NFWI - 2025/26 RESOLUTION SHORTLIST

The NFWI Public Affairs team are pleased to announce 2025/26 Resolution Shortlist selected by member and federation delegates at the Resolution Shortlist Selection Meeting on 2nd October. Further resources, including PowerPoint presentations and quizzes, will be available on My WI from 4th November.

1. Accessible public toilet facilities to promote dignity, health, and social inclusion This resolution is a call for accessible, clean, free public toilets which are fundamental to inclusion and wellbeing, especially for women, older people, disabled individuals, parents and carers. It invites WI branches to take meaningful action—through advocacy, partnership, and community engagement—to support local authorities and civil society in reversing the closure trend and ensuring dignity for all.

2. Action on women's homelessness

The NFWI echoes the calls of homelessness charities and urges all levels of government to take action to reduce women's homelessness, reduce the number of women at risk of homelessness, and improve the quality of temporary accommodation. We call on WI members to support homelessness organisations in their communities and campaign to ensure that all women have a place they can safely call home.

3. Every child needs a friend

We call on all WI members, the care system, and government to raise awareness of the independent visitor system for children in care in order to increase the number of volunteer Independent Visitors and the children in the care system who are befriended by them. We want every child in care to be offered the opportunity to have an adult figure in their life who chooses to spend a few hours a month with them.

4. Love Your Vulva – Self checking is your best defence against vulval cancer Self-checking your vulva is important in ensuring the earlier detection of vulval cancer and to enhance survival chances. We call upon WI members to work together to raise awareness of the importance of self-checking and seeking medical advice as early as possible, and, to help highlight this rare cancer to GPs to promote prompt referrals to medical specialists when needed.

5. Nearer to Nature

There is a growing body of evidence that getting closer to nature is of great benefit to physical and mental health as well as to the environment. This is called 'green health'. We call on WI members to work locally to improve access to local green spaces and support others to access it too. We call on health promotion services to increase public awareness of the use and benefits of 'green health', d health and care commissioners to support 'green social prescribing' in every GP practice.

1-3 September 2026

Back by popular demand - the Federation would like to introduce you to another two-night break at Higham Hall, with three courses to choose from. We will have exclusive use of the college from Tuesday 1st to Thursday 3rd September and this will be a self-drive/car share break.

1. **ENAMELLING** – working on copper, silver or steel, to make enamelled jewellery, small tiles



or panel. Learn key skills such as enamel application; training in kiln use, control and safety; foils, stencils, sgraffito and other techniques. All abilities welcome from beginners to advanced; students will be supported to work at their own pace on appropriate projects.

All materials included, your tutor will be Sharon Ford.



2.A PANSY BOX – make a 3D pansy with wire using "Stumpwork", a technique raised elements of silk shading and blanket stitch will be used for each petal. Full kit provided, including ring box. **OR A BEADED CABOCHON** - learn how to bead a simple bezel to hold the stone (cabochon) in place, to make it into a brooch, use as a scarf holder or decorative box lid. Learn how



to bead a clean edge or picot fancy edge around the stone. (Please note there may be a small extra charge for this one, paid to the tutor Angie Burt);

3. **VISITING LAKELAND GARDENS** - discover some more hidden horticultural gems of Lake District gardens, joining expert horticulturalist Louise Stoddart, on an intimate tour of the gardens, including some not normally open to the public. The cost for the minibus is included.

The cost for this two-night break will be £375, which includes all meals and snacks each day. Please note there may be a supplementary cost to one of the courses. (It should be noted that the costs for the accommodation and tutors have increased since last year — this is unavoidable)
