SHORT COURSE INFORMATION: "Conducting Bioassessments in Aquatic Systems".

The course will be taught by Gretchen Hayslip, US Environmental Protection Agency, Seattle, WA. This short course will explain how to evaluate the biological condition of a waterbody using biological surveys and other direct measurements of resident biota in surface waters. Historical background regarding why biological assessments are conducted and who currently conducts the assessments will be discussed, as well as information and guidance on how to conduct a bioassessment. Participants will be instructed in field data collection and laboratory methods, data analysis, data integration techniques, and decision-making processes.

FRIDAY NIGHT BANQUET DINNER - The Cedars Floating Restaurant, Blackwell Island (208) 664-2922

(Reservations for 40 people). The Cedars Floating Restaurant opened at the mouth of the Spokane River in 1965. The 1.2 million pound restaurant floats on a styrofoam core encased by 60,000 pounds of concrete. Historic high spring runoffs frequently submerged the parking lot and left the restaurant on the verge of being washed away. After bobbing contentedly on water for twenty-six years, the old building was replaced by the current one in 1991. Banquet selections are listed on the attached pages. COEUR D'ALENE BASIN TOUR SATURDAY AFTERNOON

This tour will explore the residue of over 100 years of heavy metal mining activity. We will drive to the crest of the Idaho/Montana border, the beginning of the Silver Valley, and then we will trace the flow of the South Fork of the Coeur d'Alene River and also it's feeder streams. We will tour abandoned mining towns and see huge tailing piles along the banks of the streams. The tour will then continue to Cataldo Mission where the river slows and enters a series of lateral lakes. The tour will be guided by Hugh Lefcort of Gonzaga University.

DIRECTIONS

Coeur d'Alene Inn: From Interstate-90 (going east or west) take the US Hwy 95 exit north. At the first stoplight (Appleway intersection by Chevron and Shell stations) go left. The Coeur d'Alene Inn is just past the Chevron station.

North Idaho College: From Interstate-90 (going east or west) take the Northwest Boulevard exit. Go south at the exit ramp and follow NW boulevard toward downtown CdA to Memorial Field. Turn right on Mullan Rd. Follow Mullan Rd. as it curves right until Garden Ave. Take a left on Garden Ave. and this will take you to the College. Parking is available on the NIC campus (campus map attached). For our accommodation, campus security will not be writing parking tickets during our conference but be careful not to park in handicap (unless warranted) or fire zones.


