The Joannes Vos family arrived in Dahlgren Township, Carver County, MN. in 1864 at which point they settled on a 160 acre homestead. Nearby communities that played a part in their history are Chaska, Waconia, Cologne, and Benton.

SCHMID NOTE: Agnes's brother Reinhard Vos, married Magdalena Schmid, daughter of German Immigrants, Joseph Schmid & Elizabeth Schweikert. Reinhard & Lena also resided in the Krain / Holding area. As did Agnes's niece, Gertrude Vos (Frank) Schmid, who lived nearby in Avon. Gertrude was a daughter of Agnes's brother, Anton Vos, Sr and Elizabeth Beckers.

Three of the Vos siblings, **Anton, Agnes, and Reinhard** moved from Carver County to **Stearns County.** Names associated with this area are, **Holding Township, Krain Township and Holdingford, Avon Township**. Also the towns of Avon, Albany, Melrose and Freeport are mentioned in the Vos history, all located in Stearns County,

Agnes Hubertina VOS (Peter Joannes 5, Petrus 4, Joannes 3, Petrus [Peter] 2, xxx 1) was born on 20 Feb 1853 in Echt, Limburg, Netherlands, died on 22 Jan 1947 in Freeport, Stearns County, MN at age 93, and was buried on 25 Jan 1947 in St. Mary's Cemetery, Holdingford, Stearns County, MN.

In 1930 Agnes was living with (son) Math Muyres. Agnes remained on the farm until 1938 and then lived with her daughter **Gertrude Michaels** in Freeport, MN for nine years. Agnes died on 22 January 1947, in Oak township, Stearns County, MN. - source: Charles Stuber

Excerpts from Vos History, source: Candice Muyres & Charles Stuber Agnes married John Lambertus MUYRES, son of Bartholomeus MUIJRES and Anna Maria Elisabeth STELTEN, on 16 Jan 1870 in St. Boniface, Carver County, MN. John was born on 5 Jan 1847 in Nieuwstadt, Limburg, Netherlands, died on 21 Mar 1907 in Krain, Stearns County, MN at age 60, and was buried on 30 Mar 1907 in St. Mary's Cemetery, Holdingford, Stearns County, MN. Marriage witnesses were John Vos and Peter Vos. Their Marriage License was obtained on 10 Jan 1870 in Carver County.

Their first child Theodore, was born only months after the wedding. In 1870 their last name was listed as Marus.

In 1870 Agnes' brothers John Vos and Reinard Vos were also living at the Vos parents home.

On 11 Jun 1870 they were living with Agnes' parents with their son Theodore.

They may of married on 12 or 13 Jan 1870.

John Muyres and Agnes Vos married in Cologne and then moved to Krain Township, Stearns County in 1870.

John applied for US citizenship on 28 Dec 1871 in Stearns County. He applied again on 3 Dec 1878 and 28 Dec 1878.

John started with a purchase of 40 acres in 1870 and an additional adjacent 40 acres in 1877. This was located in the Northwest corner of

Section 15 in Township 126, Range 31; (A donated portion of this land became the Town Hall location for Krain Township by 1896). He

then purchased a property on 3 Dec 1878 for \$7880 in St. Cloud at the US General Land Office and on 20 Jan 1880, received a Homestead

Patent for this property. The Land Patent reads: SW quarter of Section 10 in Twp. 126, Range 31, in the district of land subject to sale at St.

Cloud, MN, containing 160 acres. Their home was built on the property in Section 10 at a place later known as the Math Muyres farm.

Agnes lived at this farm for 68 years. Agnes continued to live on the farm until 1938, and then lived with her daughter Gertrude, in Freeport

until her death. She lived with her daughter Gertrude Michael for the last 9 years of her life. By 1896 John Muyres had acquired a total of

320 acres. (80 acres in Section 9, 160 acres in Section 10, and 80 acres in Section 15). All of these properties were connected to each other.

When he purchased the property in 1880 he still signed his name as John Muijres.

Krain Township is situated in the northeast portion of the county, and adjoins Holding on the west. It has an area of about 28,800 acres,.

There are a number of small lakes, and a considerable acreage of swamp land, the latter being covered with a good growth of tamarack.

William Henry Helsper was, undoubtedly, the first settler in this town. He was a native of Prussia, and settled on Section 18 in 1868. James

Graham followed Mr. Helsper the same year, and settled near him. James Gasperlin came the following year, and settled on Section 28.

Krain was organized in 1872, and the first officers elected were: Supervisors, W. H. Helsper, chairman; Mathias Pogatschnik, and John

Muyres; clerk, Joseph Gasperlin; justice of the peace, James Graham; and assessor, Ulrich Schelesnik.

The first school in Krain was taught by Joseph Gasperlin at his residence, the term commencing 12 Jan 1874. Number ninety- eight was

organized in 1874, and the school house was located on Section 23.

John Muyres was the first clerk, Joseph Moonen, treasurer, and Anton Vos, director. There is some dispute as to who was the first teacher,

some claiming it was William Day and others that it was Cyrus Brock. During the first term fifteen pupils attended, instruction being given in

a log building situated on the northeast corner of the southwest quarter of Section 23, just two miles south and east of the present site. The

teachers employed after Mr. Day and Mr. Brock were Louis Polly. August Richter, Cornelius Walker, Joseph Herberger, Henry Meyer,

Nicholas Neisen, Amonica Aschenbrenner, Constance Seifert, Nicholas Young, J. E. Lemm, Bernard Reiter, Leonard Vos, Beatrice Wolf,

Helena Popp, Alma Kaufmann, Michael Tschida, Wendelin Lemm and Julius Schmidt.

Shortly after a schoolhouse was erected near the present location in the Village of St. Anthony, across the road from the Catholic church. For

many years one teacher did the work, but it was finally found necessary to engage an assistant. A fine two-room schoolhouse was built and

completely equipped with all modern conveniences. The teachers employed in this school were Joseph Fahnlander, Mr. Rinker, Mr.

McDonnell, Mr. Heringer, Cyrus Brock. Michael Gores, J. C. Diekmann, George Gareis, M. C. Baltes, J. A. Schritz, William Mechtenberg,

Mr. Kindervater, Miss Roesch, Valentine Henkel, John A. Kraus, Frank Herzog, Joseph Kruchten, B. J. Herzog, Sophia Kranz, C. A.

Boerger, Theresa Bauer and Lucy Spengler. District Number 114, whose building is located on "Fluermann's Corner," was organized in the fall of 1878.





1947 Obituary for Agnes Vos Muyres

MRS. JOHN MUYRES DIES JANUARY 22, 1947

Mrs. John Muyres, one of Krain township's oldest settlers, who had been making her home that past nine years with her daughter, Mrs.

Henry Michael in Freeport, died at the age at 6:30 p.m. last Wednesday, January 22, at the age of 94.

Mrs. Muyres was born in Berkelaar, Holland, February 20, 1853. In May, 1863 she boarded a sailboat for America with her parents at

Antwerp. They settled on a farm near Cologne, Minn. She was united in marriage to John Muyres at Cologne. They moved to Krain

township 77 years ago, homesteading on the farm 5 miles west of Holdingford known as the Math Muyres farm. she lived there for 68

years. Mr. Muyres passed away forty years ago.

She was the mother of 15 children, 3 of whom preceded her in death. Mrs. John Boeckermann (Walburga), Theodore and Peter.

Surviving are the following children: Mrs. J.P. Schueller (Sophia), Mrs. Elizabeth Gerads, Holdingford, Mrs. Henry Michael (Gertrude),

Mrs. Joseph Kerfeld (Mary), Freeport; Mrs. Mike Kuefler (Augusta), St. Francis; John, Hackensack; Barthol, Sauk Rapids; Math,

Minneapolis; Mrs. Eugene Munkler (Lena), British Columbia; George, Leonard and William, Saskatchewan, Canada. There is one brother

Leonard Vos of Cologne, 99 grandchildren, 118 great grandchildren in the United States, and 9 great grandchildren.

Mrs. Muyres was a member of the Christian Mothers society of St. Mary's church.

The funeral was held at 9:30 Saturday morning at St. Mary's church in Holdingford. Officiating at the solemn mass were Rev. Paul

Resenthal, celebrant Rev. Linus, O.S.B., of Freeport, deacon, and Rev. John Kromolieki, sub deacon. Burial was made in the parish cemetery.

Pallbearers were grandsons, Lawrence Muyres, Theodore Boeckermann, Jerome Kerfeld, Arnold Muyres, Leonard Muyres, and Henry

Michael, Jr.
