Requirement List

- A sewing machine that is capable of free machine stitching (i.e. you can either drop the feed dogs or cover them with a plate supplied with the machine) complete with foot plate & leads.
- You will also need a darning or free embroidery foot, spare needles & bobbins.
- Extension lead and your machine manual.
- A selection of good quality sewing threads suitable for your machine (this can include metallic threads)
- General sewing kit e.g. small scissors, larger cutting scissors for cutting fabric, hand sewing needles, dressmaker pins etc.
- Any small pieces of plain fabric that you have around- cottons, linens, polycotton etc.- these are to make samples & no bigger than A4 size. This should be ironed beforehand.
- Embroidery hoop 6" to 8" wide. The hoop should be able to fit under the raised foot on your machine- so it should be fairly thin and wooden hoops are better than the plastic sprung ones as you will get a better tension.
- Any fancy fabrics you have e.g. sheers, lightweight stretch fabric which can include clean old tights or pop socks, scraps of fabric, scrim etc.
- Pencil & paper.

NB. The tutor will bring a supply of fancy & plain fabrics, several hoops & frames & threads etc.

There will be a small cost for these payable to the tutor on the day.

Tea, coffee and biscuits will be provided throughout the day, but members will need to bring a packed lunch.
