

Long time ago railways were using signals to control train traffic. It was used for both up-going and down-going trains.

When cars were introduced in America and Britain the traffic situation became a problem. A police officer called William Potts of Detroit, decided to do something about the problem and he decided to use railroad signals for street use.

He used 2 colored lights, red and green and connected the signals by electricity but it was manually operated. The first traffic light was put in 1920.



At the same time, Garrett Augustus, an African-American, from Cleveland, realized the need for traffic lights after an accident between a car and a horse-drawn carriage. So he decided to do something about and in 1923 put a 4 way traffic light signal.



Today, traffic lights have an internal timer that is programmed to stay on for a specific amount of time. Policemen also control the lights on certain roads depending on the amount of traffic.
