City of Portland

The PNW-SETAC Conference and many of the hotels and restaurants are within the downtown free-ride zone so traveling around Portland should be easy and cheap. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Groundwater/Surface Water Interactions Short Course

Thursday 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM at Portland State University's Smith Memorial Center, Multicultural Center Room 228
The course will be taught by Dr. Bruce Duncan, US Environmental Protection Agency, Seattle, WA with local regulators and consultants with regional case studies. The course is designed for environmental professionals that have ground-water contamination near surface water bodies. The short course will present the issues associated with site characterization and monitoring and discuss the implications for cleanup decision-making. The course will emphasize the hydrological, physicochemical and ecological conditions that make the chemical characterization and risk analysis of such situations challenging. It will also include site-specific case studies. Participants will be instructed in how to incorporate GW/SW interactions into traditional ecological risk assessment paradigm, field data collection methods and designs, data interpretation methods, and decision-making processes.


