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Class Description

Students will acquire foundational business concepts, learn economic and mathematic concepts, and apply those concepts to a new business idea. Real life examples are important to use when educating students. This course will take them through an entrepreneurial journey of creating their own business, producing a product, or offering a service, and marketing and selling to their peers. This course encompasses a variety of basic life skills such as money management, business development, bookkeeping, profit margins, marketing campaigns, and friendly competition. Entrepreneurs in the Tampa Bay area will be invited to speak to students in class. Students will learn how to start a small business of their own. Opportunities to sell their goods and services will be provided through Trinity Market Days approximately once a month. Students will plan and implement Trinity's annual Fall Festival and Spring Festival. Parental involvement and assistance during the Fall and Spring festivals is highly encouraged.
