20 points for 1st in classes 1 and 2

15 points for 2nd in classes 1 and 2

10 points for 3rd in classes 1 and 2

Please note: All items for judging in classes 1 and 2 must be removable.

If entering a cake to be judged state if this is as a cookery item

[entirely edible] or a craft item [decoration only to be judged]

Class 1 Open Co-operative; To the Theme

Presentation, Staging and any five single items from Craft, Cookery, Preserves, Honey, Confectionery and Fresh Flowers in any combination, to be judged. **No ART or DRINK.** To be staged in a space with external measurements no larger than 62cm x 107cm x 92cm by strictly no more than TWO members **at the hotel.** Accessories allowed. Rigid backgrounds and sides to be provided by the Exhibitor. Please list items to be judged on the entry card provided. The backdrop cannot be judged as a separate item.

Class 2 Hawkshaw Trophy – awarded to the WI with the best exhibit Three Craft Items to the theme

Presentation and three items to be judged. [No Art] Accessories allowed.

Items to be judged should be listed on the entry card provided.

To be presented on a board 40cm in diameter round or 40cm square.

Height not to exceed 60cm. No item for judging or accessory to overhang the board.

NFWI Directive: No fish, yoghurt, pate or fruit curd to be used in dishes for judging in the above classes. [See "On with the Show" 2015 amended edition

INDIVIDUAL SECTION

Entry Fee: 40p per entry

1 point will be awarded for every entry brought for judging

10 points for 1st

8 points for 2nd

6 points for 3rd

PRESERVES

All preserves must be correctly labelled, dated in full with day, month and year, and in plain jars with NEW PLAIN lids or wax disc with cellophane if appropriate.

No cloth covers allowed. Small PLAIN labels required. Entry cards to be attached with shirring elastic.

- Class 3 Jar of Marmalade, own choice – state thick or fine shred
- Class 4 Jar of Jam of your choice using Flowers as an Ingredient
- Class 5 Jar of Marrow and Ginger Jam
- Class 6 Jar of Apple and Blackberry Jelly
- Class 7 Jar of Vegetable Chutney – state mild or hot
- Class 8 Bottle of Fruit Liqueur – state flavour
- Class 9 Jar of Piccalilli
- Class 10 Bottle of Fruit or Flower Cordial

CONFECTIONERY

- Class 11 A Selection of Fondants dipped in Chocolate in a box no larger than 20cm x 15cm

COOKERY

Cake, unless specified, to be baked in a size and shape of own choice. All exhibits to be delivered ready displayed on a disposable plate of suitable size with entry card attached.

No Fresh Cream Filling or Cream Decoration

- Class 12 An Apple Pie, Pastry top and bottom, not to exceed 20cm
- Class 13 A Cake suitable for Vegans – include Recipe
- Class 14 A Cake using a Vegetable – Decoration allowed
- Class 15 3 Raspberry and Coconut Scones
- Class 16 A Round of Shortbread
- Class 17 A Harvest Loaf – any design
- Class 18 A Fruit Flan – fatless sponge base, fruit and arrowroot glaze
- Class 19 3 Chocolate Brownies
- Class 20 5 Flower-shaped Decorated Biscuits – own choice of Flavour
- Class 21 Coffee and Walnut Cake baked in a Loaf Tin
- Class 22 Men only – Gingerbread – see set Recipe

SUGARCRAFT AND DECORATED CAKES

All items to have an entry card attached using a thread no longer than 25cm.

Classes 23-27 will be judged on Tuesday 24th September 2019 at Garstang and may be staged by entrants only. Judged on decoration only.

All items to have been finished in the last year, be unworn and to be the bona fide work of the exhibitor. All items to have an entry card attached using a thread no longer than 25cm.

- Class 30 A 3D Garden Bird – any medium, ready to be hung
- Class 31 A Child's Knitted Garment using Blackberry Stitch

- Class 34 3 Bobbin Lace Flowers
- Class 35 A Cross Stitch Picture to the Theme – up to 40cm in either direction, including frame
- Class 36 A Handmade Autumnal Wreath
- Class 37 A Wind Chime using Recycled Materials – ready to be hung
- Class 38 A Rag Doll
- Class 39 A Patchwork or Applique Playmat – no more than 110cm square
- Class 40 An Item of Goldwork
- Class 41 A Beaded Bracelet – no less than 5cm wide
- Class 42 A Hand Decorated Faberge Style Blown Shell Egg
- Class 43 A Wall Hanging, to the theme, in Fabric or Yarn – ready to be hung, no more than 46cm x 46cm
- Class 44 A Decorated Candle
- Class 45 A String Art Picture
- Class 46 Garden Sculpture – free standing, any medium [men and members]

Items to be donated to Charity

One entry per member per class allowed

Cards may have a greeting on outside. NO ENVELOPE. To be judged on outside only.

Set Recipe Class 22 - Gingerbread

GINGERBREAD

Ingredients

100g butter

175g treacle

50g syrup

150ml milk

2 beaten eggs

225g plain flour

2 tsp ground ginger

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

50g soft brown sugar

Method

Melt butter, treacle and syrup. Gradually add milk. Cool before adding eggs.

Add to dry ingredients. Pour into prepared square 18cm tin and bake

at 150C for about 1¹/₄ hours.

- Classes 28-41, 43-60 and class 82, to be delivered to BW Garstang Country Hotel for judging on Sunday 22nd September 2019 between 12.00noon and 2.00pm. Entry cards must be attached to exhibits with a thread up to 25cm long unless otherwise stated. **All exhibits must be unpacked before being handed in for judging.**
- All other classes to be delivered to Garstang on Tuesday 24th September 2019 between 9-30am and 11-30am. Entry cards must be attached to exhibits with the appropriate fastening. **All exhibits must be unpacked before being handed in for judging.**
- **No exhibit may be removed before 6.30pm on Thursday 26th September 2019**
- The LFWI cannot be responsible for any items on display and would suggest that any valuable items be adequately insured by the exhibitor.
