AKC DNA PROGRAM'S GENETIC DIVERSITY PROJECT

"The canine genome was built on one dog, a boxer. As technology improves and becomes more affordable, more and more canine genomes can be generated to add to our knowledge. The AKC DNA Program's Genetic Diversity Project is an exciting new initiative to develop the world's premier database of canine genomic information. This database will generate whole genome sequences of 4000 dogs, representing all AKC-recognized breeds. Using AKC's rich historical pedigrees, these dogs will represent the genetic diversity of breeds today.

Genetic tests rely on robust breedspecific data, and many health tests were developed in the context of one breed. Caution should be made when extrapolating test results for a separate breed, or even a subgroup of the same breed. Public genomic sequences of dogs are expanding rapidly, but not all breeds are represented equally. For more common breeds, these sequences may not reflect the full spectrum of genetic diversity within the breed.

Historically, when breeders are concerned about a health problem in their breed, a researcher collects samples for at least one to two years. Once they have enough study participants, they then perform the DNA sequencing and bioinformatics that may result in a publication a few years later. With this program, we hope to have data readily

available, and therefore remove the years of delay needed for sample collection. It also removes the time and cost of sequencing, so researchers can jump right to the bioinformatics and validation. More effort can then be placed on the crucial step of validation. Once a novel genetic variant is identified, researchers look for the variant in a new group of dogs, separate from the initial group used to find the variant.

Validation helps breeders interpret a novel finding, identify the prevalence of a genetic variant within their breed, and understand the prevalence in other breeds. Often, a genetic variant may be developed in one breed, but may not translate to disease in another. Sharing of data will be structured under academic data grants, similar in concept to the AKC Canine Health Foundation.


The AKC Genetic Diversity Project Goals:

Expedite canine research projects

- Improve genetic counseling
- Improve breed health research
- Evaluate genetic diversity for breed preservation

The AKC DNA Program is inviting you to participate in this project. Participation involves requesting a Research DNA Kit. The submission process is similar to the AKC DNA Kits, but we request 6 swabs instead of two for each dog. We will send you research kits and submission forms to mail back to AKC DNA Operations."

The CDCA Health Committee Chair Donna Davison, and the CDCA AKC Delegate Pamela Rosman, are pleased to announce that AKC DNA Program's Genetic Diversity Project kits will be available at the 2023 National Specialty. You can swab your dog(s) during the Specialty Week (assistance available for the wiggly ones), and the CDCA will arrange return of completed kits to AKC. Anni has spent most of her life in the service of her Canaan Dog breed. She lived her first couple of years as Donna Dodson's companion in the backwoods of Tennessee. When she decided to see the world and compete in conformation she was incredibly successful, earning her AKC championship and Bronze and Silver Grand Championships, as well as winning the National Owner-Handled Series (NOHS) breed Finals and many Canaan Dog Club of America National Specialty, Westminster, and AKC National Championship honors. She ultimately became the top owner-handled Canaan Dog and #2 Grand Champion bitch in breed history. She is the first and only Canaan Dog to have earned a NOHS Platinum Level of Achievement.

After retiring from conformation, Anni mothered two litters of puppies that are now loving family members, accomplished performance dogs, and top conformation winners in their own right. She also accepted a 12-hour-old Canaan Dog puppy as a foster that she then raised as her own.

Anni is one of the few Canaan Dogs to have passed the difficult AKC Temperament Test; she's also a Certified Therapy Dog. She now spends her time as a goodwill ambassador for the breed, anchoring events ranging from Meet the Breeds to holiday parades. But her favorite thing to do is to visit with and bring happiness to nursing home residents and rehabilitation hospital patients. She is Anni—GCHS Pleasant Hill Anni Aharona of Carters Creek ATT.


ARI' THE CANAAN DOG REPS RARE BREED AT 2023 AKC RALLY NATIONAL



When Canaan Dog High Desert Ari Of Ascend Mazel Tov CD BN RM3 RAE2 CGC TKN, also known as "Ari," competes in AKC Rally, he excels at listening. Thanks in part to how he uses his expressive ears, he's reached the top of the sport amongst Canaan Dogs. Ari and his owner, Laura Alton, participate in the sport year-round, but this is the first time they'll compete in the 2023 AKC Rally National Championship.

In the National competition, teams will demonstrate their skills in one of six competitive classes—Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, Excellent, Master, and Championship. Since 9-year-old Ari has earned Advanced, Excellent, and Mas-

ter's titles, he has qualified to compete in the Championship category. The Canaan Dog, co-owned by Risa Baumrind and Alton, will join more than 800 teams to vie for the title of National Rally Champion at the Roberts Centre in Wilmington, Ohio.





A representative of a rare breed, Ari is the only Canaan Dog entered in the 2023 AKC RNC. Although many breeds will show off their skills at this event, they are not compared to their own breed but rather by how well they navigate a course with their owners at

their own brisk pace. Each team encounters a sign along the routine that instructs them to perform various exercises. Of the 200 possible signs a judge selects for each course, the team must execute 10 to 20 signs. These include turns and commands—all with variations.

"What I like about this sport is being able to talk to my dog when we come to a sign on the course," Alton says. "The handler and dog must be on their game to earn the most points, with 100 a perfect score. They must also know the signs well enough to follow them correctly. I've messed up on reading and communicating the signs more than my dog has."

Here's where competent canine listening skills and following directions make all the difference. A team will not score points for that sign if the handler tells the dog to turn right instead of left or ask them to walk slowly rather than fast. "I especially like Rally because Ari loves it," she says. "His tail wags the whole time, and he looks up at me as if to say, 'What am I doing now?' It's just fun."

Sometimes, Ari shows off his silly side. "He might plop down in the middle of an exercise or go for a jump before I give the command," Alton explains. For Alton, seeing her dog get excited when they enter the ring is worth all the preparation. "Sometimes he's so happy that he messes up, but I think he likes the variety of the sport and doing something different every few steps."

Devoted to Canaan Dogs

Alton has owned Canaan Dogs since 1996—when the AKC recognized the breed. A year later, the breed became eligible to compete in AKC events. "When I moved to Nevada, I had a Siberian Husky, but she was so miserable in the hot summer," Alton remembers. "After she died, I looked for another breed, and the Canaan Dog appealed to me because it could handle the heat."

As the national dog of Israel, this medium-sized, intelligent, and somewhat aloof breed seemed a perfect fit. "I knew training Ari would be a little work because, by nature, Canaan Dogs are independent, and I would have to keep him interested," Alton recalls. "Once he figured out we were a team, he liked Rally."

Alton began working with Ari on basic obedience skills at 6 to 7 weeks. Within 6 months, he knew basic cues like "sit," "down," "stand," and "heel," and he could walk on a loose leash. She entered Ari in AKC Rally classes when he was a year old, and he also picked up Obedience and AKC Trick Dog titles, earning a Canine Good Citizen (CGC) title, as well.

Practice Makes Perfect

Alton likes to prep Ari casually around the house. After years of backyard practices and small local trials, how will this rare breed and Herding Group member follow his owner's directions at a new and much larger arena?

"Ari is more than ready for the competition," Alton says. "We've participated in crowded venues many times, and the noise and distractions there never seem to faze him."

AKC MUSEUM OF THE DOG SHINES ITS BREED SPOTLIGHT ON THE CANAAN DOG

On May 14th—Mother's Day, and just days after the annual Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show the AKC Museum of the Dog featured the Canaan Dog in its Breed Spotlight series of programs. The event was held in the museum, located at 101 Park Avenue, New York City, from 12 to 2pm. In spite of being only the #187th most popular breed recognized by the AKC, the Canaan Dog had the largest number of attendees yet of any of these events. There is much interest in this breed because of its long and colorful history.

Informational talks were provided by Canaan Dog Club of America human representatives Richard Vulliet, DVM and David Golden. Dr. Vulliet described the life of a Canaan Dog from pre-biblical times up to when Drs. Rudolphina and Rudolph Menzel re-domesticated them from the desert. Information on ancient rock carvings of Canaan-like dogs on the Arabian Peninsula as well as the over 1,200 dog graves discovered from the extraordinary Ashkelon archeological dig located 20 miles south of Tel Aviv was featured.

David Golden presented graphical examples of key characteristics of the breed (double coat; efficient, ground-covering endurance trot; etc.) and how these were survival traits that allowed Canaan Dogs to thrive in their harsh desert environment for over 6,000 years. These characteristics were then pointed out on the real-life model dogs.

CDCA members Pamela Rosman and Liora Ben-Sorek helped with color commentary and wrangling the model dogs.

And what model dogs they were. Three Canaan Dogs were present for "show and tell" and petting opportunities: this year's Westminster Best of Breed "Estee" (GCHB Revelation Adiva Aviva of Samara), the winner of the previous five Westminster breed competitions

"Avi" (GCHP Pleasant Hill Avram of Carters Creek CA FCAT2 CGC) and, in honor of Mother's Day, Estee's mom "Anni" (GCHS Pleasant Hill Anni Aharona of Carters Creek ATT). The dogs basked in the attention, and the attendees appreciated the opportunity to interact with champion dogs while learning about their wonderfully unique history.

Many thanks to the Museum of the Dog staff, and in particular to Program Director Sarah Moshenberg, for a highly successful event.

MY FIRST CANAAN DOG

A Dreidle At Christmas - Bryna Comsky

An email conversation with Bryna Comsky, edited and compiled by Amanda Pough.

My father had sent me a subscription to the NEW YORK TIMES (Sunday edition), which carried ads for puppies. I was looking for Basenjis. Instead I saw an ad placed by Bert Sheaffer for a rare breed from Israel. We wrote back and forth several times during the year and Bert got me hooked. In 1969 I visited my parents in NYC during Christmas vacation, stopped at Spatterdash Kennels in Emmaus, PA on the way home... and took a Dreidle home at Christmas via the Allentown, PA airport.

Bert and Jay Sheaffer were long time "dog people" and successful Dalmatian breeders. Jay was approved for four groups as an AKC judge. They were intrigued by the challenge of bringing a rare breed to recognition. Canaans caught their eye and they wrote to Mrs. Berkowitz in California.

Aleph of Star Pine was sent to the Sheaffers in Pennsylvania. Aleph was sired by Birion me B'Nei Ha Bitachon (one of the first four imports) and his dam was Waf of Masada, also one of the imports, and unrelated to Aleph. Aleph was in the first Canaan Dog litter whelped in the US. So began the saga of Canaan Dogs in the United States.

Aleph was bred to Petra me Petach Tikvah, who had been imported from the Menzels me B'Nei Ha Bitachon kennel in Israel, who whelped their first litter on Oct 15, 1969, and Dreidle was my pick of the four puppies.

During Christmas vacation that year Dreidle and I flew to Chicago from Allentown, PA. Dreidle was in the baggage compartment safely stowed away in a wooden crate that Jay had built. As a ten-week old puppy he had already cried his eyes out on the way to the airport so he was quiet on the way home from the airport. Good boy, Dreidle.

On our first day home, we went for a run in the park, and then to a homecoming party on Lake Shore Drive, considered part of Chicago's Gold Coast. (Not snooty at all!) I had to chase him in the snow and then coax him from under a heavy oak table to meet his admirers. He learned that people are good, and gave him treats. Good boy, Dreidle.

Soon we moved to the far northwest side of Chicago to be near my horse, named Bryna's Folly by my father who was always right. Both the stable and the new apartment were close to the forest preserve. The scene was set for Dreidle's life and influence in Chicago and the rest of the country. Despite laughter, scorn, disbelief, mockery, and not enough encouragement, nothing could turn us away from the quest for full AKC recognition of Canaans.

Spatterdash Limor, daughter of Limor me B'Nei Habitachon, was whelped November 6, 1973, into the last Spatterdash litter. She also left Spatterdash during Christmas vacation (this time 1973), to head for Chicago with me, and her destiny was to whelp four litters by Spatterdash Dreidle. She also performed well in conformation and obedience competitions. Good girl, Limor! It was time to start the dogs in training for conformation, obedience and tracking.

Enter Northwest Obedience Club of Illinois and their good instructors. Among the successes were: Ch Ha'Aretz Ayen Aleph J. Maccabee TD, a Dreidle and Limor son from their fourth litter, who was the first Canaan to achieve his AKC tracking dog title on October 15 of 1990, and Ch Spatterdash Limor CD, who was awarded a plaque from NOCI honoring her performance in Novice A obedience. Good kids!

Dreidle and Limor (and I!) went to every match in the Midwest that allowed rare breeds including CCA/CDCA national specialty matches except 1974 in California. When puppies came, Limor stayed home with them.

The first match was at Spatterdash Kennels, Emmaus, PA, over Memorial Day weekend, 1973. Tess Hensler, well-known Doberman Pinscher breeder and exhibitor, judged. Over 20 dogs competed. Dreidle was expected to win. He didn't. The judge yelled at me for not following directions. Dreidle did what he was supposed to, but I let him down.

In 1973, we went to Youngstown Ohio, and held the show on the grounds of a Jewish synagogue. Dreidle was expected to win. I let him down again.

In 1974, the club ventured all the way to California. Frances "Ann" Beard won the National which was chaired by Margie Lachs I believe. Ann's bitch was an import from Israel as I recall. I was in West Germany and Dreidle was being boarded at the vet's. We both cried at the separation. That was the only nation-

al I missed to date.

1975, I chaired the specialty in Chicago. Florise Hogan judged. Judy Ardine won it with her Canaans. The best thing that came out of this competition for me was a lovely picture of Dreidle and Limor together at this show.



In 1976, things changed a bit. The national specialty was held in Philadelphia at the foot of the Liberty Bell. A Doberman judge did the honors. He liked Limor, and gave her BOS. A very nice dog shown by the Karstad's won it.

And I made up my mind to learn the basics of handling a dog in the dog show ring. Dreidle would win from now on.

Dreidle won the national in 1977 in Oklahoma City. Limor won the bitch class of six, but BOB or BOS eluded her. Lorraine Stephens chaired. Father Elmer T. Robnett, who served as CCA President for eight years, picked the judge. Father Robnett had parachuted during the war, and was a dog man with interests in terriers, Samoyeds, and Canaans. This was Dreidle's, and my, first national specialty win. Everyone congratulated us and the remark, "It couldn't happen to a nicer person" was heard. Probably for the last time. ;) I was determined that Dreidle would remain unbeatable.

1978 in Naples, FL, Dreidle won. The show was held in a tavern. Only Arlene Sachs could have thought of that. It worked. Arlene served as Treasurer of CCA for at least two terms

In 1979, in Arizona I stopped smoking as promised because Dreidle and his daughter, Miriam, won the top awards at the show given by a Rottweiler breeder and judge. They prolonged my life.

The 1980 National was held in Raleigh NC and chaired by Hinda Bergman, of Alaskan Malamute fame. Dreidle won again in 1980. Good boy Dreidle!


1981 involved a road trip with Donna and Roy Dodson from Illinois to New Mexico - all three of us in one Ford Bronco, plus dogs. Dreidle and Limor stayed at Donna's Boarding Kennel. Barbara Burr or "Ann" Beard chaired.


Donna Dodson chaired the national in 1982, held off Dean Street in DeKalb and on her property in Kingston, IL. The Club's first tracking test was held. Four TD tracks were laid, and judged by Ted Hoesel and Ronny Greenberg, AKC tracking judges. Dreidle's son, Ha'Aretz Mem Dreidleson, was the first to pass. Petro was second to pass. Dreidle was third to pass. The fourth entry didn't pass. Good boy, Dreidle and family!

In his last National appearance, Dreidle won the Stud Dog class on June 12, 1982. Barbara Burr's dog was BOB. Jay Sheaffer judged. Dana Cline judged sweepstakes.

Bryna and Donna have made photos of these first shows available to the club and they are slowly being scanned to allow digital sharing. Many can be found on the CDCA Facebook page, and more will be shared as they are saved.

In the Winter Kibitzer, I wrote about pursuing the new AKC Fit Dog tiles with Simi. 
