Winter Storm 2021 has affected our entire Conference, creating unprecedented



hardship for millions. There is no region in our Conference that has been spared. As a result, the Response will need to be coordinated locally within each community. While there are resources, it will fall on churches to work together to mitigate the damage cause by this hard freeze. At a minimum, I encourage each pastor to appoint a Disaster Response Coordinator and Assistant to manage her/his congregation's response. They should start by seeking direction and collaboration from the County Office of Emergency Management and

the Long-Term Recovery Organization.

We anticipate there will be many people in vulnerable communities who do not have homeowner's insurance or the means to hire professionals to do the needed repairs. We encourage volunteers to go into their vulnerable communities to help homeowners sign up for Clean Up assistance by registering on the Crisis Cleanup Hotline --- 844-965-1386. It is a statewide database from which any Recovery Organization, including us, can pull names and addresses within specific zip codes in order to assist them.

Microloans

The one-time \$1 million TMF Microloan Program was created in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and has been expanded to include capital needs arising from damages from the February 2021 ice storm. This program is designed to efficiently serve the growing needs within United Methodist churches and nonprofit organizations by quickly providing access to funding for the unique and changing circumstances ministry leaders are facing at this time.

Guidelines for February Ice Storm Needs

The TMF Microloan Program will make small (\$2,500 - \$25,000), short-term (24-month) microloans at a rate of 2% interest for repairs and other capital needs arising from the February ice storm. Repayment of these loans is deferred for 6 months based on date of approval. Churches and nonprofits must meet these guidelines to apply:

- (1) Open to qualified 501(c)(3) United Methodist churches and United Methodist-related nonprofit organizations in TX and NM (individuals, private foundations, etc. are ineligible). Priority will be given to organizations with budgets of \$500,000 or less.
- (2) Balanced budget for one of the last two years (2019 and/or 2020).

*February Ice Storm applications will open by Tuesday, February 23, 2021.

The Pastor's Moving.... Now What?

A change of pastors is part of the rhythm of life for every United Methodist Church. It happens at some point for every church. Once a change has been announced, the goal of every pastor and church is to make that transition well. Saying goodbye and hello well takes planning and careful

thought. That is particularly true in a season when we cannot do so much of what we normally do because of restrictions due to the pandemic.

Toward that end, the Office of Clergy Excellence is offering three identical zoom events called "The Pastor's Moving...Now What?". The three main topics that will be covered in the events are: Saying Goodbye and Hello Well; the 90 Day Action Plan (this covers what the pastor will do in the first 90 days of his or her new



appointment); and the Logistics of a Move (move policy and benefits updates). Each event will last no more than 90 minutes and will include time for Q&A.

Presenters for these events include: Rev. Morris Matthis, Director of Clergy Excellence; Rev. Deborah Hawboldt, Associate Director of Clergy Excellence; Rev. Brenda Porter, Move Coordinator; and Barbara Kilby, TAC Group Health and Pension Benefits Manager.

Those who should attend are: all pastors going to new appointments; SPR members and other appropriate leaders from churches with outgoing and/or incoming pastors as well as staff or volunteers who manage the finances of the church.

All three of these events are identical. Pastors and leaders are encouraged to attend the first event after the appointment is announced. The sooner you attend, the more this information can help you.
