CO-OPERATIVE SECTION

Entry Fee £5.00

20 points awarded for each co-operative entered

20 points for 1st in classes 1 and 2

15 points for 2nd in classes 1 and 2

10 points for 3rd in classes 1 and 2

Please note: All items for judging in Classes 1 and 2 must be removable.

If entering a cake to be judged, state if this is as a cookery item [entirely edible] or a craft item [decoration only to be judged]

Class 1 Open Co-operative: To the Theme

Presentation, Staging and any five single items from Confectionery, Cookery, Craft, Fresh Flowers, Honey and Preserves in any combination, to be judged. **No ART or DRINK.** To be staged in a space with external measurements no larger than 62cm deep x 107cm high x 92cm wide by strictly no more than TWO members **at the hotel.** Accessories allowed. Rigid backs and sides to be provided by the Exhibitor. Please list items to be judged on the entry card provided. The backdrop cannot be judged as a separate item.

Class 2 Hawkshaw Trophy –awarded to the WI with the best exhibit Three Items to the theme

Presentation and three different handmade items to the theme from Art, Craft, Confectionery, Cookery, Fresh Flowers, Honey, Papercraft to be judged. Accessories allowed. Please note – this is also a Co-operative Class.

Items to be judged should be listed on the entry card provided.

To be presented on a board no more than 40cm in diameter round or 40cm square. Height not to exceed 60cm. No item for judging or accessory to overhang the board. **NFWI Directive:** No fish, yoghurt, pate, or fruit curd to be used in dishes for judging in the above classes. [See 'On with the Show' 2015 amended edition]

INDIVIDUAL SECTION

Entry Fee: 40p per entry

1 point will be awarded for every entry brought for judging

10 points for 1st
8 points for 2nd
6 points for 3rd
4 points for Highly Commended

PRESERVES

All preserves must be correctly labelled, dated in full with day, month, and year, and in plain jars with NEW PLAIN lids or wax disc with cellophane if appropriate. Small PLAIN labels required. An Entry Card will be issued for Class 3. Entry Labels for Classes 4, 5 & 6 to be attached with shirring elastic.

- Class 3 Five Miniature jars of rainbow-coloured preserves (2oz/32g jars) Displayed on a board not exceeding 30cm x 30cm. (round or square) Accessories allowed.
- Class 4 A labelled Bottle of Homemade Liqueur
- Class 5 A labelled Bottle of Cordial
- Class 6 A labelled Bottle of Flavoured Vinegar

CONFECTIONERY

Class 7 A small punnet, no larger than 25cm x 20cm, of assorted Marzipan Harvest Produce. (readymade marzipan can be used)

COOKERY

All exhibits to be delivered ready displayed on a disposable plate of suitable size with entry label attached. No Fresh Cream Filling or Cream Decoration

Class 9	3 Baked Savouries using Cheese
Class 10	5 Fairy cakes to theme
Class 11	A Manchester Tart in a round foil dish
Class 12	5 Fondant Fancies
Class 13	A Soda Bread any flavour
Class 14	5 Varieties of Sweet Biscuits (3 of each) To be displayed in a box or tin with a lid.
Class 15	An Afternoon Tea for 2
	3 different items to be judged (no sandwiches). To be displayed on a 3-tier cake stand. An Entry Card will be issued for this.

Class 16 Men only – A Fruit Tea Loaf

SUGARCRAFT AND DECORATED CAKES

All items to have an entry label attached using a thread no longer than 25cm. Classes 17-19 will be judged on Tuesday 20th September 2022 at Garstang and may be staged by entrants only. They will be judged on decoration only.

- Class 18 A colourful 3D Children's Character
- Class 19 A Decorated cake to Celebrate The Queen's Platinum Jubilee (Dummy cake can be used)

CRAFT

All items to have been made in the last 3 years, be unworn except Class 29, and to be the bona fide work of the exhibitor. All items to have an entry label attached using a thread no longer than 25cm.

- Class 20 A Knitted or Crocheted Lady's Shawl for Evening Wear
- Class 21 A Pair of Handmade Slippers or Slipper Boots for Adults (fastened together)
- Class 22 A Dog or Sheep in any medium
- Class 23 An Amigurumi Animal
- Class 24 A Mini Wall Hanging to the theme, backed, not framed, ready to hang. 15cmx10cm
- Class 25 An Item of Stump Work
- Class 26 A Child's Knitted toy
- Class 27 A Cushion Cover, not exceeding 40cm x 40cm, incorporating a Piece of Free Motion Embroidery or Automated Machine Embroidery or Hand Embroidery not exceeding 15cm x 15 cm
- Class 28 A Sewn Child's Garment to the theme
- Class 29 An Upcycled Waistcoat made from 2 to 3 garments (Include a photograph of the original garments)
- Class 30 A Colourful item of Macrame
- Class 31 A Torchon Lace edged Handkerchief
- Class 32 A Rag Rug to the theme
- Class 33 A Decorated Terracotta Plant Pot
- Class 34 An Explosion Box
- Class 35 A Patchwork bed runner
- Class 36 A Felted Picture, ready to hang
- Class 37 A Beadwork Necklace, own design
- Class 38 An Item of Marquetry (Men and Members)

Items to be donated to Charity One entry per member allowed

Class 39 A yarn or fabric rainbow Teddy, any size Extra items accepted for donation to a charity.

PAPERCRAFT

Cards may have a greeting on outside. NO ENVELOPE. To be judged on outside only. Entry labels to be attached with shirring elastic down spine of card.

- Class 40 A Greeting Card using Rubber Stamping to the theme
- Class 41 A Waterfall Card
- Class 42 A Greeting Card using Silk Ribbon Embroidery
- Class 43 A Junk Journal

CREATIVE WRITING

Class 44 A Short Story to the theme, not exceeding 500 words Typed or Handwritten

ART

Classes 46 and 47, must not exceed 46cm x 46cm, including frame. ALL CLASSES MUST BE FRAMED and STRUNG READY TO BE HUNG. [No clip frames] All Classes to have been completed in the last 2 years

- Class 45 A Computer-Generated piece of Artwork to the theme, A4 size
- Class 46 A Landmark in Mixed Media
- Class 47 A Line and Wash
- Class 48 A Piece of Illuminated Calligraphy, no larger than A5 including a frame.

PHOTOGRAPHY

All photographs must have been taken during the last year, be no larger than 17.5cmx12.5cm, must not be digitally altered or mounted. For identification adhere sticky label PROVIDED to back of photograph.

Class 49 To Theme. For this Class hold a Competition in your WI to choose **up to 3 photos only**.

All exhibits to be brought to the Show ready assembled

All produce in this section <u>MUST</u> be home grown by entrant

Notes and Rules

- Entrance Fees: Classes 1 and 2: £5, all other classes: 40p
- A maximum of one entry per member per class is allowed. All entries to have been made within the previous 24 months and be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- Classes 20-49, 68, 71 and Betty Sanderson Witches to be delivered to BW Garstang Country Hotel for judging on Sunday 18th September 2022 between 11.00am and 2.00pm. Entry labels must be attached to exhibits with a thread up to 25cm long unless otherwise stated. All exhibits must be unpacked before being handed in for judging. Packaging should then be removed.
- All other classes to be delivered to Garstang on Tuesday 20th September 2022 between 9.30am and 11.30am. Entry labels must be attached to exhibits with the appropriate fastening unless stated otherwise. All exhibits must be unpacked before being handed in for judging.
- No exhibit may be removed before <u>6.30pm</u> on Thursday 22nd
 September 2022 after the Prize Presentation.
- The LFWI cannot be responsible for any items on display and would suggest that any valuable items be adequately insured by the exhibitor.
