Welcome to T.E.A.C.H, a place where we value respect, responsibility, and community. This handbook provides a comprehensive overview of the policies and procedures that ensure a safe, productive, and respectful learning environment for all students and families.

### **Communication**

T.E.A.C.H. Communication

- **Weekly Updates**: Weekly text messages will be sent on Sundays at noon with any weekly reminders.
- **Student Portal**: Our student portal at [www.trinityhomeschoolacademy.com](http://www.trinityhomeschoolacademy.com) is updated daily with all necessary information.
- **Facebook**: Follow the Trinity Education Academy of Christian Homeschoolers Facebook page for updates and pictures from around campus.

Instructor Communication

Each instructor has their own preferred method of communication. It is the responsibility of the student and their family to subscribe or sign up for these communications. The parent is ultimately in charge of overseeing student assignments and managing student work. Instructors are not responsible for contacting parents about missing assignments.

### **Drop Off and Pick Up**

Drop Off Policy

- Students who have completed the 1st grade or are turning 7 years old may be dropped off if they can follow all rules, behavior policies, and manage their personal schedules independently.
- Dropped-off students are allowed a one-hour break in their schedule while on campus.
- Students unable to manage themselves will require an adult on campus at all times.
- Students with disabilities or special needs must have a parent on campus at all times.

Entry and Exit Procedures

- **Building 1**: Use the door labeled "Education Building." Do not use the church office doors.
- **Building 2**: Students in Cake Decorating, Mini Desserts, or Homestead should use the kitchen door on the left side of the building. Do not enter the Worship Center from the kitchen.
- **Building 3**: Enter through the gym doors (the last set of doors). All other doors will be locked.

- Across top in BLUE - click the **CLASS DETAILS AND COST**
- Find your classes, listed alphabetically, to view what curriculum and supplies are needed

## **FOOD:**

Students must provide their own snacks, beverages and lunch while on campus. All should be packed in a COOLER style lunch box as we do not have a refrigerator with space for lunches. PACK WHAT YOUR STUDENT NEEDS - UTENSILS, NAPKINS, PLATES, ETC.

*We DO have microwaves!*

On Monday and Wednesday we will have 9A's Cafe on campus. Menu will be available closer to the start date and posted on our website. You are able to text Nina your order and request a time for it to be ready! This helps to be sure your student's lunch is ready during the time they have to eat!

- FLUSH THE TOILET...AND ACTUALLY GET THE TOILET PAPER IN THE TOILET BEFORE FLUSHING


## **DRESS CODE**

# BOUNDARIES ON CAMPUS


## DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Any students who are 1st grade and older are allowed to be dropped off on campus IF they are able to manage themselves and maintain appropriate behavior. (See discipline policy). All students on campus must be registered IN CLASS and are allowed a ONE HOUR break. Students younger than 1st grade, or who are special needs, must have an adult on campus at all times - if the parent is not able to stay, there is a drop off fee that will assign an adult to your student while they are on campus.

### *ALL ADULTS ON CAMPUS ARE ASKED TO HELP MAINTAIN BEHAVIOR POLICIES*

- Any student who is not in a class must be in the gym OR in the back yard area of the church (playground). ONLY high school students and adults are allowed on the balcony.
- NO ONE is allowed to sit or roam in the halls during class times - halls are to be silent so that classrooms are not disrupted by outside noise.
- DOORS - there is only ONE door unlocked to the gym entry - all other doors may be used as EXITS and should NEVER be propped open or opened for someone to enter.



## BEHAVIOR & DISCIPLINE @ TEACH

Dear Students and Families of Trinity Homeschool Academy (T.E.A.C.H),

I hope this message finds you well. As we prepare for the upcoming school year, I would like to take a moment to emphasize our commitment to maintaining a safe and respectful learning environment for all students at T.E.A.C.H.

At T.E.A.C.H, we uphold high standards of conduct and behavior. Our Discipline Policy is designed to ensure the well-being and safety of all individuals on campus. Please review the following guidelines with your child:

### **General Rules:**

- Respect yourself, others, and property.
- Treat each person with gentleness and respect.
- Obey the authority of administration, instructors, and parents.
- Use polite language and courtesies.
- Wear modest and appropriate clothing.
- No inappropriate messages, pictures, or symbols on clothing.
- Appropriate use of electronics - no sending inappropriate messages, pictures or watching/playing inappropriate games

### **Serious Incidents:**

- Bullying, physical harm, self-harm threats, sexual misconduct, inappropriate language, possession of weapons, drugs, alcohol, smoking, vaping, property damage, or any behavior that endangers others will result in immediate removal from the campus.
- ***SPEEDING IN PARKING LOT - THIS PERTAINS TO PARENTS ALSO!*** Drivers should go no more than 10mph in the parking lot. If we have complaints regarding your vehicle, we will follow the below "Behavior Policy Implementation"

### **Behavior Policy Implementation:**

- "One Time Grace" with Ms. Corey: Every student will receive a "One Time Grace with Ms. Corey" for day-to-day behavior infractions. This grace period allows us to address concerns promptly and support students in making positive choices.
- Continued Behavior Concerns: Any behavior that continues after the initial grace period will be discussed with parents. If the behavior continues it will result in dismissal from T.E.A.C.H. We take this step seriously to uphold the integrity of our educational environment and the safety of all students and staff.

We believe in the importance of accountability and the opportunity for growth. Our goal is to work collaboratively with students and families to address behavior concerns proactively and constructively.

T.E.A.C.H. IS A BIBLICALLY BASED ORGANIZATION AND WILL UPHOLD AND MAINTAIN BIBLICAL BELIEFS AND STANDARDS.**

Trinity Homeschool Academy (T.E.A.C.H) is committed to teaching a biblical worldview. It is our hope to develop Christ-centered children, youth, and adults who will impact the world through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Though all are welcome, it is expected that everyone (including instructors, students, and families) will respect our Christian beliefs. We will not tolerate attempts to indoctrinate others on beliefs that do not adhere to Biblical teachings.

*Although we believe in the practice of the Golden Rule, treating others as we would wish to be treated, we encourage believers to love others as Jesus loves us. (John 13:34–36)  
We believe that this principle can effectively guide our social and business relationships, helping us to cultivate the mind of Christ and a heart for others (Matthew 7:12, Romans 12:1-2).*

*We believe that followers of God have been called to exercise self-control and holiness in their personal lives, generosity and kindness in their relations with others, and grace in all matters of life (Romans 12:9–21, Galatians 5:22–23).*

*We believe that all people, irrespective of their station or circumstances in life, have been made in the image of God and must be treated with dignity, justice, and respect. *We believe that human sexuality is a gift of God that is to be affirmed as it is exercised within the legal and spiritual covenant of a loving and monogamous marriage between one man born a man and one woman born a woman (Exodus 20:14, Matthew 19:3–9, Ephesians 5:22–33).*

*We believe in the final triumph of righteousness when the kingdoms of this world shall become the kingdom of Christ, and we accept our calling to work towards that end as Christ's light and the salt of the earth (Matthew 5:13–16, Revelation 11:15–17, Revelation 21–22).*
