# 5 Report from the Treasurer:

When the current committee was formed there was a carry forward of £113.75, the balance from the previous committee and entry fees from the period between committees. In addition, Steve Pockneall donated £100, one half towards funds and the other towards the charity day, and Lawrie Ball donated £100 towards Leigh's memorial day. Both are thanked for their generosity.

A total of £2000 was raised for Guide Dogs for the Blind. £1785.13 was paid out of the account the balance of £214.87 having been taken by the ladies representing the charity on the day.

The money in the account has grown to £1159.47 and the aim is to maintain a minimum balance of £750 to cover any contingencies that might arise. The committee originally expected that it would need to increase the entry fee next year but that is no longer considered necessary and entry fees will remain at £3 and £1.50. The twos kitties will continue but will be seasonal and any funds remaining at the end of each season will be absorbed into the funds and put towards something of benefit to everyone. Money currently in the kitties will be put towards the Christmas lunch.

### 6 Report from the Match Secretary:

- Woods matches seven teams are involved and ladies with handicaps between 20.5 and 35 are eligible. Ferndown Forest drew one match but unfortunately lost the others. However, it was good to see new ladies becoming involved.
- The Wellow Rally was brilliant. Each team consisted of seven ladies and the best five scores counted. Ferndown Forest ladies did really well and finished sixth out of seventeen teams.
- The home leg of the Interclub Ping Competition was won by Pam & Louise Searle finishing one point short of the score needed to progress to the qualifiers.
- The Legg Bowl was played recently against Parkstone who won the match.

## 7 Report from the Friendlies' Secretary:

Overall the results were not as good as hoped with two wins, one draw and five losses. One match was rained off and another cancelled because the opponents were unable to field a team. However, friendly matches are primarily about getting into matchplay in a relaxed, informal way and all the matches were played in a friendly atmosphere and enjoyed by all.
