

On an **1880 Plat of Lake Town Township**, Carver Co, we see **John Pfeiffer's 67.55 acre farm** to the west of Stone Lake and Lake Zumbra. To the west of Pfeiffer is **John Leuthardt's 67.40 acre farm** (husband of Joseph Schmid's daughter Elizabeth.) West of this is the **Grimm farm**, known in the area as a successful alfalfa producer.

John & Elizabeth rented his father's land in Lake Town Township for a few years. In 1880, they moved up to **Chokio**, **Baker Township**, **Stevens County**, where they homesteaded and raised their family.





Not only did John claim a government homestead, but took advantage of the government's plea for trees and groves on what was then a tree-less prairie. He filed on what was known as a tree claim, three miles west of Chokio and here in order to obtain title it was necessary to plant and cultivate so many trees. That he was successful is plainly visable. The grove today not only helps to beautify the country but stands as a memorial to a pioneer who has passed beyond.

Farm work becoming a burden and wishing to spend their remaining years in rest John and Elizabeth moved to Chokio, Minnesota April 26, 1916.

John was a man of honest convictions, a gentleman and one of the finest type of citizens this country has ever known. His friends were many and there was no happier family circle in the land than his. For 45 years he made this his home and during this time built up a large acquaintance. He passed away March 17, 1924 at his home.

Elizabeth was known in the community as "Grandma Leuthard" passed away at the age of 74 years on April 18, 1957 in the hospital in Morris, Minnesota.

John 'C. and Elizabeth's Family

John C. Leuthard son of John Leuthard and Elizabeth was born in Switzerland on Jan. 27, 1852. When fourteen years old came to the United States with his father and mother. The family settled in Carver County, Minnesota. Here he spent his early manhood.

Elizabeth Schmidt daughter of Joseph Fred Schmidt was born April 18, 1931 in Carver County, Minnesota. She grew up in Hennepin county, Minnesota.

On April 26, 1875 John and Elizabeth were married. They rented John's fathers farm for three to four years and not being satisfied in being a renter and hearing of the free homesteads farther west, John and his family seeking a home of their own went to Stevens county, Minnesota. In 1879 he filed on a claim two and a half miles southwest of Chokio, Minnesota, which he still owned at the time of his death,

Facing many hardships known only to the early pioneers of this country they farmed and raised their family of 15 children, who as they grew up assisted them in making a success of their agricultural undertaking. (continued)
