crossbred dogs. Other posts indicate pure desert bred Salukis are also at risk as poor quality animals are apparently being bred specifically for retail sale outside the Middle East. The Canaan Dog Rescue Network has experienced a strong uptick in monthly requests from the public for help rehoming 'Canaan Dog' and 'crossbred Canaan Dog' imports. This is cause for concern.

I believe the past year has seen two important revelations:

- 1. An increase in Middle East imports of crossbred street dogs and foundlings marketed to US and European buyers as 'Canaan Dogs' or CD crosses has become nearly mainstream through groups such as 'Wings of Rescue' and its' associates. Hundreds are imported each year to both the Western and Eastern US coasts by Middle Eastern retail rescue organizations working with their stateside counterparts.
- 2. Saluki breeders report seeing a noticeable increase in dogs bred by city dwellers for the export market, with little to no regard for quality or pure breeding. If they've done it for Salukis (and per documents and other posts found online, they have), they will probably soon do so for Canaani as well if they haven't already started. Several weeks ago, I was contacted by a veterinary student in Sweden seeking information on the DBCDR; she was referred to me by Myrna Shiboleth. It appears that there is increasing interest worldwide in how the North American gene pool for the breed can be augmented through the creation of such a registry.

Breeder Referral Status Report, as prepared for the 2017 annual meetings

Breeder Referral Committee Description/Mission:

- •Maintain a file of qualified Breeders, insure that their applications are keep current and that they meet CDCA qualifications.
- •Track the CDCA Breeder's "puppy statuses". The "puppy status" is the tracking of the status from breeding through whelping.
- •Track the CDCA Breeder's older puppy and dog statuses. This keeps track of any older puppies, adolescents and adult dogs that need placing.
- •Publish the CDCA Breeders' List which includes puppy/ dog status (for inclusion in the CDCA information package).
- •Keep the Web Chair informed of all updated information for the web Breeders' List.
- •Publish the Canaan Dog information package, insure that the information remains current.
- •Keep a file of persons qualified to be on the Meet and Greet list.
- •Keep the Web Chair informed of all updated information for the web Meet and Greet List.
- •Publish the Meet and Greet list (for inclusion in the CDCA information package).
- •Answer inquires, via e-mail and phone, from people seeking information on Canaan Dogs, Breeders and their puppy/dog status.
- •Mail out information packages to potential puppy buyers.

Committee Member: Sally Armstrong, Chair, in charge of keeping all of the files, information gathering, answering e-mail inquiries, publishing and sending out packages, fielding the phone call inquires and other sundry things.

In 2013 a committee was formed to update the information package. Thanks to Carrie Cabrera taking the lead on the project, the package was updated. I now have a copy on my computer from which I can make hard copies to send out when requested or send via email. All of this saves the club money and gets the information out faster. I am still getting a trickle of people that request a hard copy and we are still receiving phone calls from people that have additional questions, but appreciate that it has significantly reduced the work load. or a dog at stud that has produced a litter within the last two years from the latest update of the Breeders' List. The Breeders' List was developed for people seeking puppies, and to direct people to breeders that are <u>actively</u> breeding.

A second list is available for breeders that have not met the Breeders' List requirements that would like to remain as contacts, as well as non-breeding owners that would like to be a contact. This list, referred to as the "Meet and Greet" list, is a program composed of people that would be willing to have people visit their homes in order to meet Canaan Dogs in the flesh and answer questions about Canaan Dogs. The CDCA Board, Breeders and Members need to do more to generate interest in this program. For breeders, this program can go a long way to introduce more potential puppy buyers to the breed and give the breeders an avenue to learning more about potential buyers that do not live close-by. It will also help buyers determine if the Canaan Dog is the breed for them. All puppies are cute, it is the adult dog that you live with for many years, and the Canaan Dog is not the breed for everyone. For Members, the willingness to participate in the Meet and Greet program is an avenue to become more involved in the positive promotion of the Canaan Dog. The Meet and Greet program was approved by the Board in 2006 and an application is available on the web site.

Once you obtain board approval to be on the Breeders' List you can move back and forth between the Breeders' List and the Meet and Greet List as your situation dictates. This way if you have not produced a litter within the last two years you can still actively introduce potential puppy buyers to the breed and jump back on the Breeders' List as soon as a breeding is planned. If you are approved to be on the Meet and Greet list first and you need to move over to the Breeders' List, you must first obtain board approval.

For our new members, I would like to introduce a couple of documents that are available for sale. The Breeders Guide was developed as a guideline "for the preparation, breeding and follow-up care of the Canaan Dog dam, sire and puppies." Its information is an invaluable primer for the first-time breeder as well as a refresher for the occasional breeder. It highlights everything from necessary health tests for the sire and dam, breeding procedures, care of the pregnant bitch, whelping, raising pups, placing puppies, contract examples and much more. This Breeders Guide is \$12.00 plus \$2.00 s&h.

The committee also has the Breeders Reference Guide available. It contains photographs of, and invaluable information on, most of the foundation dogs found in Canaan Dog pedigrees. It originally sold for \$50 but was reduced to \$30 plus \$3.00 s&h.

Both documents are always available from the Breeder Referral Chair. Send your request along with your check made payable to CDCA to Sally Armstrong, 2300 Crossover Road, Reno, NV 89510-9354.

This committee is organized, runs smoothly and has filled a need for many years. Generating more interest in the Meet and Greet program continues to be of great importance. This will serve the best interests of all Canaan Dog fanciers

HEALTH, As prepared for the 2017 Annual Meeting

Overall we still seem to be doing well on the health front, but I would like to see us gather more hard data. We are working toward this goal.

I pushed hard for participation in the DNA Repository a year ago, but the numbers reflect that I was unsuccessful in convincing the importance of this. We will not be included in health studies if the DNA is not available. One of my dogs was selected for a thyroid study. Please consider doing this at your next vet visit. The form and instructions are on the OFA site.

We may consider blood draws at a future specialty.

Meet the Breeds at the 2017 AKC National Championship

Around 200,000 Canaan Dogs could comfortably fit into the cavernous Orlando-Orange County Convention Center, home of the 2017 AKC National Championship. But since the other 199,996 Canaan Dogs were unavailable, Roy, Salina, Anni, and Avi had to work extra hard at the two-day Meet the Breeds event held in conjunction with the Championship. After all, there were over 160 other breeds represented on December 16 and 17, so they had to demonstrate to the thousands of visitors the qualities that make Canaan Dogs so special. This year the CDCA had a prime corner booth, outfitted with LED-illuminated banners of desert scenes, tomb paintings, and famous and loved Canaans, as well as a fancy digital picture frame scrolling photos submitted by club members. But the stars of the show—what the crowds really wanted to see—

were the dogs themselves. Ably assisted by Keith and Cheryl Shank, Bryna Comsky, Richard Vulliet, and David Golden, Roy and Salina were the hardest workers, spending hours greeting the public from their faux-fur-covered dais as the humans explained the breed's incredible history. Anni periodically relieved Salina, while keeping a watchful eye on Roy who really wanted to be her friend. And Avi made an appearance on Sunday after slacking off the previous day at the spa.

Many of the visitors to the booth were thrilled to finally meet real, live Canaan Dogs. Even some of the 5,000+ exhibitors and competitors at the AKC Championship had never had that opportunity before. A few had seen Canaans in action and were so impressed that they asked for breeder referrals (dozens of CDCA brochures were distributed). Some quietly puzzled over the "Kelev Kna'ani" on the Beni Hasan tomb painting banner before asking (the giant "CANAAN DOG" sign and CDCA logo right above the banner didn't seem to help). And still others had never heard of the breed, but were drawn to the booth by the handsome dogs and stayed to hear some history. And what history. Just a month earlier a new archaeological report had been published showing ancient rock carvings in the Saudi desert of hunters with leashed dogs that the scientists said "resembled the modern breed of Canaan dogs." Only at the CDCA booth could people pet a 9000-year-old dog.

The attractive dogs also drew the attention of a film crew shooting short breed videos for the AKC's website. In addition to the canine glamor shots, the crew conducted a brief interview with some of the human crew, focusing on the breed and its fascinating history.

After two full days, greeting thousands of visitors, and walking miles back and forth across the convention center, the dogs were tired and the humans were exhausted and hoarse. But it was all worth it to show and tell so many people about the extraordinary Canaan Dog.

It's a dog-sport buffet!

Ever wonder if your Canaan Dog would enjoy agility? Or be good at nose work? He might be great at finding the rat hidden in a bale of hay. And she might have a special talent for dance!

There are so many dog-sports out there, where do you start?

You could start with a week at Mr Spot Dog Camp in Kingston, Ontario. With over twenty activities daily, participants can try everything from agility to flyball, rally obedience, tracking, tricks... and more! It's a great week for socialization, both for humans and canines.





Because of the variety of activities offered, if you (or your dog) don't enjoy one class, try another. The objective is to have fun, so if you prefer to skip class one afternoon and cross the road to Lake Ontario Park to watch the sailboats, that's OK too.

Classes run from after breakfast to right before dinner, Monday to Friday (3 in the morning and 3 in the afternoon – your choice of three or four activities per hour), with additional events scheduled in the evening. Classes are held in secure fenced areas. Dogs and owners stay in private rooms, with A/C, private bathroom and mini fridge. All meals are included. Once you've arrived for orientation Sunday, no need to drive until you leave Saturday morning.



ZIVA - THE GORILLA HUNTER

Ziva is placed on her bed using a **Down Hand Signal.** Mommy decides they should go looking for the rare, albino Gorilla that hides somewhere in the house. Mommy will help Ziva search (using both hand signals & verbal cues). After a **Touch command**, we start looking for the Gorilla in the living room with Ziva **Circling Right & Circling Left.** Mommy tells Ziva to **Get on a Platform (Up/table command)** by the window to look for the Gorilla. Ziva looks out the window but she doesn't see the Gorilla. Mommy gives Ziva another **Down Hand Signal** and then asks Ziva to put her **Head Down.** Mommy thinks maybe Ziva will feel the Gorilla's vibrations and locate the Gorilla that way. That doesn't seem to work, but then Mommy sees a treat the Gorilla must have dropped while running away to hide! Ziva waits on the platform while Mommy picks up the dropped treat. Mommy tells Ziva to get off the platform using **Touch command** and then tells her to Sit. Mommy decides that Ziva is probably hungry, so she **Balances the Treat on Ziva's nose**. Ziva must earn the treat by holding **still (7 seconds)** and is then told **OK to Flip & Eat the treat**.

While Ziva devours the treat, Mommy decides to go rest in the bedroom. Daddy realizes Ziva still needs Mommy's help in finding the Gorilla so he opens the bedroom door and tells Ziva to **Go Find Mommy (who is hidden from sight next to the bed).** Ziva searches and finds Mommy resting on the carpet. Ziva needs to wake Mommy – first with a **Kiss** and then by **Barking on Cue (both commands given by Mommy).** Ziva now knows Mommy is awake! Mommy sits up but is groggy. To get Mommy's full attention Ziva does a **Paws Up on Mommy's arm**. Mommy asks for a **Say Your Prayers (Advanced Handler's Choice)** and a **Sit Pretty**. Mommy decides to help Ziva look some more for the Gorilla.

Mommy knows they must hurry to find the Gorilla before it runs away and hides for good. They walk quickly through the house, searching as they go (camera off while moving to a different part of the house). Mommy uses a **Sit Hand Signal** and leaves Ziva on a wait while she walks down a long hall. Mommy tells Ziva to **Down with Hand Signal from 15 feet.**

Mommy spotted the Gorilla while they were running through the house. It is trying to make an escape and is hiding among a pile of toys by the front door! Ziva is told to Come Front (Intermediate Handler's Choice) and then Mommy points down another long hall and tells Ziva to go Get your Gorilla from a toy pile (AdvancedHandler's Choice). Ziva gets her Gorilla and brings it back to Mommy. Then they play Fetch & Give from 20 feet. Mommy throws the Gorilla to Ziva who Catches it. Ziva thanks Mommy for helping find her toy Gorillaby Barking (Speak command) and Shaking Hands (both paws). Mommy and Ziva both Bow to thank Daddy for manning the camera. Then Ziva Waves good-bye and Mommy waves good-bye.



AKC REUNITE AND THE THERIOGENOLOGY FOUNDATION JOIN FORCES TO SOLVE U.S. DETECTION DOG SHORTAGE

Organizations Help Launch the Working Dog Project at the Broad Institute of MIT and Harvard to Improve
Breeding of Military and Service Dogs

New York, NY— The need for explosive detection dogs and assistance dogs has never been greater. Unfortunately, only half of the dogs being trained for this work succeed.

The Working Dog Project is a unique opportunity to apply cutting edge genomics technology to investigate how genetic variation influences behavioral characteristics. By identifying the key genetic factors, breeders can strategically select better working dogs, thereby saving time, energy and dollars. Rarely has there been the opportunity to make such an impact for BOTH our national security and our disabled Americans.

AKC Reunite, the largest non-profit pet identification and recovery service provider in the United States, is donating \$150,000 to a joint project with the Theriogenology Foundation to sponsor research at the Broad Institute of MIT and Harvard for The Working Dog Project. The Theriogenology Foundation has made an initial donation of \$200,000 to fund the project.

The lack of supply of working dogs has become a pressing issue for the government and has a direct impact on national security. The demand for highly skilled animals is only growing and their availability is limited. Despite decades of pedigree analysis and focused breeding programs, the training success rate for service and working dogs hovers at approximately 50%; for high-performing scent dogs, success rates are even lower. This leads to significant issues including wasted training dollars, puppies pushed into roles in which they cannot succeed, unmet client needs, and, in the military, dogs that cannot fulfill the elite requirements to protect and serve.

"Working dogs are important partners to law enforcement, search and rescue, customs and border patrol, and our military. The incredible scenting ability of dogs makes them essential to explosive detection," said Alan Kalter, Chairman of AKC Reunite. "We are proud to join with the Theriogenology Foundation in supporting the work being done by the Broad Institute. This research will help breeders understand the genetics needed to produce working dogs that will be on the front lines."

Genetic tests focused on behavior or temperament would help solve the central challenge: accurate prediction at an early age of potential for successful training. They could help identify which dogs should be trained for particular jobs, and would support more successful breeding programs.

"AKC Reunite and veterinarians have long recognized the value of purpose-bred dogs as canine working partners that make our lives safer and more secure," added Dr. Anita Migday, President of the Theriogenology Foundation. "With this collaborative effort, we continue to merge science and breeding practices to produce world class working dog teams".

The Working Dog Project is part of a comprehensive program that engages working dog organizations, scientists and dog breeders. The project will focus on two key working dog behaviors: scenting and retrieving, and

will be the first step in leveraging the power of genomics to accelerate the breeding and training of successful working dogs.

"For years we have been diligently committed to supporting research aimed to unlock the genetic code of many physical diseases," noted Dr. Elinor Karlsson, principal investigator for The Working Dog Project. "Our current commitment is to examine the canine genome as critically for predicting behavior as we have for predicting disease."

Canaan Dog Club of America Code of Ethics

This code is established to protect and advance the interests of Canaan Dogs and to provide standards for responsible ownership and breeding practices.

All Members Shall:

- Appreciate the unique nature of the Canaan Dog and try to preserve its characteristics of type, temperament, and health as a natural dog.
- Abide by the Constitution and By-laws of the Canaan Dog Club of America (CDCA) and the rules of the American Kennel Club (AKC).
- Honestly represent the breed and their own dog(s). Not make false or misleading statements about another competitor and their dog(s) and bear responsibility for the truth and accuracy of any information and/or photographs submitted for publication.
- Display good sportsmanship and conduct, whether at home or at shows in such a manner as to reflect praise upon themselves and the CDCA.
- Maintain the best possible standards of health, cleanliness, safety, and care of their dogs.
- Complete and return CDCA Health Surveys within four (4) months from the Survey's post (mailing) date. I
 understand that non-compliance will result in automatic removal from the CDCA Breeder's List.

All Breeders and Owners, of Bitches and Stud Dogs Alike, shall:

- Breed Canaan Dogs which adhere to the American Kennel Club approved Standard for the breed and which are healthy and temperamentally and structurally sound.
- Breeders shall keep well informed in the field of genetics and work to eliminate hereditary defects from the breed. All dogs and bitches to be bred shall be x-rayed prior to breeding and declared free of hip dysplasia by an authorized body or organization (OFA or Penn-Hip in the USA) and be screened free of eye problems by an authorized body or organization (CERF in the USA).
- A dog or bitch shall be two (2) years of age before breeding; the maximum age of breeding for bitches shall be nine (9) years, if all health tests remain normal. A bitch shall produce no more than seven (7) litters in her lifetime and produce no more than one (1) litter per year.
- Not crossbreed or breed to an unregistered Canaan Dog, with the exception of a dog undergoing "miyun" under the auspices of the Israeli Kennel Club.
- Not wholesale litters of Canaan Dogs, sell or donate to Brokers, wholesale dealers in dogs, humane societies, laboratories, or provide any animal for auction, prize, or raffle purposes.
- Keep all puppies with the litter until at least eight (8) weeks of age.
- Sellers shall provide puppy/dog buyers with the following papers free of charge for each puppy or dog sold: a written Contract of Sale specifying conditions of the sale and signed by both buyer and seller, a four generation pedigree, and written instructions for care, feeding and immunizations. North American Breeders must provide AKC registration papers within six (6) months. Breeders outside of North America who export to the United States must provide registration papers for the exported dog within eighteen (18) months.

Owners of bitches shall not undertake the breeding of a bitch unless they are prepared to keep the resultant puppies until each is suitably placed.



"Vala" was an amazing and wonderful Canaan Dog, to which words will not be a fitting enough tribute. I cannot thank Jackie and Donna Davison enough for letting me kidnap her all those years ago. I knew, right from the start, that she was special. Her first time in the show ring and she was WB at the 2006 Canaan Dog Club of America National

Specialty. She was a natural in the show ring. We didn't get to complete her AKC Championship until 2 years later after we returned from Australia. She was one of only 2 Australian Champion Canaan Dogs. (The second passed away a couple of years ago - my "Samwise"). Upon our return to the States, it was obvious that she should be Ethan's show dog. That team went on to become the first AKC Grand Champion for the breed. "Vala" was a staple at meet the breed events and helped to bring many to the breed. She even came to alert us

of Ethan's seizures - thankfully she didn't have to do that for long, as Ethan's issues resolved. She even talked the Wisconsin State Patrol out of giving me a speeding ticket - that's how special she was. Never one to argue with her kennel mates, she was our benevolent alpha for many years. Her legacy will be forever entrenched in the Canaan Dogs of River Rock. A spirit so kind and so special that will never be forgotten. Hug your dogs and cherish the time you have with them. Go do something special with that special dog.
