How And Where Do I Enroll?

- RECOMMENDED, NOT REQUIRED
 - It is recommended, but NOT required, that you enroll in SEU Dual Enrollment, as I will be tutoring/guiding based on the classes previously listed, the school's program/style, and familiarity with the system.

Will The Credits Transfer?

- Short Answer, Most Likely.
- O Long Answer:
 - O This depends on the institution to which you would like to transfer to after J.T.D.E. It is your sole responsibility to contact the institution of your choice with the course codes to request approval.
- Experience
 - O In our experience, we have had **overall** success with course transfers.

Course Dates Different?

- O Different institutions, including SEU, have different course dates than TEACH
 - We will still follow TEACH's schedule, so that means:
 - We will have time PRIOR to SEU courses starting to prepare!
 - O Students will have experience to handle winter break classes on their own
 - O However, I WILL provide, at no extra cost, two zoom sessions over winter break for those who need assistance.
 - O Students will work ahead to account for class work that needs to be completed during TEACH Spring Break

What Are Tutor Responsibilities?

- I will provide Guidance, Tutoring, Editing, and Support
 - O Guidance educating students on how to manage Dual Enrollment Courses and Deadlines, and how to organize their assignments.
 - O Tutoring I will provide instruction each week that will support their course learning, as well as answer course content-specific questions.
 - O Editing I will provide general editing opportunities, and will teach students how to help each other edit. I will also direct them to institution resources for editing.
 - Support I will help the students navigate the coursework and professor communication, as well
 as help them with confusing assignments or professor feedback.

What Are Parent Responsibilities?

- Parents are the SOLE teacher for their child, so they must do the following (but not limited to):
 - Ensure student is registered on time, turns in assignments on time, and completes institution requirements on time.
 - O Monitor their student progress and help them communicate with their professor in a timely manner regarding any emergencies, late assignments, grade disputes, etc.
 - Provide help for their student, if more time is needed than the amount of time I am providing.

What Are Student Responsibilities?

- Students are taking college courses, so they MUST do the following (but not limited to):
 - Thoroughly read and follow all communication/instructions from their institution.
 - Complete all assignments in a timely manner, and communicate with your professor if you cannot.
 - Ask for help from your professor, parents, tutor, etc. whenever you do not understand something or when you need assistance.
 - NOT CHEAT you must comply with all rules and regulations for assignments, and comply with any Al-use requirements.

Do These Grades Count?

- O Short Answer: Yes, in 99% of circumstances.
- Cong Answer:
 - There are DE options that allow you to take courses at your own pace for a small fee, and then only pay a full fee to have the grade listed on your transcript when you are satisfied with your grade. Your mileage may vary as to whether these courses will transfer to your institution of choice after J.T.D.E.
 - Each institution, including SEU, has their own ADD/Drop and Withdrawal Deadlines.

Can I Take More Classes?

- Your are NOT limited to the courses we are recommending for J.T.D.E.
 - O Depending on your ability and desire, you may take up to the institution's allowable credits per semester.
- I will NOT be offering tutoring or editing in any of those courses unless you take our second class option (TBD).
- If you have already taken one or all of these courses already, please contact myself or Corey for advice.

Can I Earn My AA?

- Short answer: YES!
- O Long Answer:
 - SEU, as well as other institutions, have opportunities for students to earn their AA through Dual Enrollment.
 - There is a possibility we could add a track for an AA program here at TEACH, but in the meantime, today, we are focusing on four core, first year, classes of Dual Enrollment.

Post Presentation Information

- Can I stop J.T.D.E. if I suddenly feel confident in my Dual Enrollment experience?
 - O No, this is a year long commitment. If you feel confident, utilize the time set aside for class to be present to hear tips and tricks, to have editing support, and to possibly add more classes to your schedule while you have a built-in, set-aside time for this coursework.
- What classes should I have completed in order to Dual Enroll?
 - O It is recommended, but not required, that your student has taken and successfully completed Algebra II and at LEAST one High School English/Writing course, as well as at LEAST one natural science course with lab (Biology/Chemistry, etc).
- How will this apply to my student's high school transcript?
 - That is entirely up to you. Corey has recommendations for how to incorporate these courses through her transcript service options; however, it is your decision how to apply these courses as simultaneous high school courses. Students have utilized these courses as their core subjects for Junior and/or Senior year.
