**TUITION FEES EXPLAINED**

All class registrations will be completed through our online portal -available on 2/1.

All students through Kindergarten must have a guardian on campus at all times.

All students must be registered for classes while on campus and are allowed a ONE HOUR break. Students who have parents on campus at all times may have multiple breaks. There are NO exceptions to the rule for anyone who is being dropped off.

Due upon registration - 10% of total tuition (*Tuition includes instructor fees, rent, insurance, cleaning, security, portal fees, credit card fees, special event cost, TEACH wide supplies and business expenses, and in some cases, curriculum is included*)

9 monthly payments will be scheduled according to your payment method beginning July 1st through March 1st.

I understand that there are fees associated with dropping and transferring a class as stated below and that I am responsible for those payments. I UNDERSTAND THAT A CLASS WILL NOT BE DROPPED/TRANSFERRED UNTIL AN EMAIL IS SENT FROM THE REQUESTING FAMILY TO THE INSTRUCTOR WITH TEACHCOREYMKCEOWN@GMAIL.COM COPIED. Drops WILL NOT be processed directly through Corey McKeown. It is up to the family to inform the instructor BEFORE.

**TRANSFER FROM ONE CLASS TO ANOTHER:**

A class can be transferred to another class with the same instructor. Fees for the original class will not be reimbursed and the prorated amount for the new class will be charged.

A class being transferred to a different instructor will follow the DROP fee schedule for the class dropping. All due payments are nonrefundable (and will be charged if not up to date) and the new class will be charged at a prorated amount according to start date.

100% OF CURRICULUM FEE IS NON REFUNDABLE. If course is dropped that included curriculum, the full amount of curriculum is due.

**DROP POLICY - CHARGED FOR ALL PAYMENTS THROUGH DATE OF DROP PLUS ONE MONTH.**

100% OF CURRICULUM FEE IS NON REFUNDABLE.

THERE WILL BE NO REFUNDS ON ANY SERVICES COMPLETED FOR ANY REASON INCLUDING EXPULSION FROM CLASS/TEACH.

## Policy on Class Cancellations Due to Natural Disasters

### Class Cancellation Due to Natural Disasters

Effective Date: 8/1/2025

#### Purpose

To establish a clear protocol regarding class cancellations resulting from natural disasters and to communicate the policy on makeup classes.

#### Policy Statement

In the event that classes are canceled due to natural disasters, including but not limited to hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, and severe storms, those classes will **\*\*not\*\*** be rescheduled or made up.

#### Guidelines

1. Notification: Students and staff will be promptly notified of any class cancellations via the established communication channels (e.g., email, text alerts, school website).
2. No Makeup Classes: Canceled classes due to natural disasters will not be made up. This decision is based on the understanding that the safety and well-being of students and staff are the top priority.
3. Academic Continuity: Instructors will provide alternative learning resources and assignments when possible to help students stay on track with their coursework.
4. Support Services: Students who require additional support due to missed classes are encouraged to reach out to their instructors or academic advisors.
5. Review and Adaptation: This policy will be reviewed annually and adapted as necessary to ensure its effectiveness and relevance.

#### Conclusion

This policy aims to prioritize safety while maintaining academic integrity. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation during these challenging circumstances.

#### BOUNDARIES ON CAMPUS (See image at bottom of page)

##### DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Any students who are 1st grade and older are allowed to be dropped off on campus IF they are able to manage themselves and maintain appropriate behavior. (See discipline policy). All students on campus must be registered IN CLASS and are allowed a ONE HOUR break. Students younger than 1st grade, or who are special needs, must have an adult on campus at all times - if the parent is not able to stay, there is a drop off fee that will assign an adult to your student while they are on campus. See Corey McKeown for more detail.

##### ALL ADULTS ON CAMPUS ARE ASKED TO HELP MAINTAIN BEHAVIOR POLICIES

Any student who is not in a class must be in the gym OR in the back yard area of the church (playground). ONLY high school students and adults are allowed on the balcony.

NO ONE is allowed to sit or roam in the halls during class times - halls are to be silent so that classrooms are not disrupted by outside noise. NO STUDENTS ARE ALLOWED TO WALK OUT INTO THE FIELD/WOODED AREA UNLESS WITH A TEACH. STUDENTS SHOULD NEVER PASS WHERE THE PICNIC TABLES ARE SET UNDER THE TREES.

DOORS - there is only ONE door unlocked to the gym entry - all other doors may be used as EXITS and should NEVER be propped open or opened for someone to enter.

#### BEHAVIOR & DISCIPLINE @ TEACH

At T.E.A.C.H, we uphold high standards of conduct and behavior. Our Discipline Policy is designed to ensure the well-being and safety of all individuals on campus. Please review the following guidelines with your child:

**TEACH reserves the right to dismiss a student for behavioral issues at any time, without following the standard discipline policy, if it is deemed necessary for the well-being of the community.**

##### General Rules:

- Dress Code: See image at bottom of page - THIS INCLUDES PARENTS!
- Respect yourself, others, and property.
- Treat each person with gentleness and respect.
- Obey the authority of administration, instructors, and parents.
- Use polite language and courtesies.
- Wear modest and appropriate clothing.
- No inappropriate messages, pictures, or symbols on clothing.
- Appropriate use of electronics - no sending inappropriate messages, pictures or watching/playing inappropriate games

##### Serious Incidents:

- Bullying, physical harm, self-harm threats, sexual misconduct, inappropriate language, possession of weapons, drugs, alcohol, smoking, vaping, property damage, or any behavior that endangers others will result in immediate removal from the campus.
- SPEEDING IN PARKING LOT - THIS PERTAINS TO PARENTS ALSO! Drivers should go no more than 10mph in the parking lot. If we have complaints regarding your vehicle, we will follow the below "Behavior Policy Implementation"

##### Behavior Policy Implementation:

- "One Time Grace" with Ms. Corey: Every student will receive a "One Time Grace with Ms. Corey" for day-to-day behavior infractions. This grace period allows us to address concerns promptly and support students in making positive choices.
- Continued Behavior Concerns: Any behavior that continues after the initial grace period will be discussed with parents. If the behavior continues it will result in dismissal from T.E.A.C.H. We take this step seriously to uphold the integrity of our educational environment and the safety of all students and staff.

We believe in the importance of accountability and the opportunity for growth. Our goal is to work collaboratively with students and families to address behavior concerns proactively and constructively.

**WEATHER:**

T.E.A.C.H. does NOT follow the county school weather plan. T.E.A.C.H. will make decisions regarding weather delays or cancellations and will notify families via TEXT MESSAGE if classes will be postponed or canceled

**GYM/BREAK ROOM:**

Tables will be set up in the gym. First-come-first-serve. Please do not leave your stuff on a table if you are not going to be there for an extended time. There is plenty of floor space to put bags and other items. Leave the tables for those who need them to work/eat/etc.

Chairs are available for use in the gym. If you get a chair out, please put it away before you leave.

**CURRICULUM CART:**

Used curriculum cart located in the gym - please place any donation on the cart - this should ONLY be curriculum that is used at T.E.A.C.H. or in "like new" condition. All curriculum on the cart is free.

**LOST AND FOUND:**

We will keep a lost and found bin in the gym. We will empty it at the end of each month and donate any left items. Be sure to check the bin each week.

**FOOD:** T.E.A.C.H. is not considered "allergy friendly" - anyone with allergies is responsible for themselves. It is suggested that students with Epipens let each instructor know where the epipen is located in the student's bag.

Students must provide their own snacks, beverages and lunch while on campus. All should be packed in a COOLER style lunch box as we do not have a refrigerator with space for lunches. **PACK WHAT YOUR STUDENT NEEDS - UTENSILS, NAPKINS, PLATES, ETC.**

We DO have microwaves!

On Monday and Wednesday we will have Nina's Cafe on campus. You are able to text Nina your order and request a time for it to be ready! This helps to be sure your student's lunch is ready during the time they have to eat!

## NEW IN 2025

As TEACH continues to grow, we are implementing some important upgrades to better serve you. Starting next year, you will notice a slight price increase for all classes, and I want to be fully transparent about why these changes are necessary.

Currently, our class fees cover instructor tuition, rent, utilities, insurance, supplies, software, and credit card fees. Moving forward, we will also include small fees for security, additional cleaning, event-related expenses, upgraded registration and class management system (MYTEACH), and administrative fees. Below, I've provided a detailed explanation of what to expect from these upgrades.

Please take a moment to review the new processes and offerings coming your way! I'm confident these changes will enhance your experience with TEACH, and I sincerely appreciate your understanding and continued support.

## SECURITY UPGRADES

TEACH will be launching a new security app beginning January 2025.

This system will allow for all instructors/admin on campus to be alerted immediately.

Alerts will be used for:

Lock Down - all instructors will lock down their classrooms according to protocol and move any students out of view of door/windows.

Hold - alert will go out to ask instructors if their room is safe or needs attention

Secure - alert will go out when there is a situation on campus that is not emergent but we want our instructors to be aware of.

Evacuate - all instructors will escort students in classes to field at end of parking lot

Shelter In Place - all instructors will move students to safe part of building due to inclement weather

Another part of this system will allow for all instructors to ping Corey from their class if they have a non-emergent issue.

Oakwood Church will be working to update all door locks in the facility and add a magnetic/automatic locking feature on the main doors. This will be completed in the coming months.

## CLEANING

A deep clean of all bathrooms and common areas was completed in December. A monthly cleaning of all bathrooms and common areas will be completed by a professional cleaning company (over and above the current daily cleaner) January through May.

Beginning August 2025, there will be weekly deep cleaning by a professional cleaning company.

## MyTEACH PORTAL

As you are aware, we are moving all class management and communication to MyTEACH portal. ALL classes and instructors will be using this system beginning in 2025/2026. Currently, all are using it as their form of communication to get used to the system throughout this year. This will allow for all class information to be housed in one location. We will be providing more information on this as we move into the new school year. Please continue to get used to this system between now and May 2025.

## NEW CORE OPTION

The Principle Approach to Homeschooling - TEACH will be adding a CORE PA on Fridays. In the coming months, we will be having guest speakers and seminars on this new offering. The Principle Approach is a Biblical manner of teaching and learning which places the Truths of God's Word at the heart of education. This approach takes on the whole view of the subject, unifies all subjects, studies God's providence in the subject as it contributes to the history of liberty and focuses on christian character development. 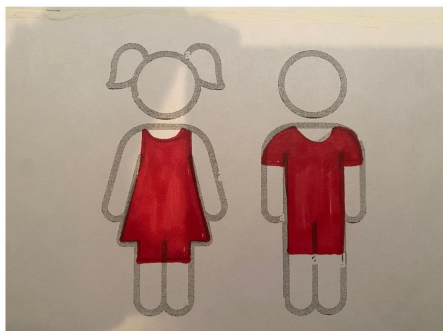
