The course is being run by Glyn Davies a renowned member of the Chorley Photographic Society who has judged at many shows

GIMP is an image manipulation programme. It is a powerful tool for photographers and graphic artists. It has many of the features of Photoshop, but is completely free of charge and will always remain so. The course is a one day introduction to the GNU Image Manipulation Program. It is called "**Beginning GIMP for photographers**" It covers the basic use of GIMP for improving photographs that you have taken. It will cover:

- File management: importing; saving; exporting photographs.
- The Desktop; the image window; menus; the tool box; tool options
- Enhancing Photographs: correcting exposure; improving colour.
- Improving Composition: cropping an image; straightening an image.
- Layers: removing unwanted objects; replacing dull skies.
- Printing your Photos.

This course requires attendees to bring a laptop with a pre-installed copy of GIMP 2.10.18 (the latest version).

GIMP may be downloaded free of charge from <https://www.gimp.org/downloads/> .

Sample photographs for attendees to practise editing will be provided on a USB stick at the start of the course.

A detailed course booklet will be available at a cost of £3.00 for each attendee.
