

How to submit a resolution on an issue that matters to you

The 2024/25 resolutions process is here!

Submissions are now open for WIs and federations to put forward proposed resolutions for the 2024/25 process. This is your chance to highlight an issue you are concerned about, and to put forward your ideas about what you would like to see the WI campaign on from next year.

Included in this mailing you will find:

- Guidance on how to develop your resolution with your WI and federation, and submit it to the NFWI.
- The full timetable for the 2024/25 resolutions process setting out key deadlines
- The resolution submission form. As far as possible, we would encourage you to submit resolutions using the online form <u>on MyWI</u> or by emailing the enclosed form (completed electronically or scanned) to <u>pa@nfwi.org.uk</u>, as opposed to sending them in the post.

<u>Key deadlines</u>

Submitting your resolution

All resolutions must be checked by your federation before they are submitted to the NFWI, and all resolutions must reach your federation for sign-off by **1 September 2024**. We encourage you to share your proposed resolution with your federation before this date, and where possible, liaise with your federation in developing your resolution.

The closing date for checked resolutions to be submitted to NFWI is **8 September 2024**.

Join as a member delegate to the Resolution Shortlist Selection Meeting in October

In October each year, federation and member delegates meet to consider and debate each resolution submitted by WIs, creating a shortlist. We want to give as many members as possible the opportunity to take part in the discussion to help shape the shortlist.

All WI members are welcome to apply for a delegate place in this years' shortlisting meeting. The delegates will be selected at random once the application deadline has passed. To find out more and to apply, <u>visit MyWI</u>. Applications are open until **31 July**.

Please note: If you are attending as a federation delegate you will receive a separate invitation and should not apply to be member delegate.
