across.

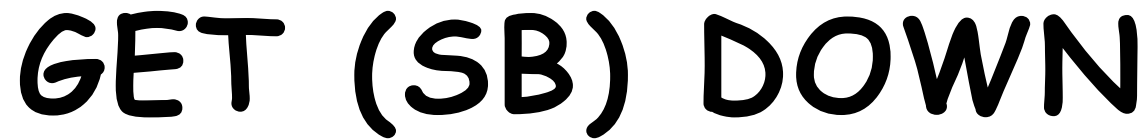


GET AWAY
