doing life together.



a letter from our Executive Driector Monica Hynn

In recent weeks, I came across an article that discussed a concerning trend in our society: the significant decline of what sociologists refer to as the "Third Place." The Third Place represents any social setting apart from home (the first place) and work (the second place). Consider iconic TV shows of the '90s like "Friends," "Seinfeld," and "Cheers," where the characters spent the majority of their time socializing at the café, diner, or bar, with work often taking the backseats in their lives. However, in today's world, we find ourselves working longer hours to cope with rising costs in almost every aspect of life, leaving us with less time to connect with one another.

The article highlighted a startling fact: for decades, Americans spent an average of around six and one half hours per week with friends and family. Yet, between 2014 and 2019, this figure suddenly dropped to four hours per week, marking a 37 percent decrease. It's worth noting that 2014 was the year when smartphone ownership in the United States exceeded 50 percent. Today, we are increasingly tethered to our screens, spending much more time online and alone. Platforms like Instagram, TikTok, Twitch, and podcasts have become the new, placeless, Third Places.

As beings inherently designed for community, this decline in our time spent together has dire consequences for our well-being, impacting our health, relationships, and contributing to what the U.S. Surgeon General has labeled an "epidemic of loneliness." Shockingly, one in five Americans reports feeling lonely or socially isolated frequently or all the time, and a staggering 22 percent of millennials admit to having no friends at all.

The women we have the privilege of supporting through Mommies Matter are disproportionately affected by this **epidemic of loneliness**. For them, unplanned or unwanted pregnancies can intensify feelings of isolation and despair. Already facing challenges alone, the added responsibility of caring for a child can feel insurmountable. Without a welcoming **"Third Place"** – a community that embraces them without judgment, where they can find solace among others in similar situations – lives may spiral into anxiety, depression, resort to abortion, or even suicide.

This brings to mind the Latin expression "per curcem ad lucem," which translates to "through the cross to the light." Our faith teaches us that God loves us passionately and seeks to bring us fulfillment and joy. However, this does not exempt us from experiencing crosses on this side of heaven. It is through these personal crosses—be it job loss, health challenges, depression, rejection, or the loss of a loved one—that we come to know and trust God more deeply.

Over the past five years since Mommies Matter's inception, I have had a front-row seat to witness unimaginable crosses that our Mommies face daily. These stories include the sudden loss of a 21-year-old son to a tragic and untimely death, a heartbreaking incident where a three-month-old baby boy stopped breathing and hours later died, and a devastating car accident that left one mother with a broken back and bedridden with four children to care for. We also see the fall-out and often unrecoverable effects of domestic abuse, stalking, sex trafficking, and unimaginable suffering.

Mommies Matter offers authentic hospitality—a free space, that **Third Place**—where they can enter as strangers and quickly become not just friends but family. It is here that they can come to know the Lord, His love for them, and gain a better understanding of how to **suffer well**. Mommies Matter's hospitality is **not a means to change people; rather, it is a space where change can take place**. It is a place where they find refreshment and renewal through the outpouring of love and support from our Mommies Matter community. As the saying goes, "Shared burdens are lighter," and when our Mommies "let go and let God" by allowing the Mommies Matter community to rally around them, the weight of their burdens as single mothers is significantly lightened, enabling them to flourish as the mothers God intended them to be.

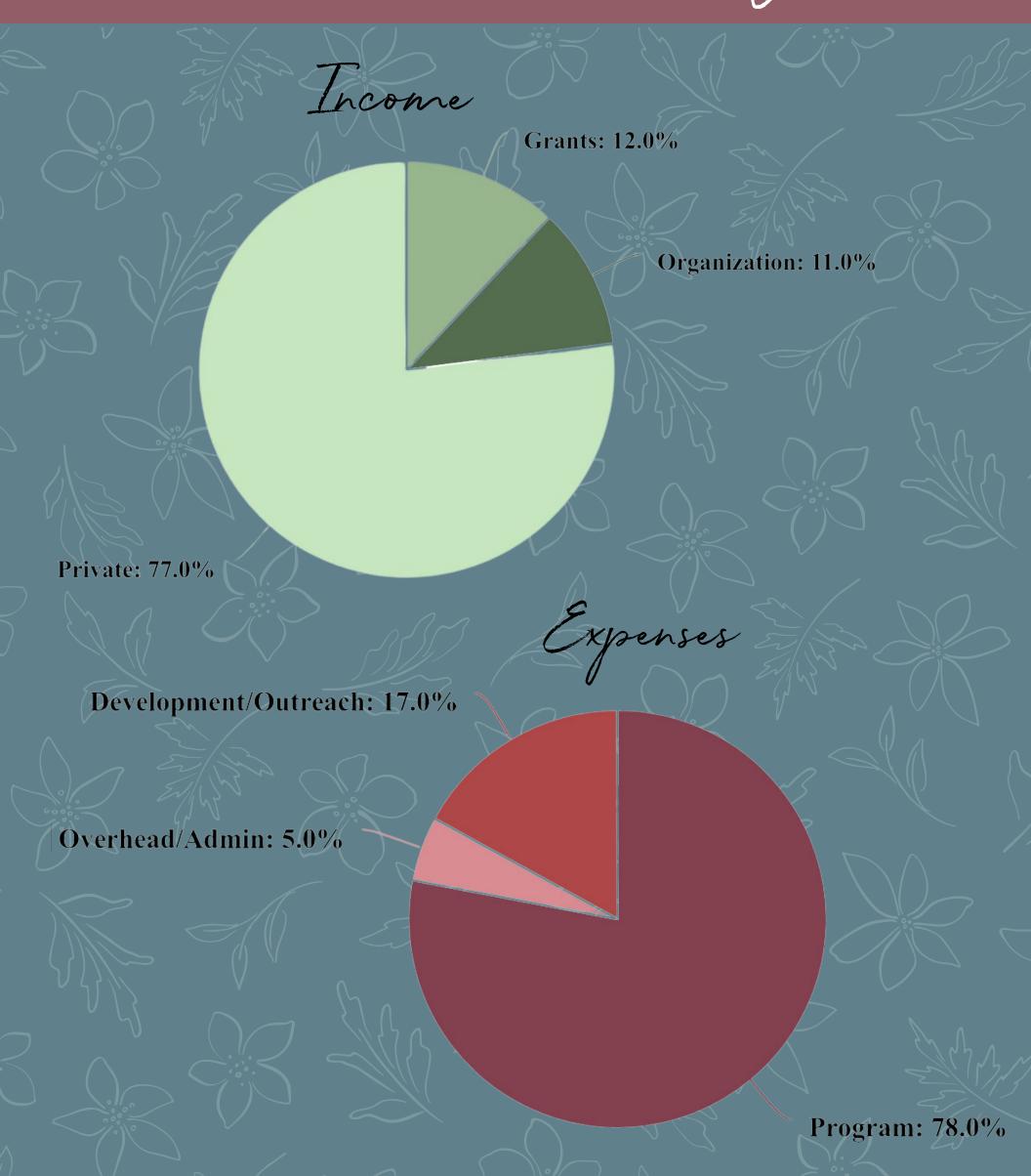

My name is Cindy and I am a mother to two beautiful girls. They are two years old and five months old. This past summer I was living with my aunt. She treated me very unkindly and it was an unhealthy living situation for myself and my daughter. While I was living there I was six months pregnant with my daughter. I was in an abusive relationship with the father of the baby and one day when he tried to harm me and my daughter I knew that I had to leave.

Before coming to Mommies Matter I was really struggling. I felt like I was stuck in a huge nest and couldn't get out. I had no where to go and no support. I felt horrible and was crying all the time. I learned about Mommies Matter in June from Ms. Elena at Columbus Public Health. I joined the program and since then I have found true happiness and feel extremely blessed. A volunteer hosted a baby shower for me and Kendra was by my side during the birth of my daughter. Kendra even had me over for Thanksgiving to be with her family. The Mommies Matter family has supported me in ways I could never have imagined.

The Enrichment nights are the best. I remember the first one I came to, it made me so happy. I learned so much. The speaker talked about boundaries. I learned things that night. I can choose who I want to be around me and my children. I'm more careful and focused. I'm being that protective mom. I'm always learning something new every time I go to Enrichment. I am growing and it's helping me and they are fun! I get to see other moms and talk to them. It really helps to know there are people who care about me and there are other moms going through the same thing.

I am very happy and one day hope to give my story to other moms to help them. I want to show everyone going through a lot that it's not going to be easy and you might feel alone, but there are people who care. I was not going to church, but now I want to. Mommies Matter talks about Jesus and God, and I love that and want church to be a part of my family's life.
